ONE OUT OF FOUR INVOLVED IN COURT LITIGATION

According to the findings of a Gallup poll nearly one quarter of male adults in Pakistan have been personally involved in court litigation, at some stage in their life.

A nationally representative survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan asked the question:

“Have you ever had to deal with the courts, by way of filing a suit, facing a suit, or to appear as a witness, etc.?” Responding to this question, 23% of male adults said they had dealt with the courts either to file or face a legal suit. 9% said they had at some point in their life appeared as a witness in the court. Another 9% said they had dealt with the courts on behalf of a friend or relative.

Survey findings show that the incidence of litigation is highest in rural Punjab where nearly 30% of the populations have been personally exposed to court litigation. Exposure to court litigation is the lowest among the residents of urban Sindh and rural Baluchistan. This apparent similarity in lower incidence of litigation among the residents of the most advanced and the least developed regions in the country could possibly be attributed to very different reason.

The survey was conducted in 200 statistically selected rural and urban locations all over the country.
