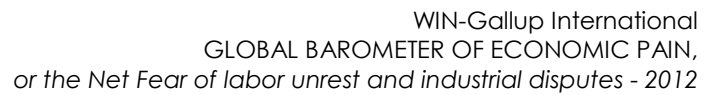

Rising Fear of Labor Unrest and Industrial Disputes in 2012; 55% across the globe feel labor unrest will rise this year, while 13% believe it will decline

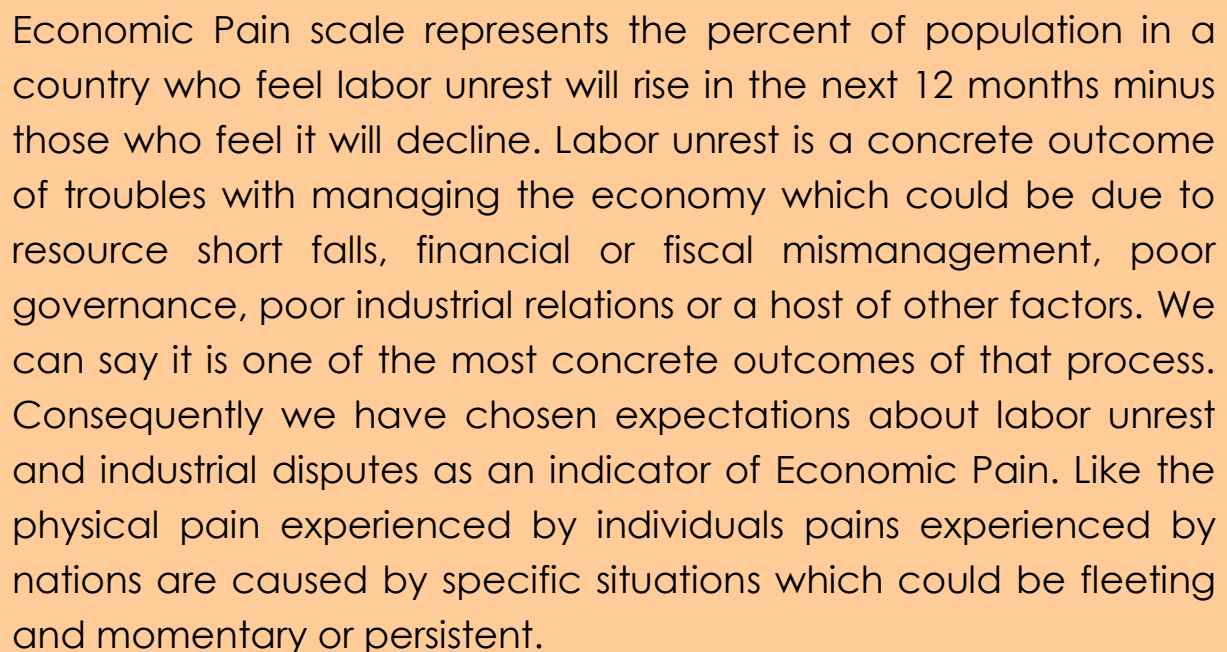
Zurich, 10 February 2012 — A recent global poll shows that while no nation is without its share of misery and pain, the pain caused by the fear of rising labor unrest is heavily concentrated among the rich and the economically rising nations. Findings from the latest global Index of Economic Pain provide a fascinating scale of pain among over 50,000 men and women across all continents of the world.

The global survey shows the net global fear of rising labor unrest to be 42%. It is notable that the pain caused by fears of labor unrest is nearly the same in the emerging economies of **BRIC**, the financially wounded economies of Western Europe and the rich nations of **G7**. The Index measures **48%** in the four leading economies of BRIC, (*Brazil, Russia, India and China*) and **45%** among **G7** including USA, Canada, Germany and others. While the top 10 most pained nations are heavily the economically upscale or rising nations, the least pained are heavily downscale economies.

The poll findings also show that the miseries of the rich and rising are different from those of the poor and war-torn nations. The economic pain due to net fear of labor unrest is minus (-)19% in Afghanistan and minus (-)17% in Iraq both of whom are on top of the 10 most relaxed nations in term of labor unrest.

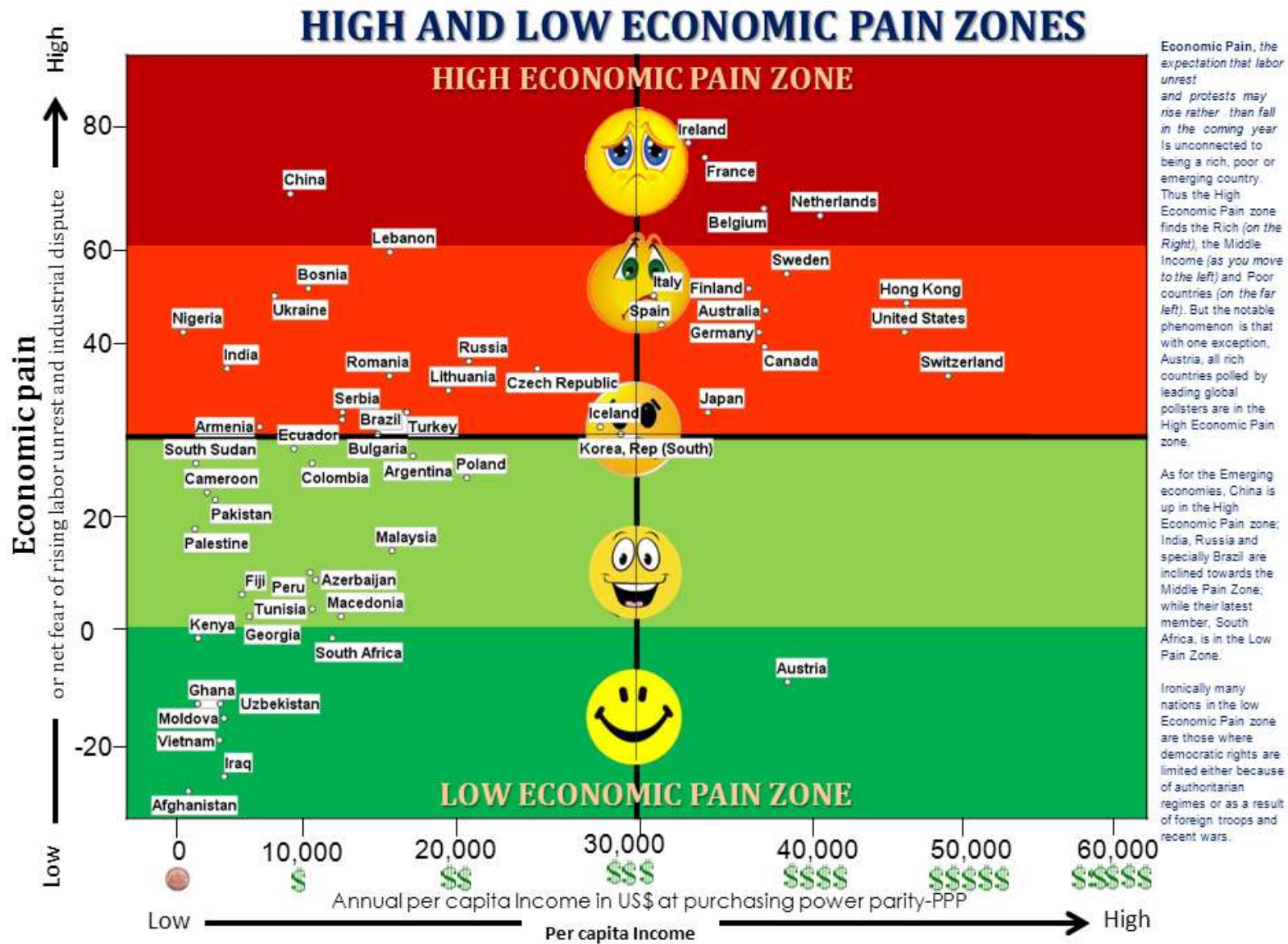

Commentary:

It is intriguing to note that many emerging nations with high growth rates are as fearful of economic unrest as those suffering from zero or negative growth rates, says Jean-Marc Leger President of the prestigious WIN-Gallup International, the network which runs an unbroken Annual tracker or barometer of opinions, including the Index of Economic Pain, since 1977.

Methodology:

The global barometer of hope and despair is an annual tradition initiated by and designed under the chairmanship of Dr. George Gallup in 1977. It is conducted every year since then. This year it was carried out by associates of WIN-Gallup International in **56** countries around the world. *(Altogether 59 participated, but 3 countries, Denmark, Egypt and Saudi Arabia did not ask the Question pertaining to this Report)*

Sample Size and Mode of Field Work:

A total of 51,425 persons were interviewed globally. In each country a national probability sample of around 1000 men and women was interviewed either face to face (35 countries; $n=33,890$), via telephone (12 countries; $n=11,378$) or online (9 countries; $n=6,157$). Details are attached. The field work was conducted during November 2011- January 2012. In general the error margin for surveys of this kind is $\pm 3-5\%$ at 95% confidence level.

The global average has been computed according to the share of the covered adult population of the surveyed countries.
