MORE PAKISTANI TURN TO RELIGION

According to a recent Gallup poll there is a general impression in the country that Pakistani is becoming more religious in their orientation. Nearly half the population believes that the role of religion is increasing in people's lives while one quarter believes that it is declining. The remaining does not see any change.

The survey was conducted by Gallup Pakistan in 100 statistically selected villages and 75 urban locations all over the country and the sample was a scientific cross-section of the entire population.

The nationally representative Gallup survey showed that the increasing role of religion manifests itself in several ways. Nearly one out of ten visited households say that they were recently visited by the tebleeghi jamaat or Jamaat-i-Islami to speak to them on Islamic teachings. Nearly one quarter of the population say that during the previous year they attended the congregation in memory of religious saints and leaders.
