Study on public attitudes on corruption

According to the findings of a Gallup poll, a majority of Pakistanis hold the view that palm greasing or kickbacks have become unavoidable in day life. When asked to give reasons for corruption in the society, 50% of national sample attributed it to the belief that no work is processed by relevant authorities with out the helping hand of kick-backs. Only 19% attributed corruption to an attempt to get unfair favors. 17% believed that kick-backs are given because people wish to expedite their work. 10% attributed to a bad habit while 4% did not express any view.

The survey was conducted by Gallup Pakistan with a nationally representative sample in both rural and urban areas of all the four provinces in the country. The findings of the survey were computer processed.
