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According to the findings of a survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan nearly 14% of urban Pakistanis travel outside their normal place of residence to celebrate Eid. In response to a question posed to a representative sample of men and women in all four provinces of Pakistan, 6% said they travelled to another city to celebrate Eid, 8% said they returned to their ancestral village for joining relatives in Eid celebration and 86% enjoyed Eid festivities at their usual place of residence.

The survey was conducted by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International among more than 1300 statistically selected households in the urban areas of all the four provinces of Pakistan.
