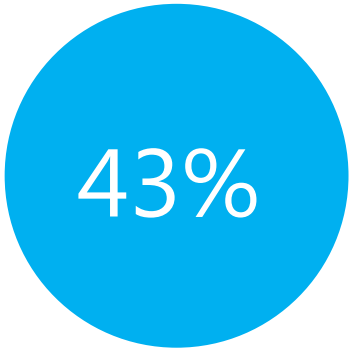

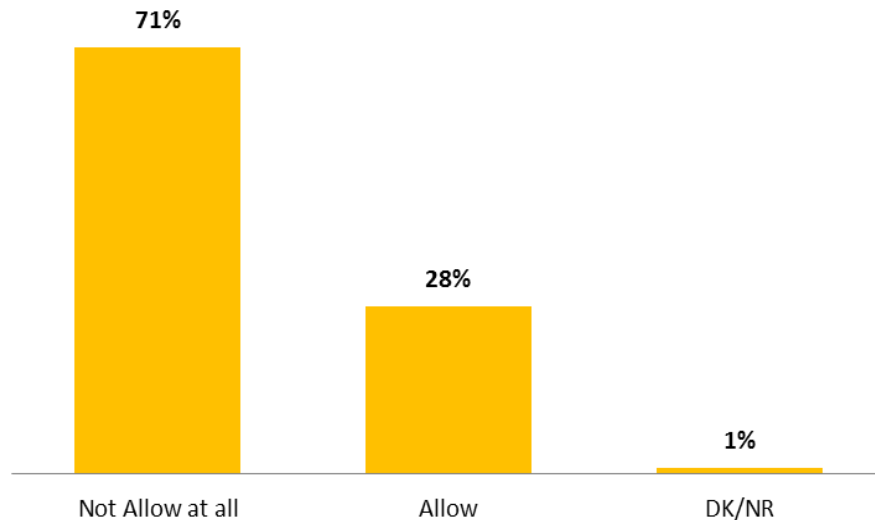

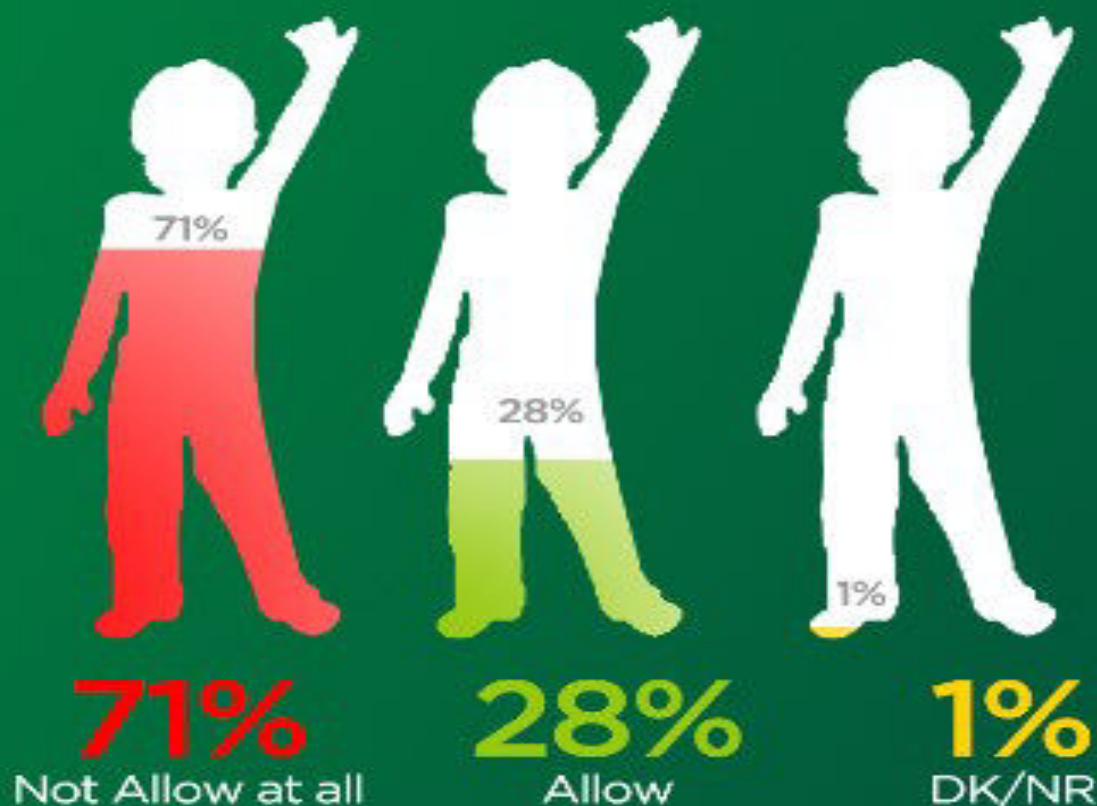

Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

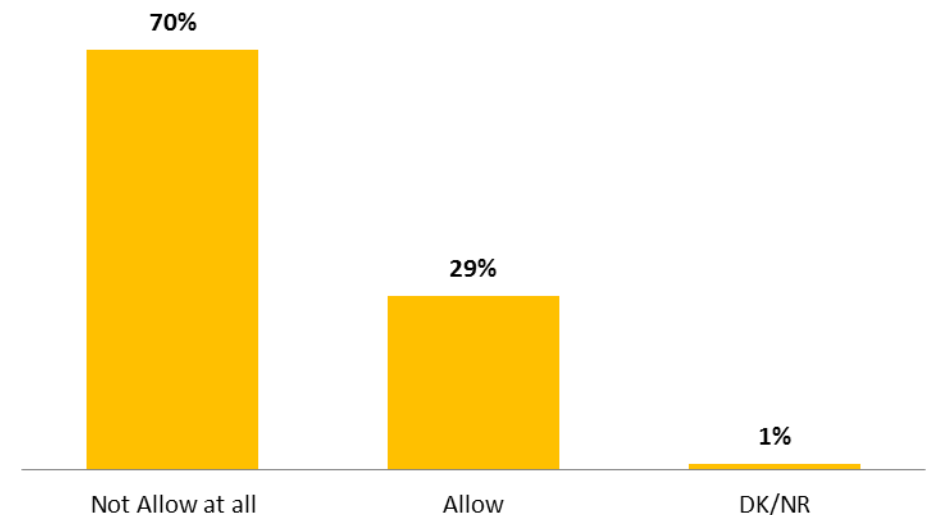

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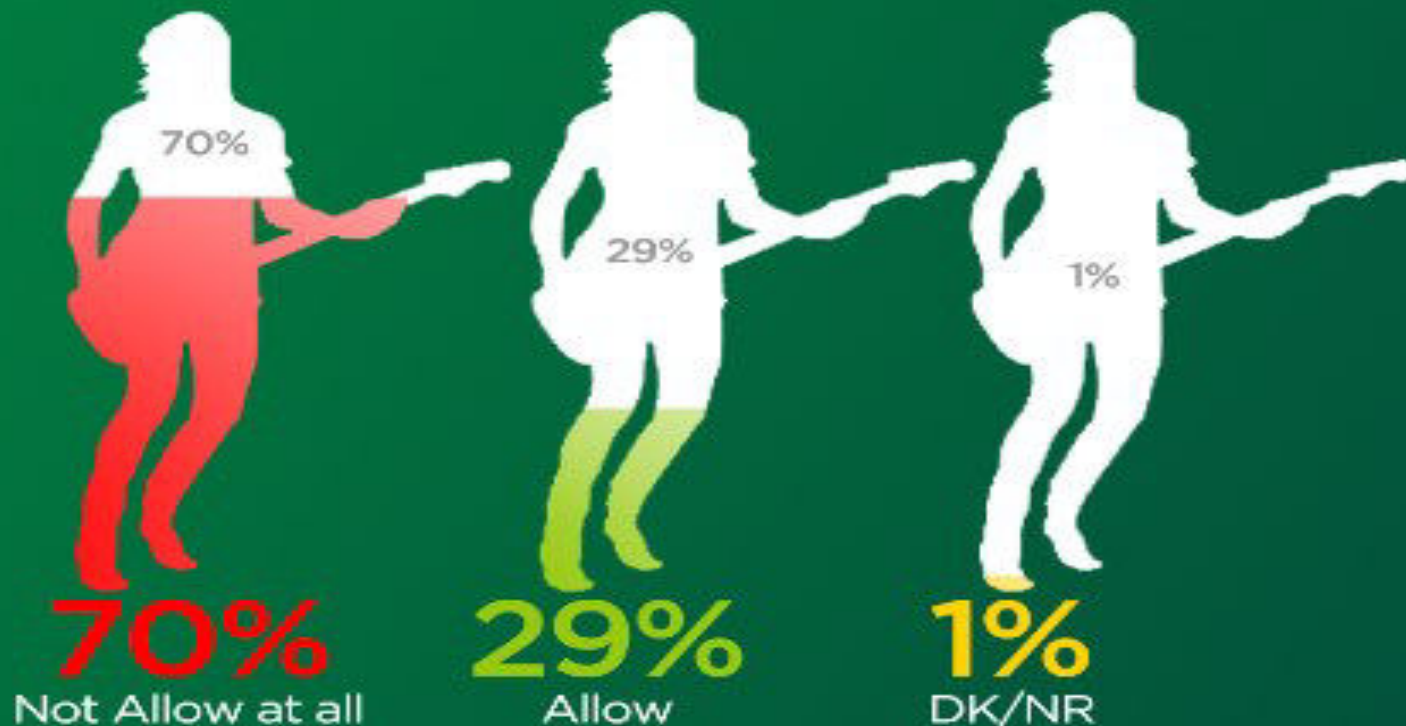

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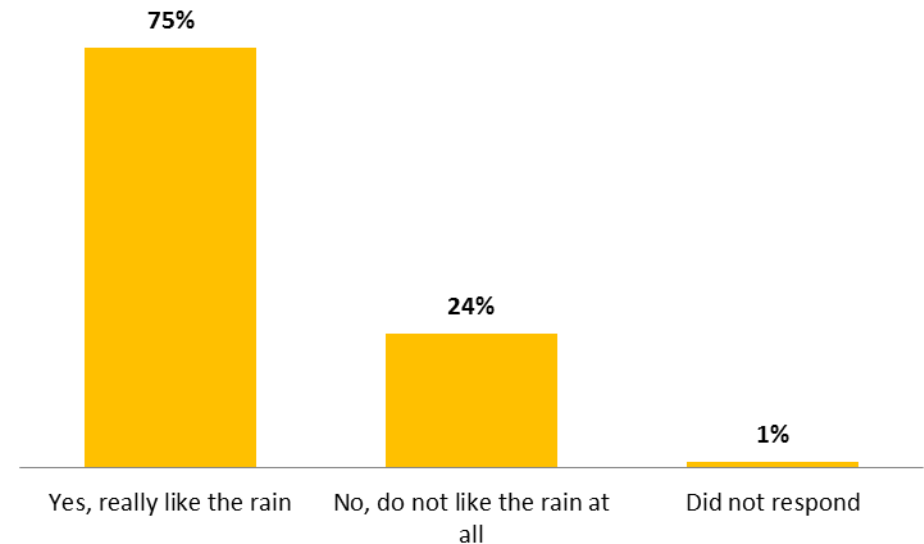

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 11 – April 18, 2016. 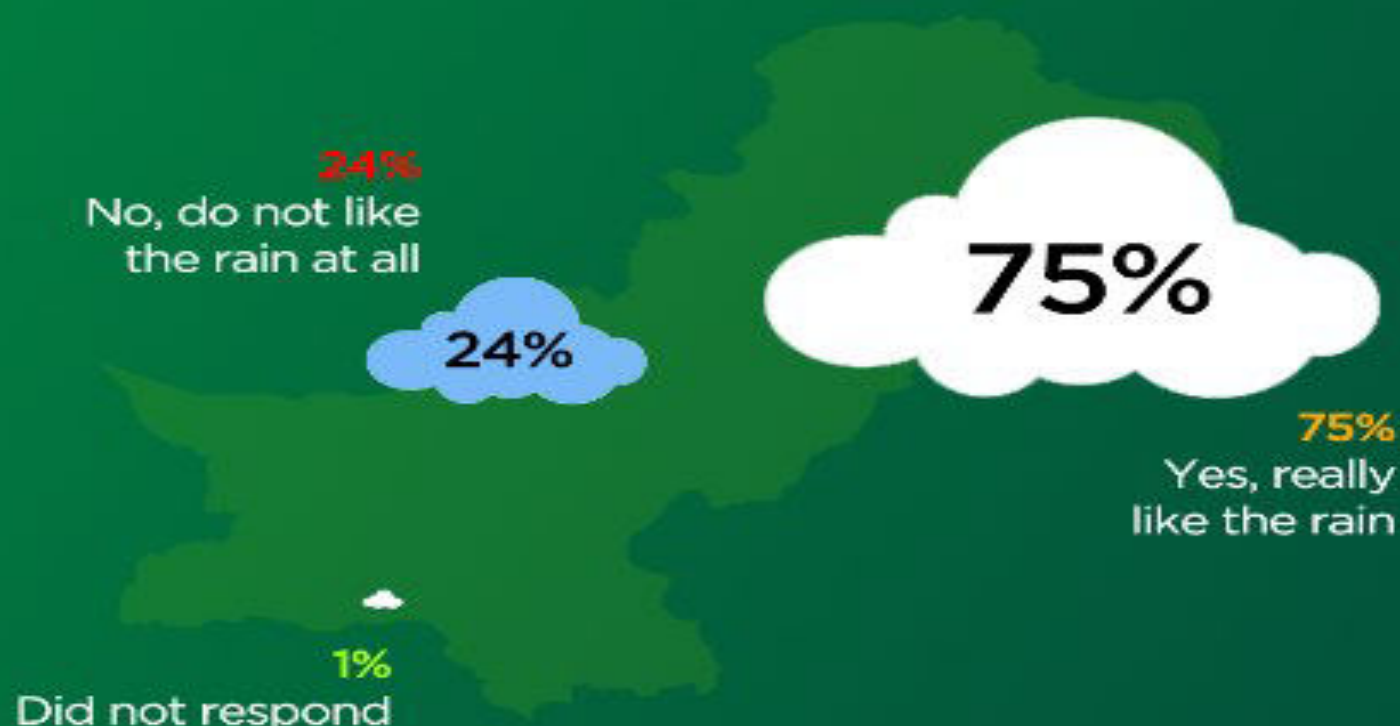

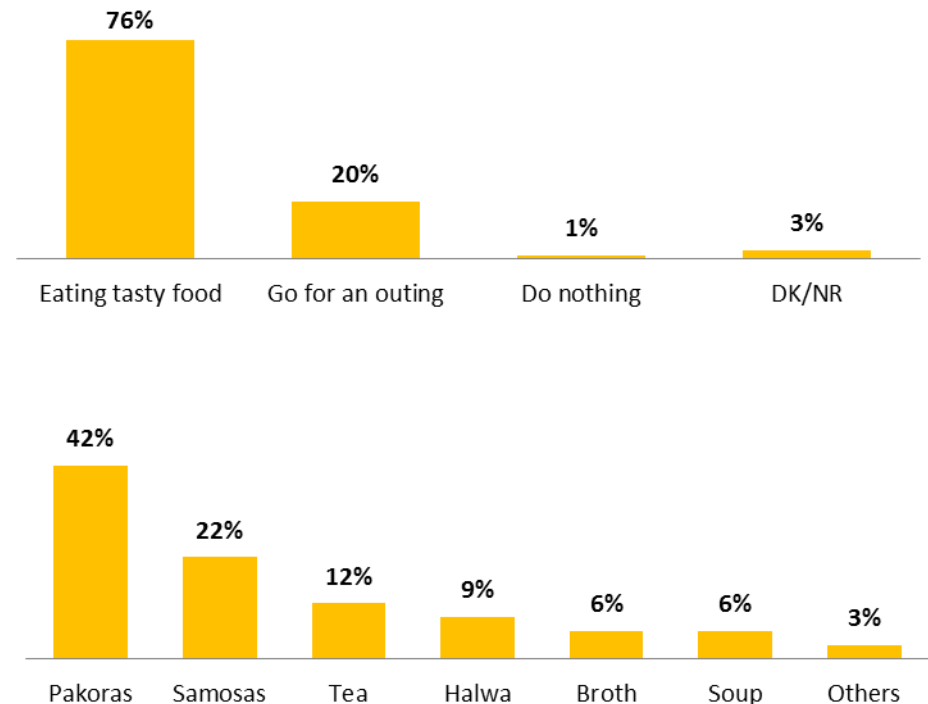


According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 76% Pakistanis said that they enjoy the rainy weather with some tasty food.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In many households rainy weather is enjoyed a lot, meaning that people like eating tasty food dishes in the rainy weather while others go for an outing in that weather. Kindly tell how you enjoy the rainy weather?” In response to this question, 76% said that they enjoy the rainy weather with some tasty food dishes, 20% said that they go for an outing, 1% said that they do nothing while 3% did not respond.

Respondents who stated that they enjoy the weather with tasty food were further asked, “Kindly tell what you normally eat/drink in the rainy weather?” In response to this question, 42% respondents said that they eat Pakoras, 22% said Samosas, 12% said tea, 9% said Halwa, 6% said Broth and another 6% said Soup while 3% mentioned other food items.

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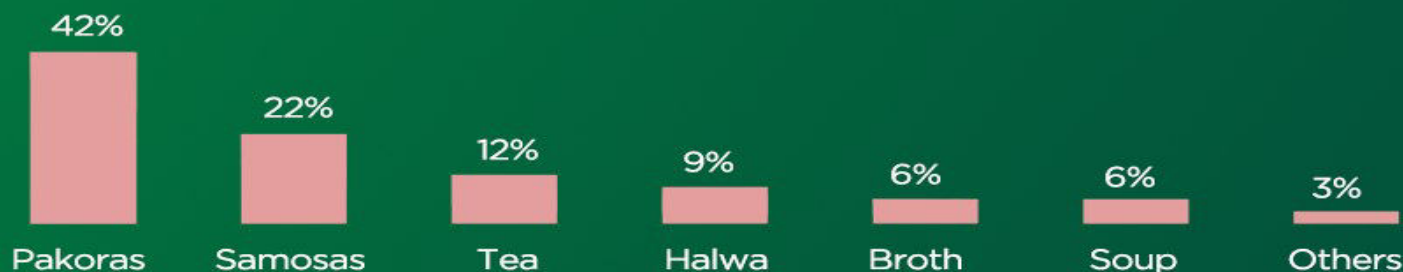

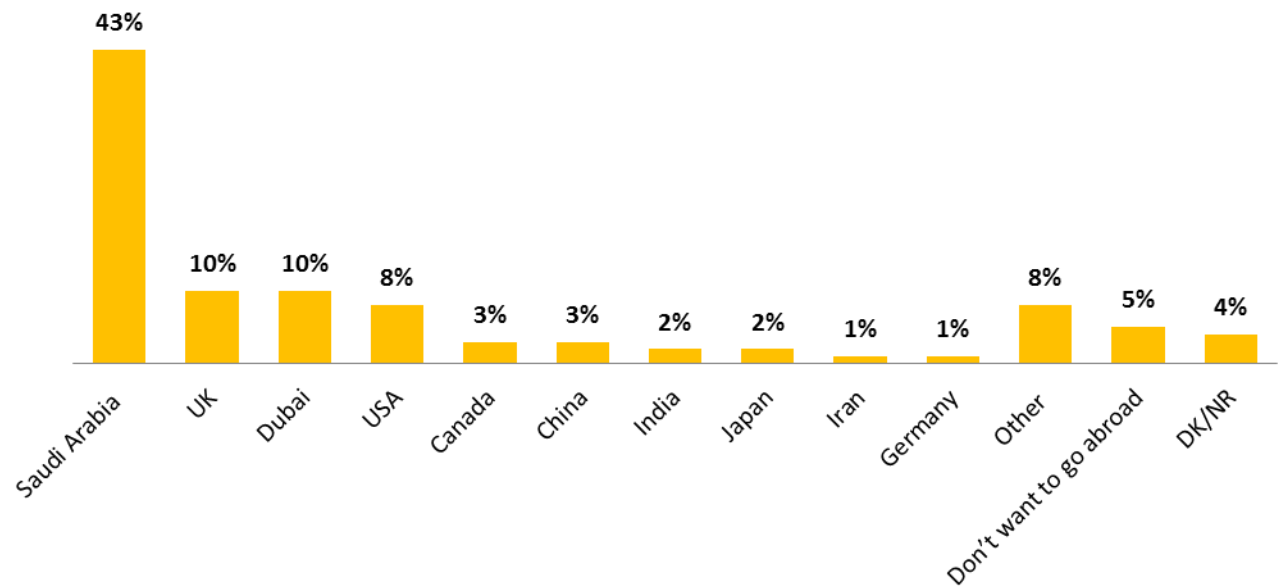
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Suppose that you get an opportunity to visit another country and all the associated expenditures such as accommodation and ticket are being borne by the Pakistan Government, then which Country would you like to go to?" In response to this question, 43% Pakistanis said Saudi Arabia, 10% said United Kingdom, 10% said Dubai, 8% said the United States of America, 3% said Canada, 3% said China, 2% said India, 2% said Japan, 1% said Iran, 1% said Germany, 8% mentioned some other country, 5% said that they would not want to go to any other country and 4% gave no response.

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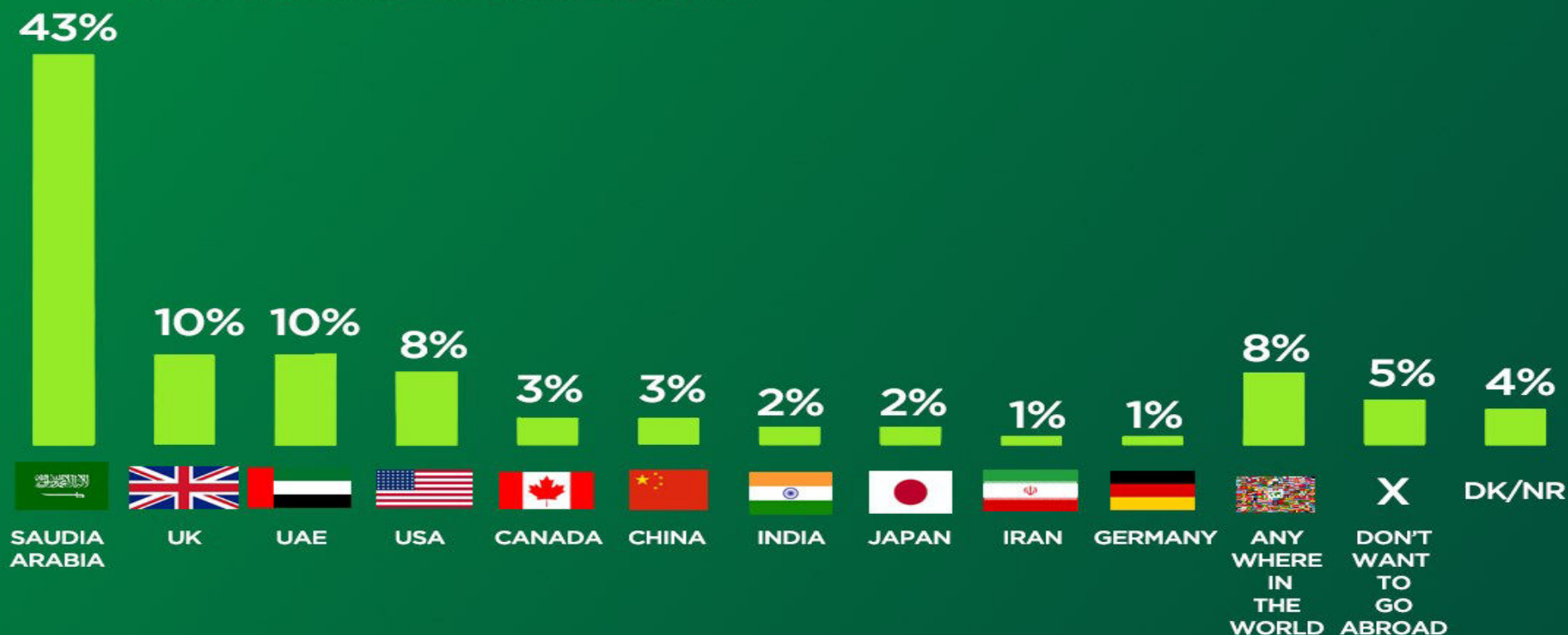
