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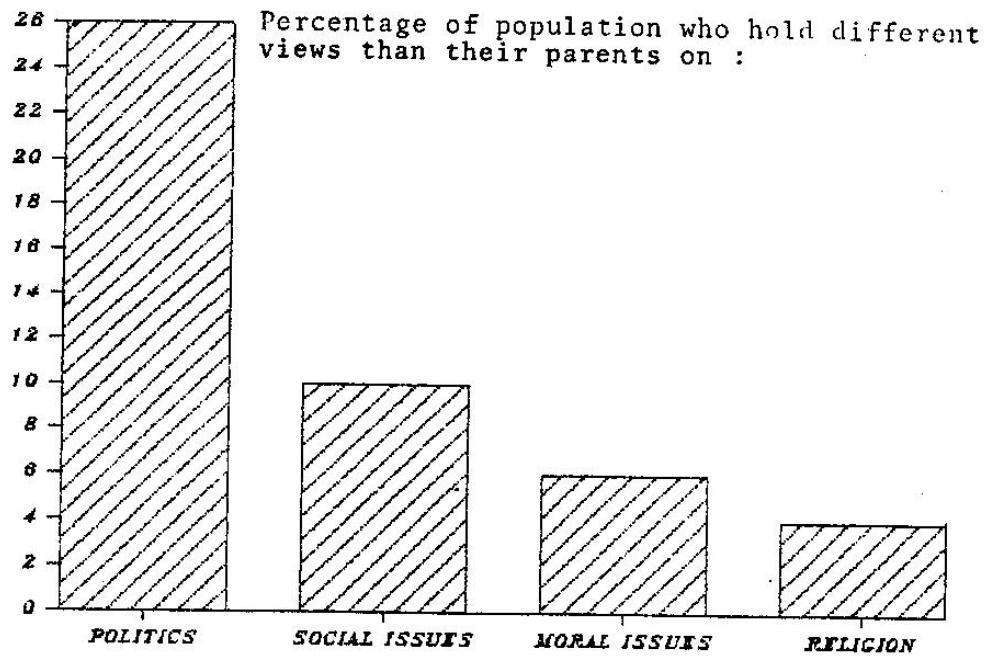
GENERATION GAP ON POLITICAL ISSUES BUT NOT ON RELIGION AND CULTURE

According to a recent Gallup poll the issue of Generations Gap has a peculiar charter in Pakistan. It is visibly present on political issues, but not on religious or cultural matters.

The Survey was conducted by Gallup Pakistan with a representative set of rural and urban households all over the country. 26% of those surveyed said their views on politics differed from those of their parents where as only 4% expressed any differences with their parents on religious issues. Moral and cultural issues were placed in the middle. 6% of the sample differed with their parents on ethical or moral issues and 10% differed on social values or norms.

The Gallup Survey revealed a remarkable sense of harmony, or what could also be interpreted as conservatism, across generation in the same socio-economic class. Controlling for socio-economic class, 93% of the sample said their views on religion were the same as those of their parents. 91% claimed harmony of views with their parents on moral values and 82% on social values. Politics was most contentious, but even in politics Pakistani society shows a fair degree of harmony between parents and children of the same class. 67% of the sample claimed to share political views with their parents.
