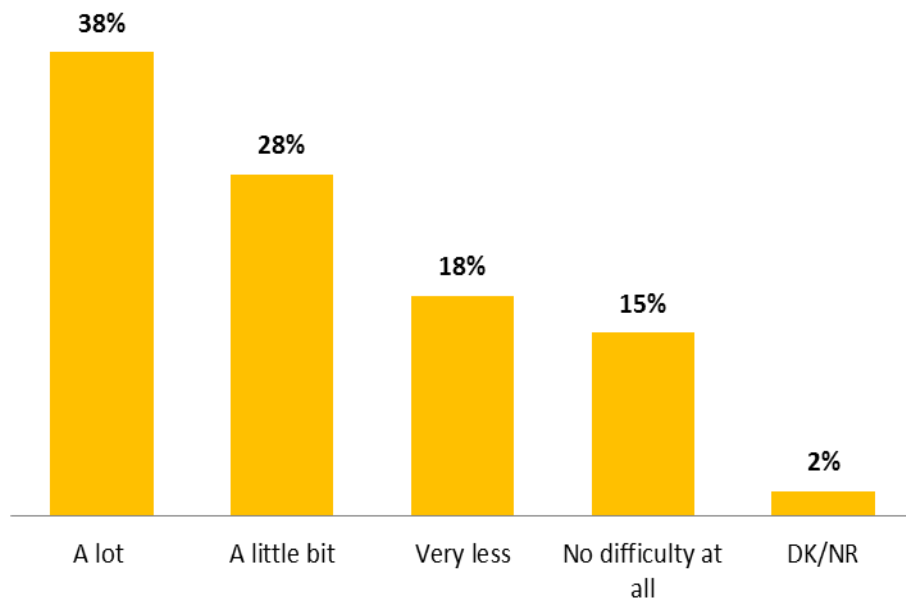

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 66% Pakistanis said that the traffic situation in their area is bad and that they have to face a daily ordeal in getting to their offices, homes or other desired locations.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Kindly tell us how bad is the traffic situation in your area, meaning that what extent of difficulty you have to face to get to your office, home or your desired location?” In response to this question, 38% said that they face a lot of difficulty, 28% said that they face a little bit difficulty, 18% said they face very little difficulty, 15% said that they do not face any difficulty at all while 2% did not respond

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1825 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 11 – April 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

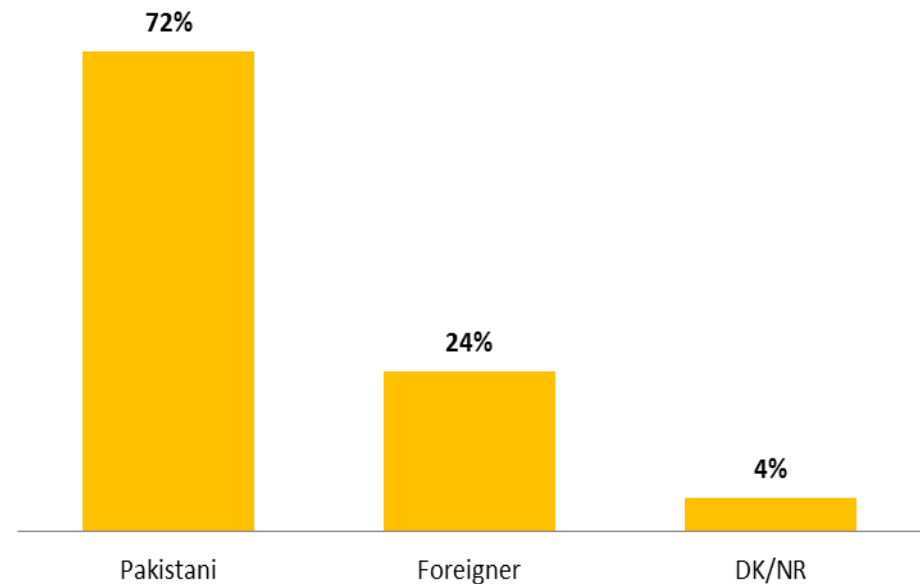

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 72% Pakistanis said that they want the national cricket team’s coach to be a Pakistani and not a foreigner.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you think the Pakistan National Cricket Team’s coach should be a foreigner or a Pakistani?” In response to this question, 72% said that the coach should be Pakistani, 24% said that he should be a foreigner while 4% did not respond.

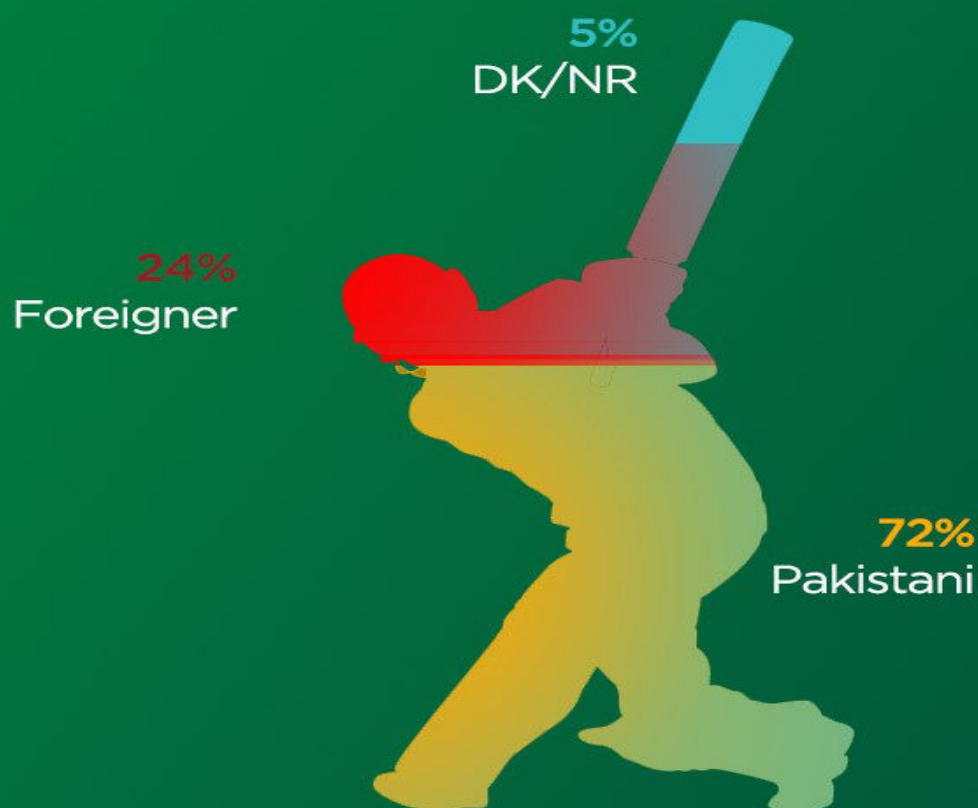

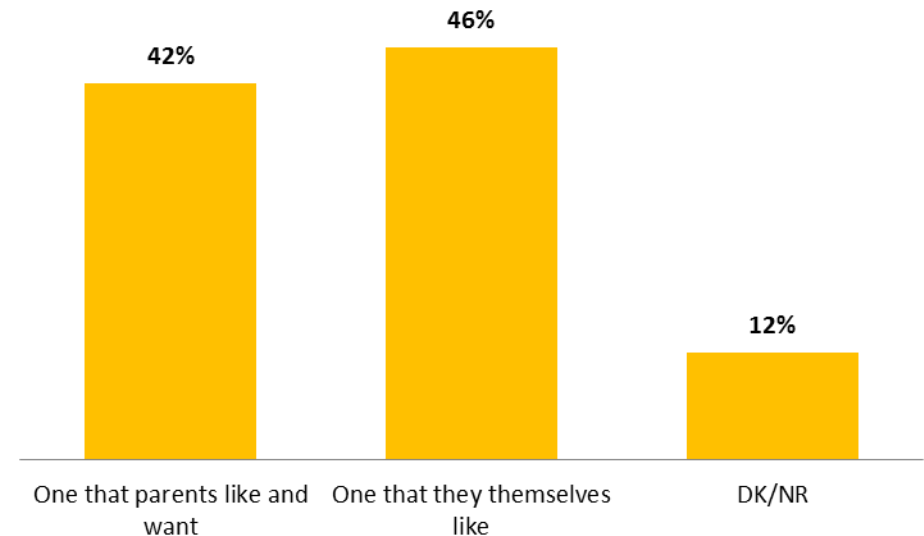

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 42% Pakistanis felt that children should opt for professions that are based on the preference of their parents.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, what profession should children take up; one that their parents prefer or the one that they prefer themselves?” In response to this question, 42% said that children should take up a profession of their parents’ preference and 46% said that children should take up a profession that they themselves prefer while 12% did not respond.

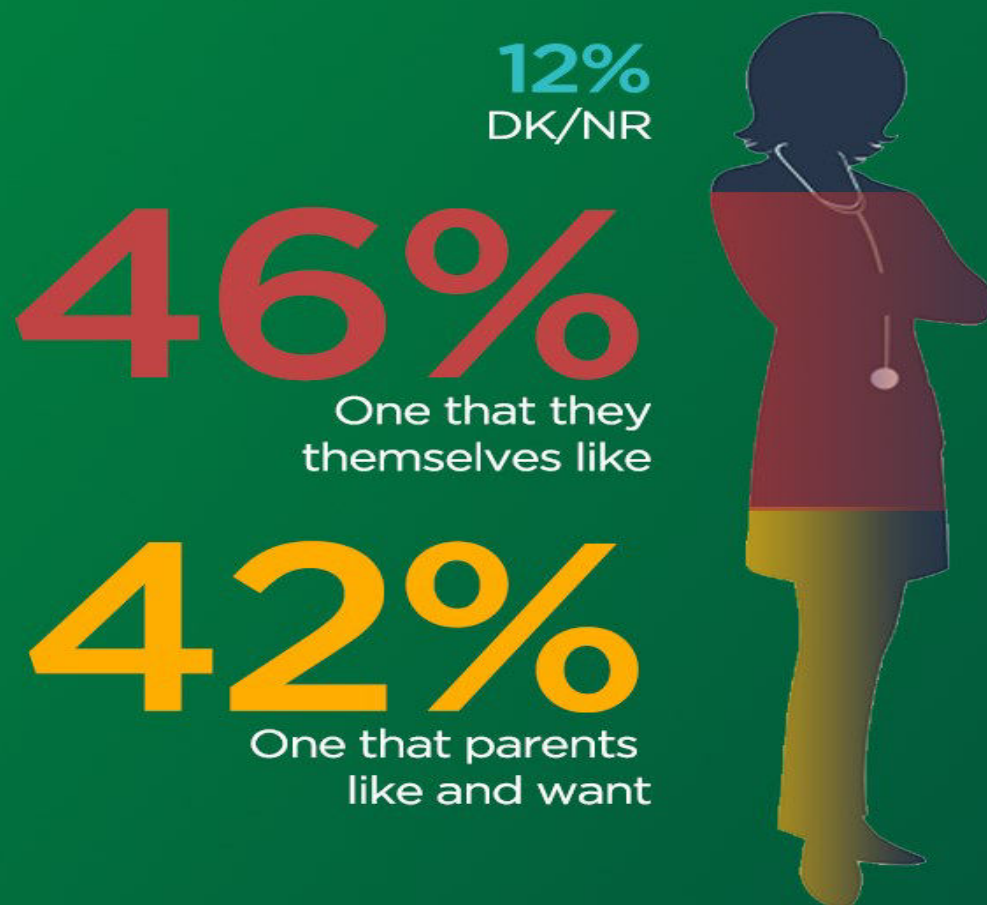

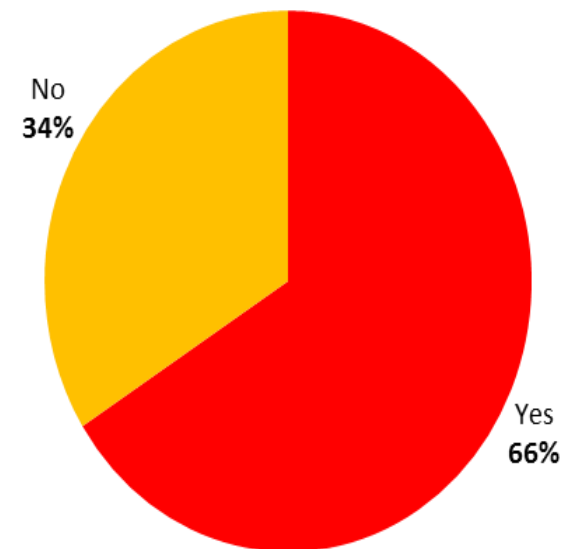

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 66% Pakistanis claim to have a cable connection at their home.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you have a cable connection at home?” In response to this question, 66% respondents said that they do have a cable connection at home, while 34% respondents said that they do not have a cable connection at home.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 5588 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 20 January – 31 May, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

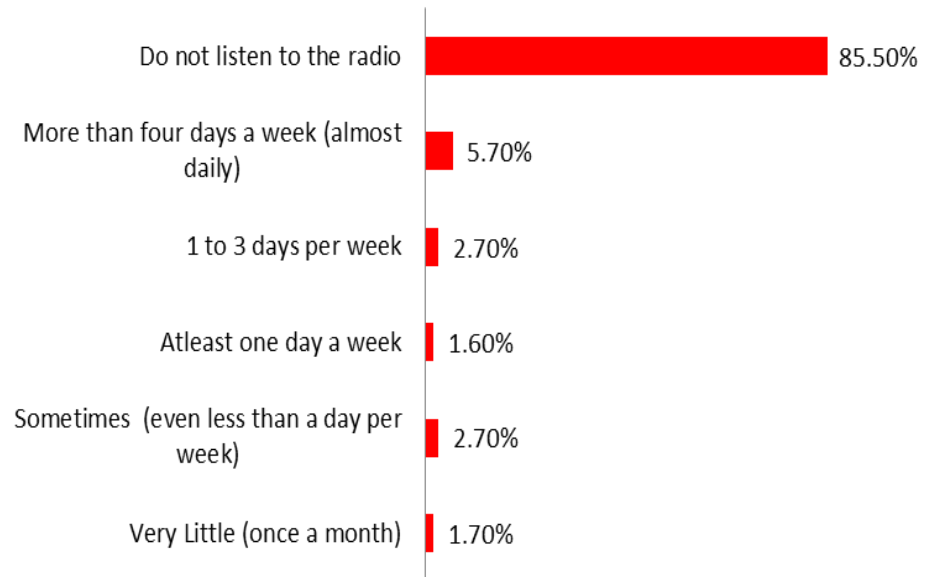

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 86% of the respondents do not listen to the radio at all.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How many days in a week do you listen to radio (FM)?” In response to this question, 85.5% respondents said that they do not listen to the radio at all, while only 5.7% respondents said that they listen to the radio more than four days a week (i.e. almost daily). 2.7% respondents said that they listen to the radio 1 to 3 days per week and, 1.6% said that they listen at least one day a week, 2.7% said that they sometimes listen to the radio (i.e. even less than a day per week). Another 1.7% respondents said that they listened to the radio very little (i.e. once a month).

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 108 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during 20 January – 31st May, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

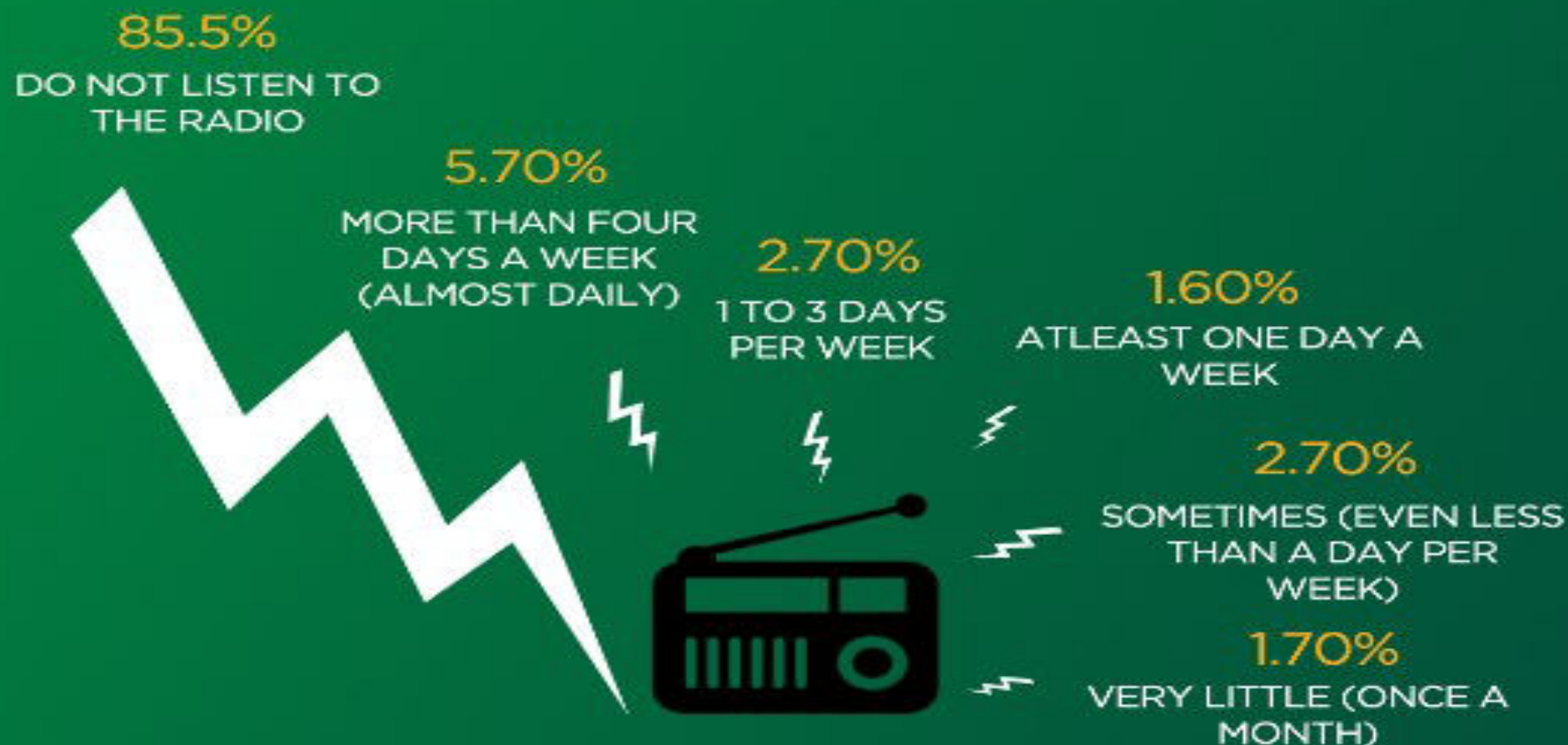
