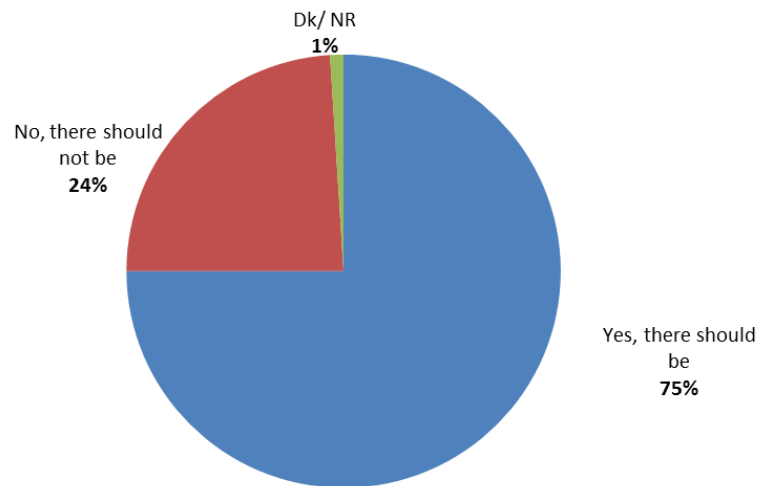

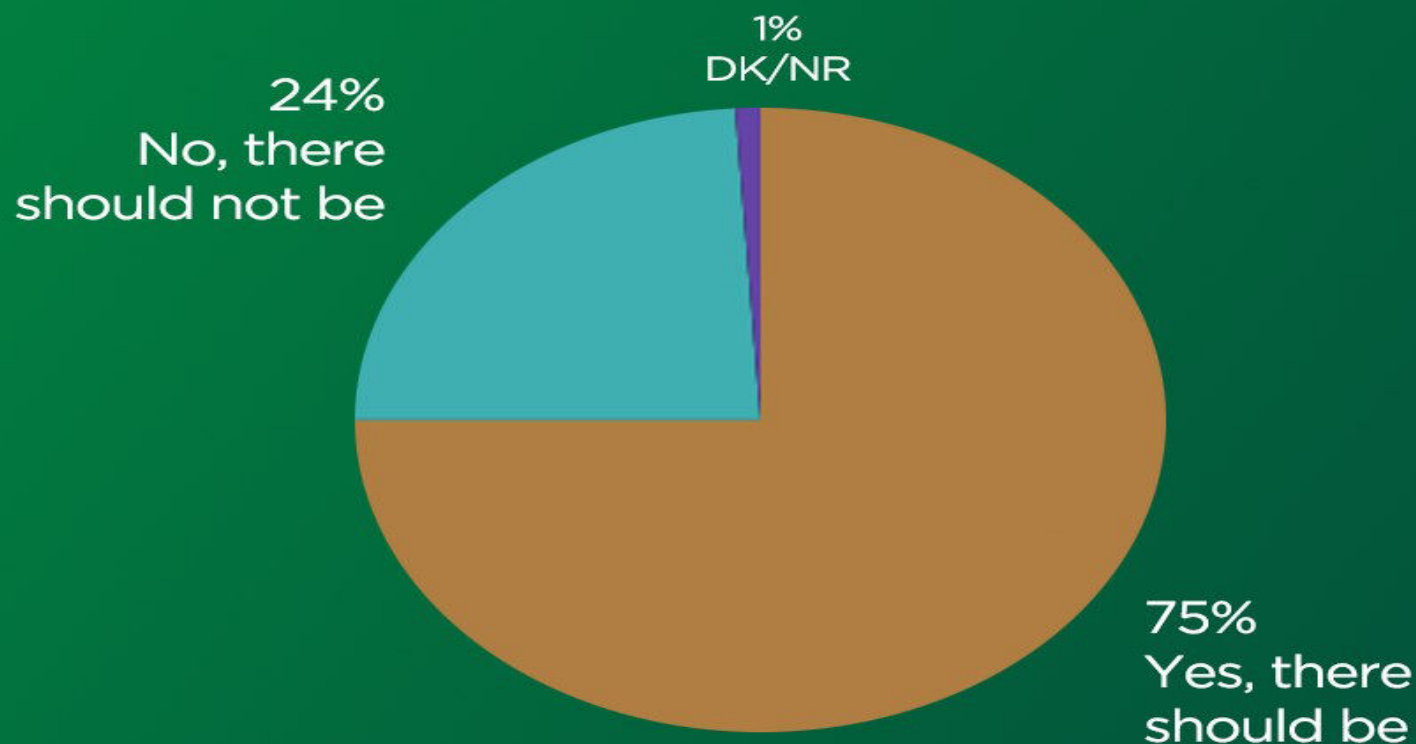
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 75% Pakistanis believe that the government should create a park where people can conduct their protests.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people are of the opinion that the government should create a park where the people can carry out their protests. Do you think there should be such a place or not?” In response to this question 75% said that there should be a park while 24% said that there should not be a park. 1% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 5 – April 6, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

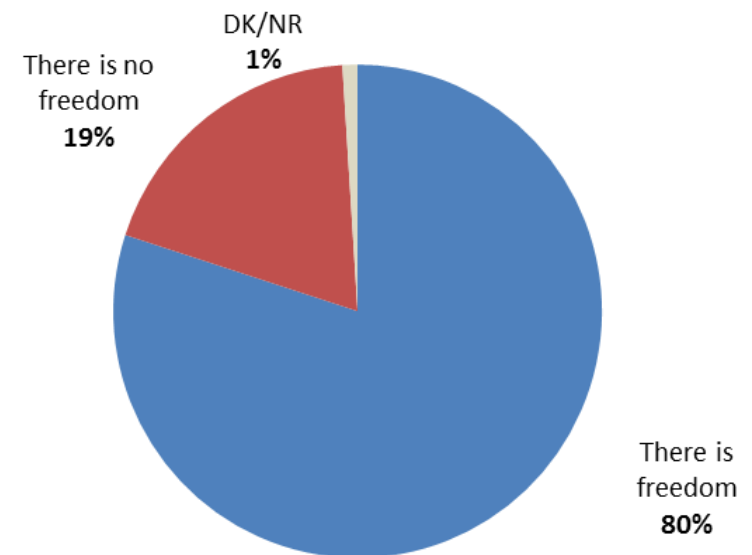

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 80% Pakistanis believe that minority communities in Pakistan have the freedom to pursue their religion, hold independent opinions and enjoy equal rights.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell, do you think the minority communities in Pakistan are allowed to hold independent opinions, equal rights and the freedom to pursue religious rituals?” In response to this question 80% said that there is freedom while 19% said that there is no freedom. 1% did not respond.

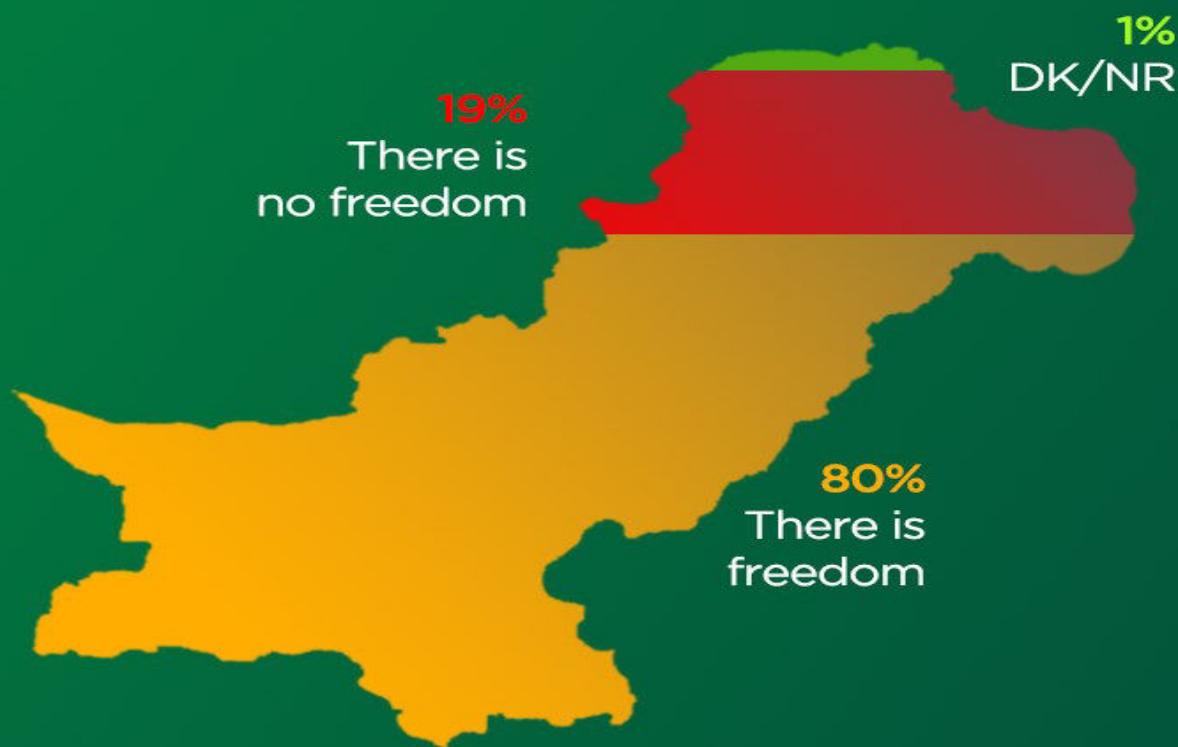
The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1884 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 07, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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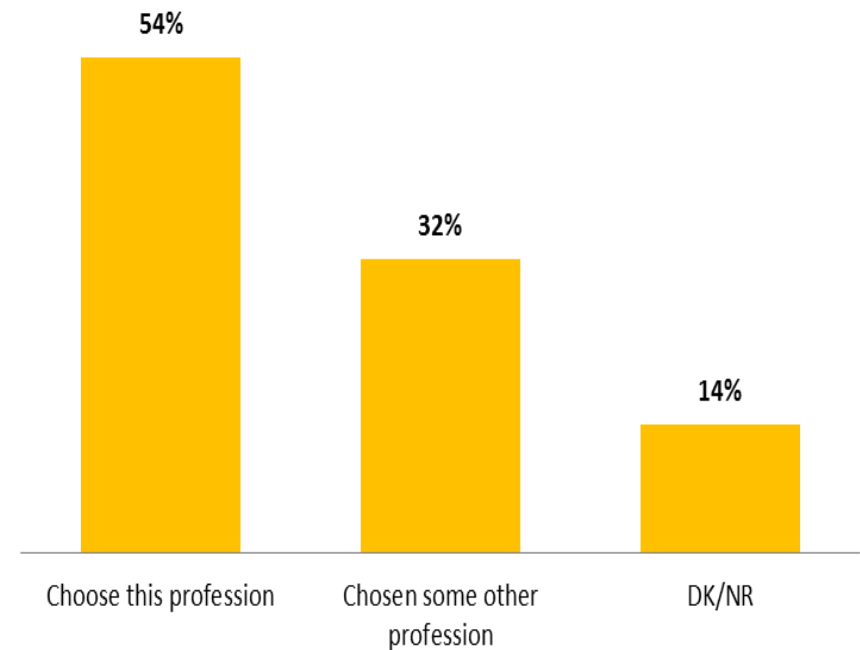

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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 54% Pakistanis, when asked which profession they would choose if they had the authority to choose any profession that they wanted, stated that they would still choose their existing profession.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Suppose that you had the authority to choose any profession that that you wanted; would you still choose this profession or would you have chosen some other profession?” In response to this question, 54% said they would still choose their existing profession, 32% said they have chosen another profession while 14% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 5 – April 6, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

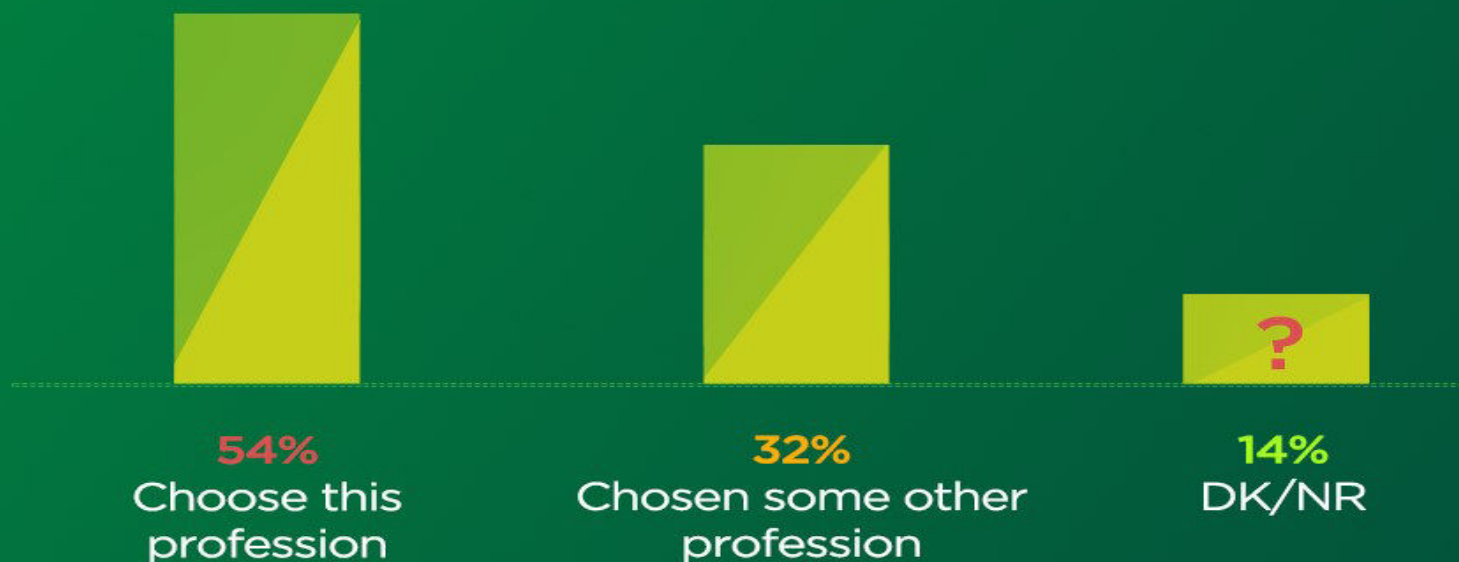

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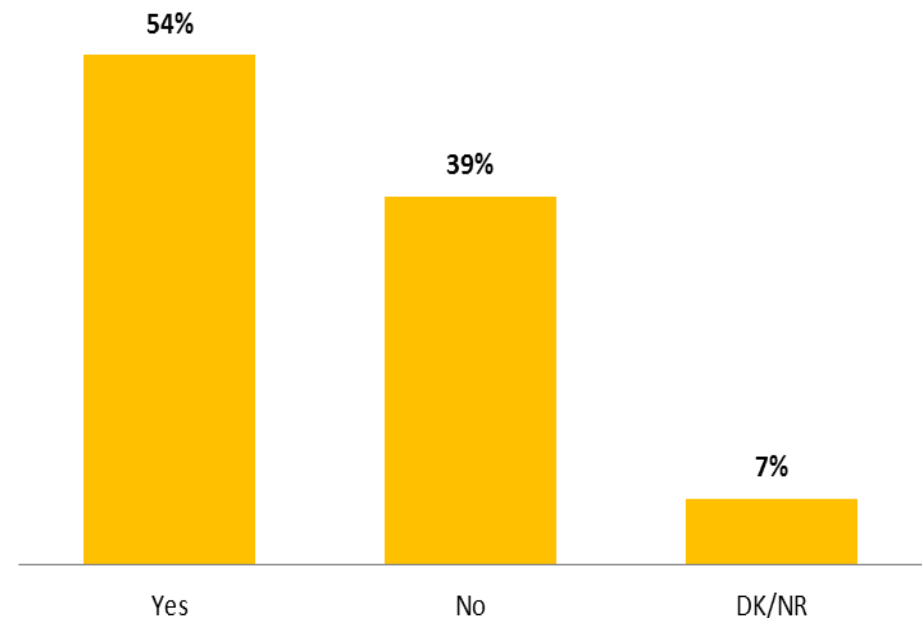

A nationally representative sample of women from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you use make up and beauty products including creams that make the skin fairer (skincare creams)?” In response to this question, 54% women said yes, 39% said no while 7% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 5 – April 6, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.\

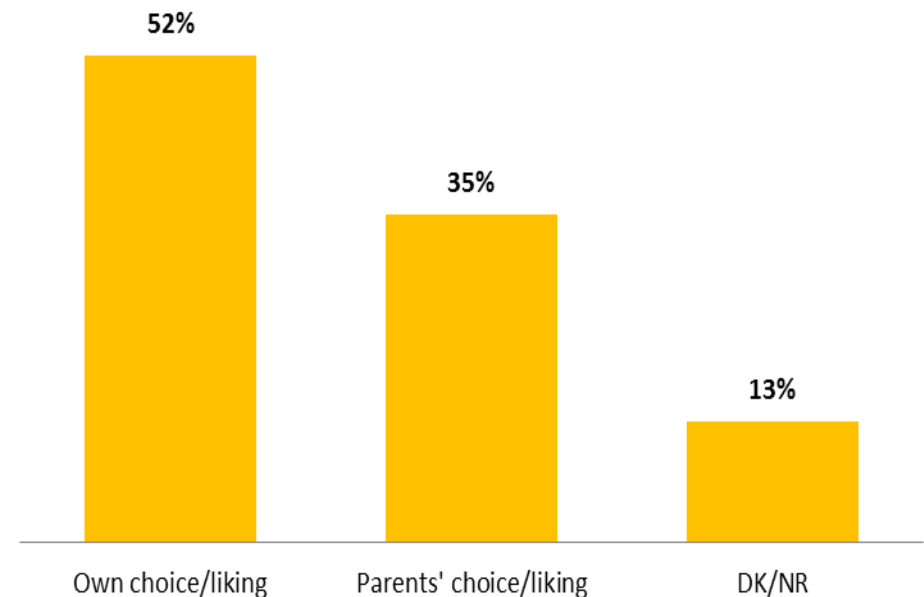

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 52% Pakistanis, when asked about the profession that they have adopted or hope to adopt, stated that they have chosen their profession based on their own choice and liking.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “The profession that you have adopted right now (or hope to adopt in the future), have you adopted it of your own choice and liking or that of your parents?” In response to this question, 52% said the profession they have adopted is of their own choice and liking and 35% said that they have adopted a profession of their parents’ liking while 13% did not respond.

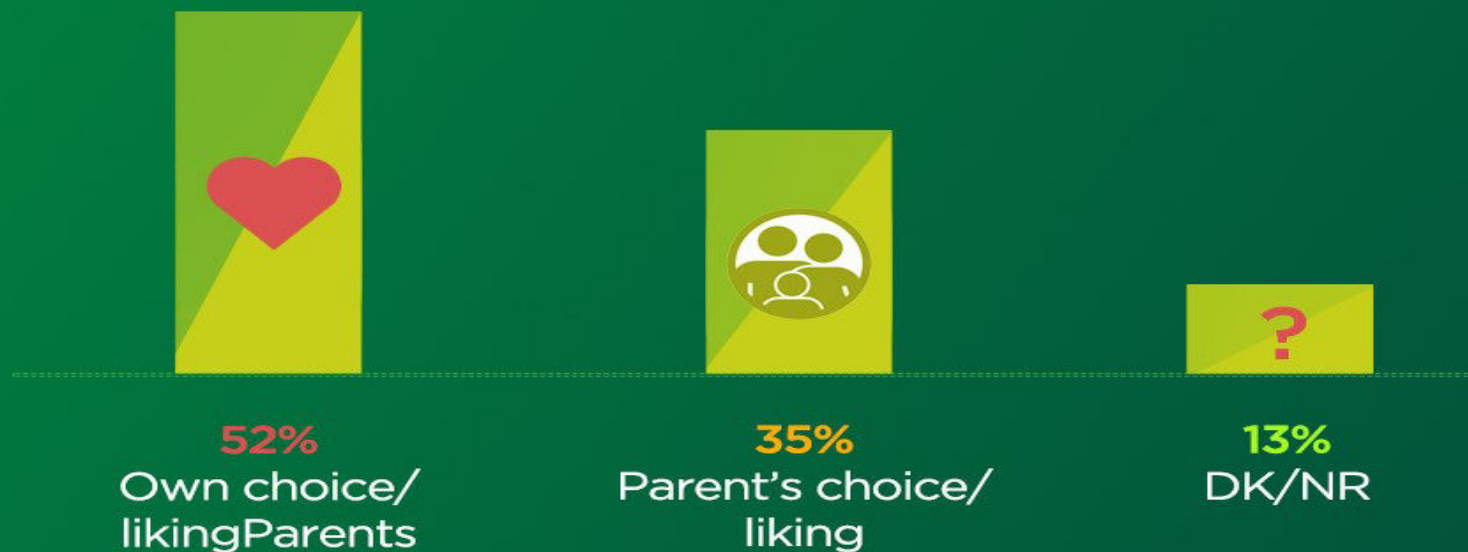
