*PAKISTAN SHOULD REMAIN NEUTRAL IN THE IRAN-IRAQ WAR: BOTH ARE TO
BE BLAMED EQUALLY*

According to a Gallup Pakistan survey held recently, an overwhelming sentiment of Pakistanis is that their country should remain neutral in the Iran-Iraq war. The survey conducted in the urban areas of the country showed that 72% of the respondents were for remaining neutral, 12% for supporting Iraq and 7% for siding with Iran. 9% did not answer the question.

When the respondents were asked which of the two warring sides, in their opinion, was the “rightful” party, and which was the “errant” party, the majority said that both Iraq and Iran were responsible and to be blamed equally for the existing situation.

The survey was conducted by Gallup Pakistan with a statistically selected sample in the urban areas all over the country.
