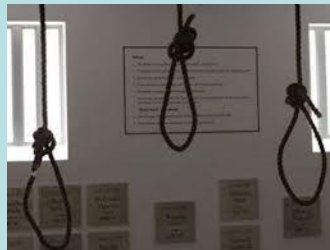

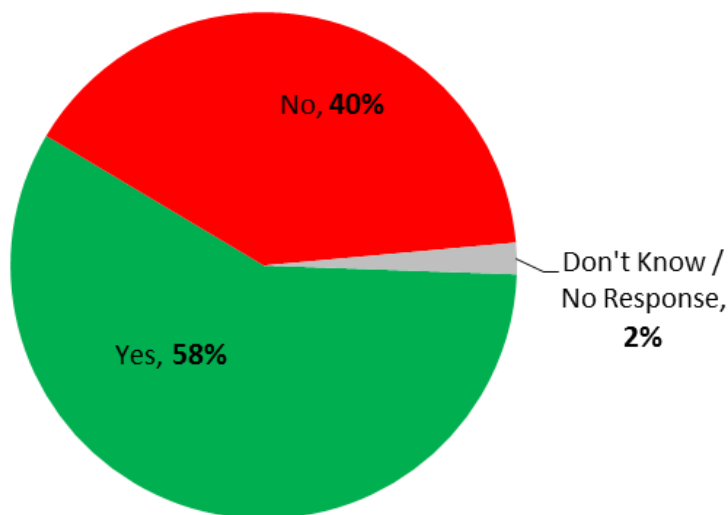
Islamabad December 24, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 58% of Pakistanis think that there should be Agricultural Tax whereas 40% disagree.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, should there be tax on agricultural income?” Responding to this, 58% think that there should be tax on agricultural income while 40% believe that there should be no such tax. However, 2% did not give a view.

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Bilal Ijaz Gilani, *Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan*, adds:

“The support for any form of taxes in Pakistan is low at the public opinion level. Over the decades, majority of Pakistanis continued to believe that taxes are unjust and too many, acceptability of taxes rose from 34% in 1991 to 45% in 2002 and then it dipped again.

In a poll conducted in 2009, 72% of Pakistanis believed that government charges them unfair amount of tax. Any drive to increase tax collection in the country needs to address this issue of lack of public support.”

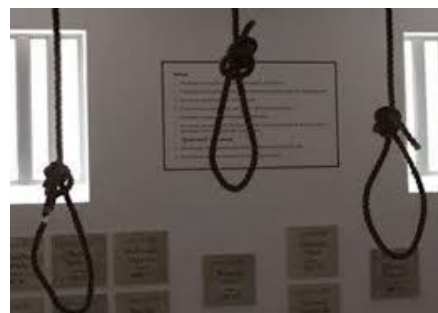

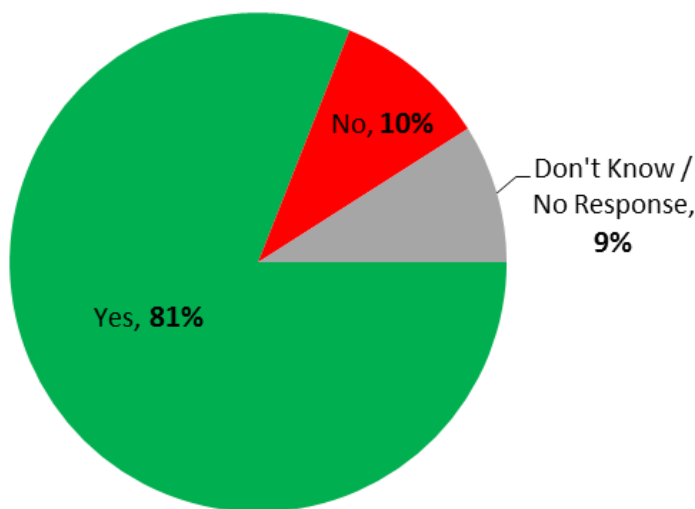
Islamabad December 26, 2012

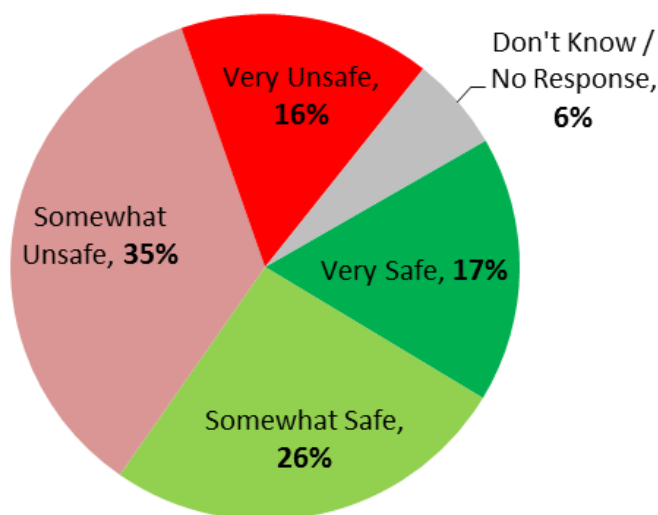

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, more than 50% of Pakistanis feel unsafe while walking outside at night.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Do you feel safe walking outside at night where you live?” Responding to this, 17% claim that they feel very safe while walking outside at night, 26% claim they somewhat feel safe, 35% claim they feel somewhat unsafe while 16% feel very unsafe. However 6% did not give a view.

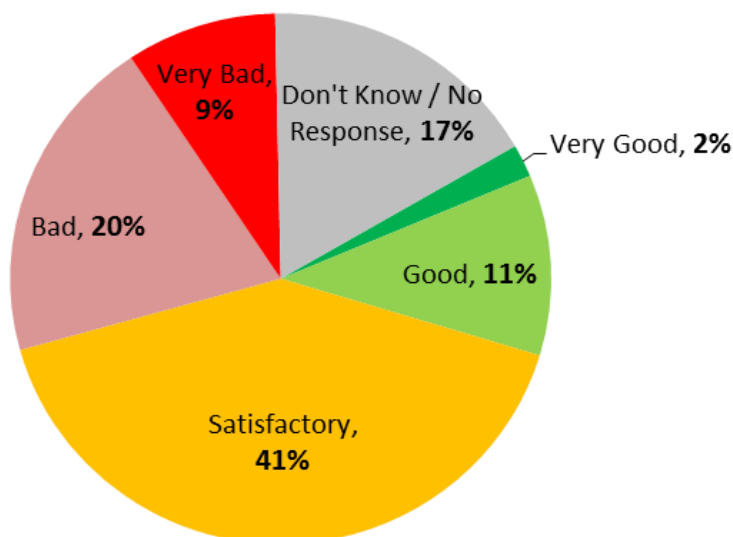

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 13% of Pakistanis believe that there is a good level of facilities available to disabled children and adults whereas 41% believe it is satisfactory.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “What is your opinion about the level of facilities available for disabled children and adults in Pakistan?” Responding to this, 2% claimed that the level of facilities was very good, 11% termed them as good, 41% believed that the level was satisfactory, 20% believed levels were bad while 9% considered them very bad. However, 17% did not give a view.
