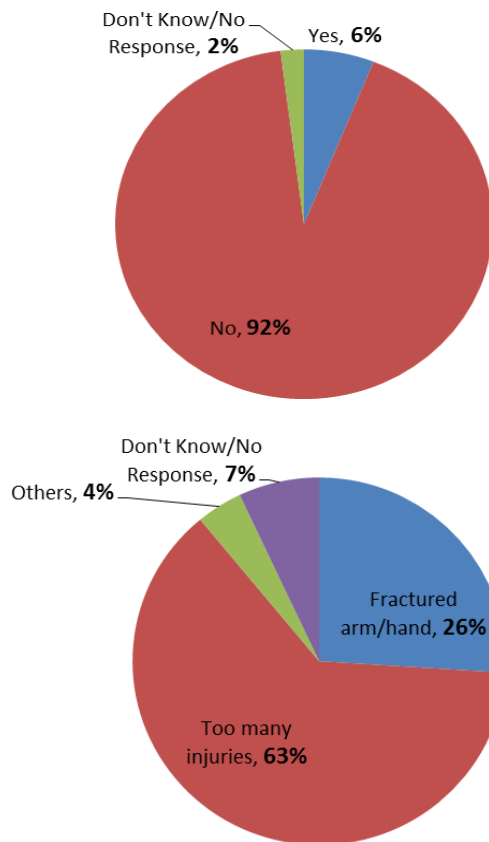
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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 6% of parents said their child has been hit so hard by his/her teacher that he/she has been injured, 26% said the beating resulted in a fractured arm/hand.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “**Has your child been beaten so severely that he/she was injured?**” Responding to this, 6% said yes and 92% said no. However, 2% did not give a response. This question was only asked from parents who said their child had complained of being hit by his/her teacher.

The respondents were then asked “What kind of injury occurred to the child?” Responding to this, 26% said fractured arm/hand, 63% said there were too many injuries, 4% said others and 7% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1821 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 11, 2013 – March 18, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

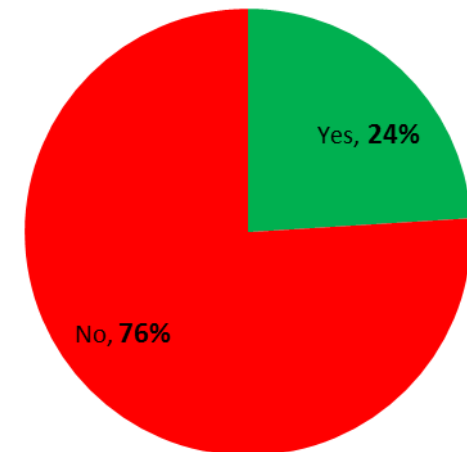

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 76% of Pakistanis say there is no park near their house.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “**Is there a park near your home?**” Responding to this, 76% said no and 24% said yes.

A comparison between rural and urban localities show that there are more parks near the respondents houses who live in urban areas (45%) as compared to rural areas (13%).

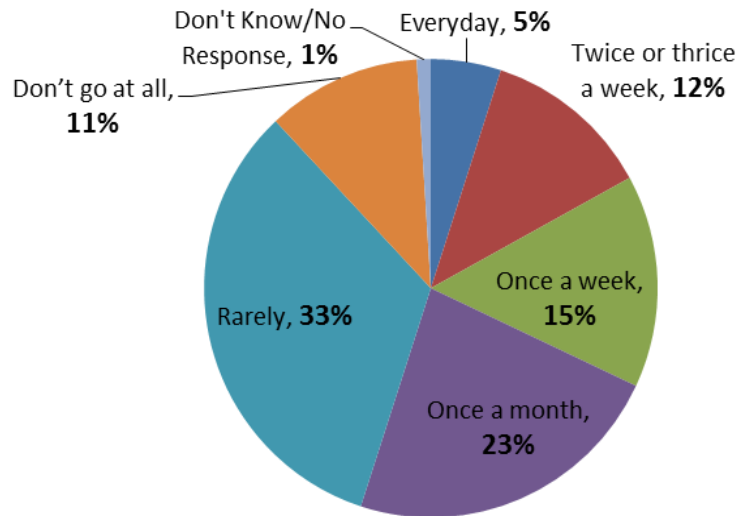
The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2710 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 11, 2013 – March 18, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 per cent at 95% confidence level.

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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, only 5% of Pakistanis (who have a park near their house) say they go to a park every day.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “If there is a park near your house, how often do you go there?” Responding to this, 33% said rarely, 23% said once a month, 15% said once a week, 12% said twice or thrice a week, 11% said they don't go at all and 5% said every day. However, 1% did not give a response. This question was only asked from respondents who said there is a park near their house.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 639 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 11, 2013 – March 18, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

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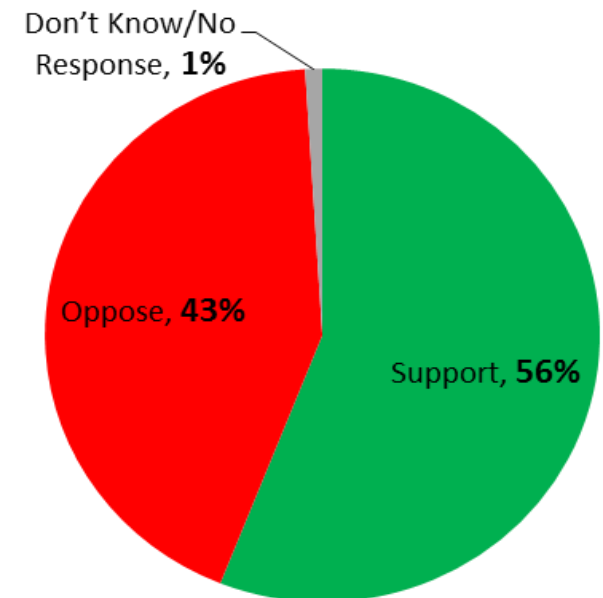
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 56% of Pakistanis would support the decision of a small fee being introduced to enter a park.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Suppose that a small fee is introduced to enter the park, would you support or oppose this?” Responding to this, 56% said they would support this and 43% said they would oppose this. However, 1% did not give a response.

It is interesting to note that more respondents from rural areas (63%) would support the deci-

sion to introduce a small fee to enter a park than respondents from urban areas (42%).

“85% of Pakistanis sit and watch TV with their families.”

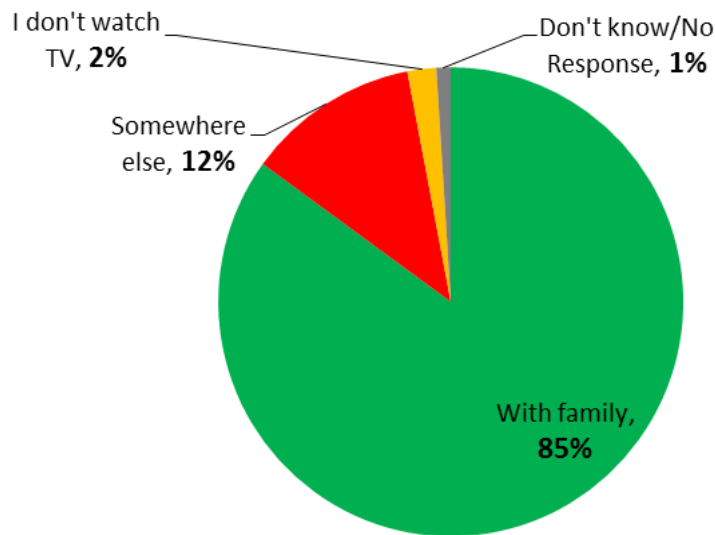
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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 85% of Pakistanis sit and watch TV with their families.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “**Do you often sit and watch TV with your family or somewhere else?**” Responding to this, 85% said with family, 12% said somewhere else and 2% said they don’t watch TV. However, 1% did not give a response.
