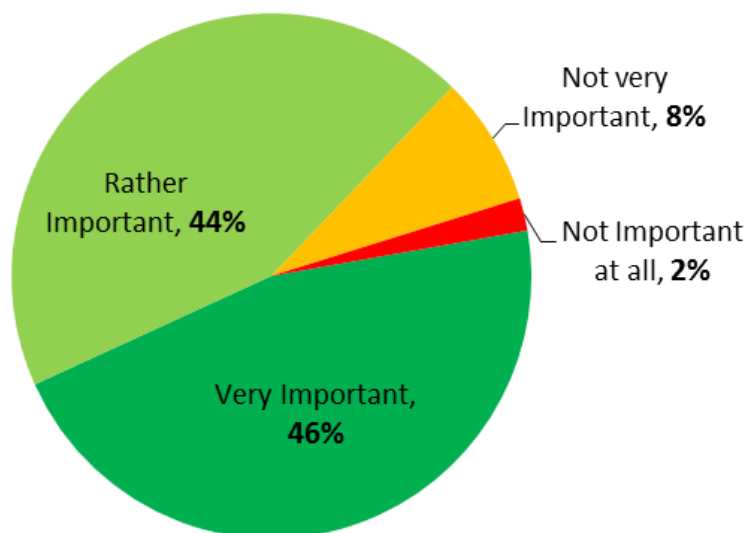

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, a substantial majority of Pakistanis (90%) believe that honest and free/fair elections play a very important role to help ordinary Pakistanis live a good life.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Some people think that having honest and free/fair elections makes a lot of difference in their lives; others think that it doesn’t matter much. Do you think that honest and free/fair elections play an important role in deciding whether you and your family are able to live a good life?” Responding to this, 46% believe that honest elections are very important to help them live a good life, 44% it is rather important while 7% believe it is not very important. However, 2% believe that honest elections are not at all important.

Question: “Some people think that having honest and free/fair elections makes a lot of difference in their lives; others think that it doesn’t matter much. Do you think that honest and free/fair elections play an important role in deciding whether you and your family are able to live a good life?”

In a follow up question, the respondents were asked “Do you think that honest elections are an important factor in whether or not this country develops economically?” Responding to this, 51% believe that honest elections are very important for economic development of the country, 39% believe it is somewhat important, 8% believe that it is not very important whereas 1% believe it is not important at all.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1200 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 04, 2012 – October 19, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at 95% confidence level.

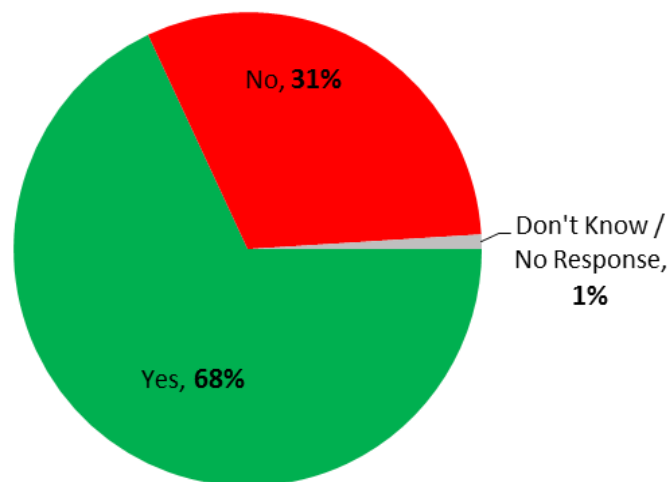

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (68%) Pakistani households claim to suffer from flu and fever in December.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Has anyone from your house got flu and fever in the last one month?” Responding to this, 68% claim that someone in their house caught flu and fever in the last one month whereas 31% said no. However 1% did not give a view.

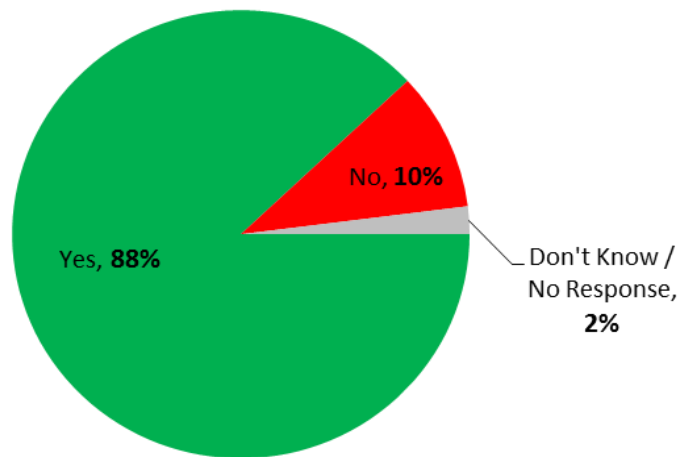

However 2% did not give a view.

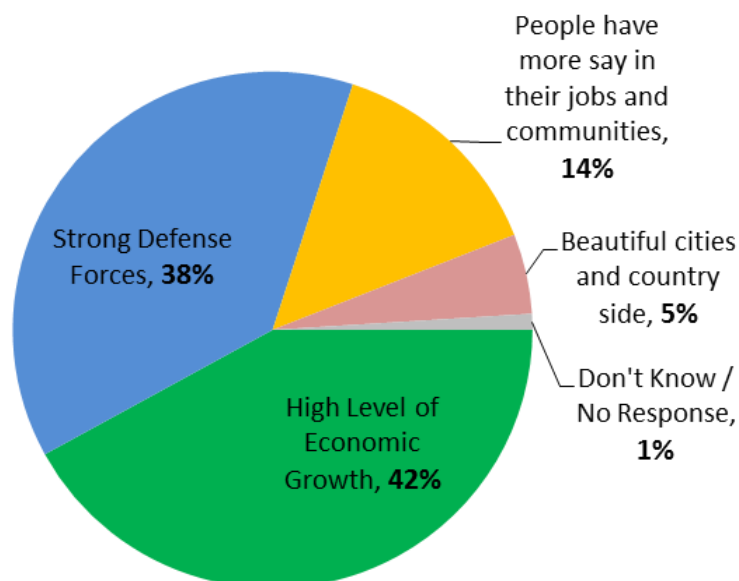

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 42% of Pakistanis believe that economic growth should be the most important goal of the country for the next ten years.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “People sometimes talk about what the goals of this country should be for the next ten years. Would you please say which of the following goals you consider to be the most important?” Responding to this, 42% claim that a high level of economic growth is the most important goal for our country, 38% believe ensuring the country has strong defense forces is a major goal, 14% believe that most important goal to achieve is giving people more say about how things are done at their jobs and in their communities whereas 5% believe that the most important goal is to try and make our cities and country side more beautiful.

Question: “People sometimes talk about what the goals of this country should be for the next ten years. Would you please say which of the following goals you consider to be the most important?”

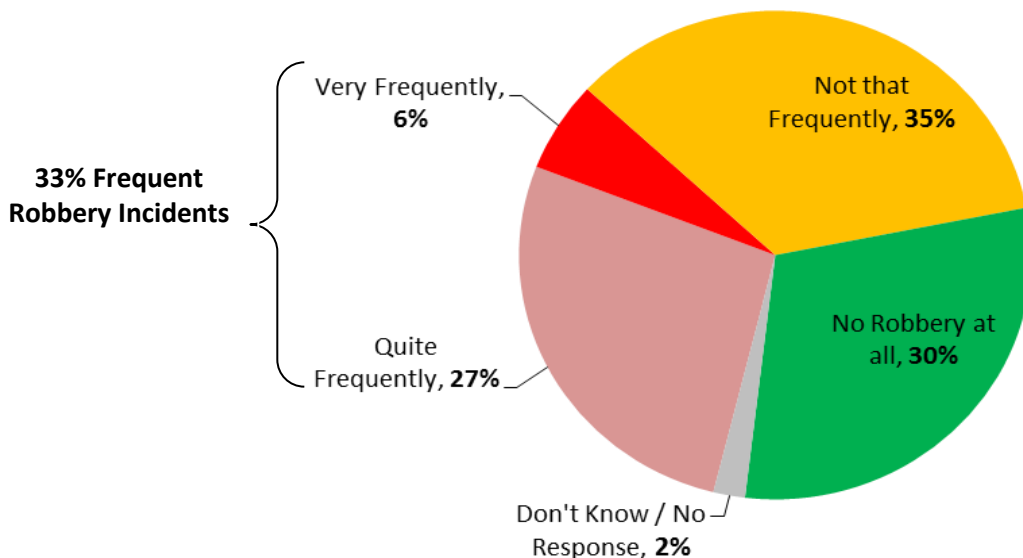

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 33% Pakistanis claim frequent robberies in their neighborhood.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “How frequently do incidents of robbery occur in your neighborhood?” Responding to this, 6% claim that the robberies in their neighborhood occurs very frequently, 27% claim that robberies occur quite frequently, 35% claim that robberies are not that frequent whereas 30% claim that there are no robberies in their neighborhood. However, 2% did not give a view.
