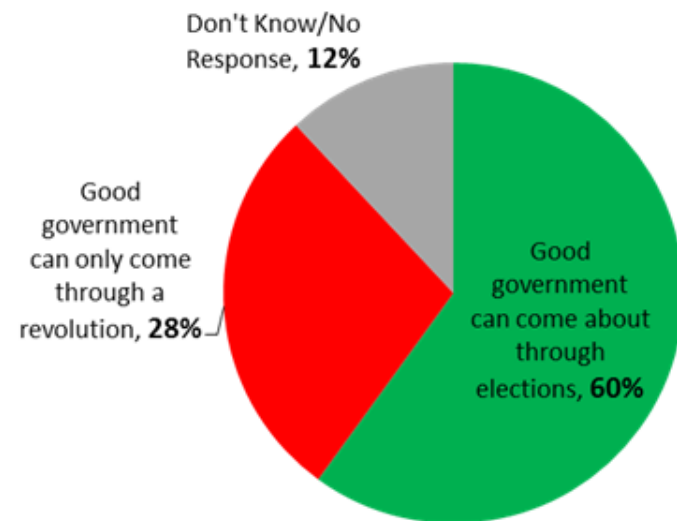

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 60% of Pakistanis think it is possible for a good government to come through elections.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, can a good government come through elections or can it only come about through a revolution?” Responding to this, 60% think it is possible for a good government to come through elections and 28% think a good government can

only come about through a revolution. However, 12% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2644 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 13, 2013 – January 20, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

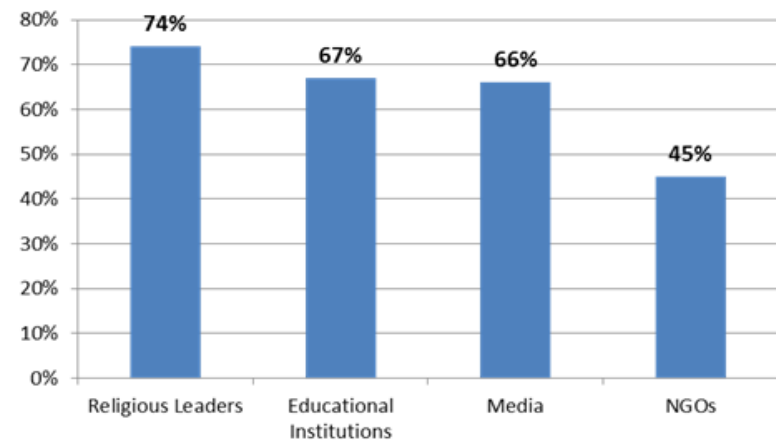
Trust and Confidence Index 2013: Religious Leaders, Educational Institutions and Media Enjoy High Trust from the Public, NGOs rank low.



According to a Gilani Research Foundation survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 45% of people say they trust the NGO sector whereas a considerable majority expressed their trust in Religious Leaders (74%), Educational Institutions (67%) and Media (66%).

In a survey, a nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “These are some of the major institutions in Pakistan. Please tell us to what extent do you trust these institutions?” The findings of the survey suggest that NGOs are the least trusted sector with only 45% of peo-

ple saying that they had high trust in NGOs, whereas 47% replied they did not. Religious leaders were the most trusted with 74% people saying that they trusted them and only 22% stating mistrust. Educational Institutions were the second most trusted category with 67% people saying they trusted them and 27% replying in the negative. The results also indicated that the institution of Media has high trust with 66% of respondents saying they trust the media and only 29% saying they don't.

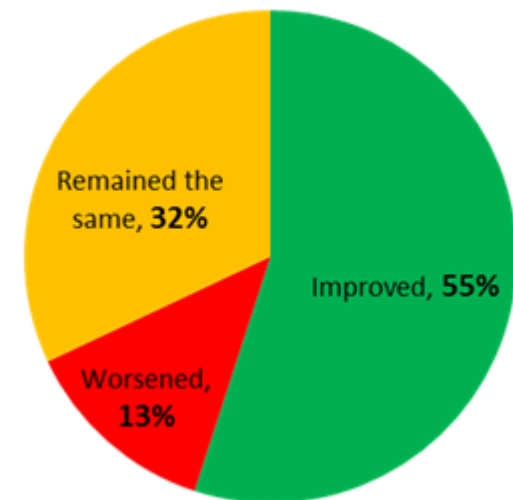

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, has the country-wide health situation improved, worsened or remained the same because of Lady Health Workers?” Responding to this, 55% think it

has improved, 32% think it has remained the same and 13% think it has worsened.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2640 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 20, 2013 – January 27, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

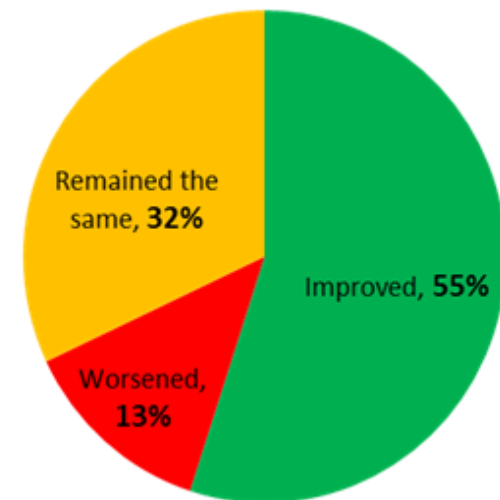

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 59% of Pakistanis rate the Benazir Income Support Program as ‘good’.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “What do you think about the Benazir Income Support Program?” Responding to this, 59% consider it ‘good’ and 34% consider it ‘bad’. However, 7% did not give a response. This question was only

asked from people who had heard or read about the Benazir Income Support Program.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2078 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during January 20, 2013 – January 27, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
