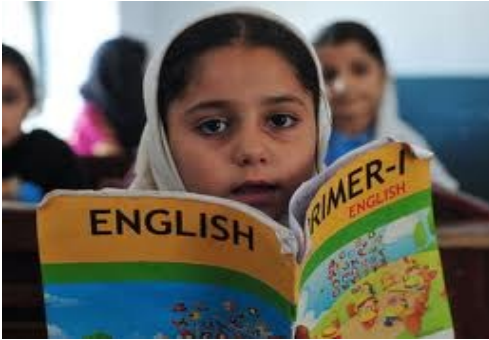
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority of Pakistanis think the medium of education for primary, secondary and higher education should be English (49%, 60% and 65% respectively).

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “**What, in your opinion, should the medium of instruction be for primary education?**” Responding to this, 49% said English, 42% said Urdu, 8% said local language and 1% said others. More urban respondents (61%) think English should be the medium of instruction at primary schools than rural respondents (43%).

The respondents were asked “What, in your opinion, should the medium of instruction be for secondary (6th to 10th class) school?” Responding to this, 60% said English, 34% said Urdu, 4% said local language and 1% said others. However, 1% did not give a response. A comparison between localities shows the same trend here, with more urban respondents choosing English (75%) than rural respondents (53%).

The respondents were also asked “What, in your opinion, should the medium of instruction be for higher education?” Responding to this, 65% said English, 30% said Urdu, 4% said local language and 1% said others. Overwhelming majority of urban respondents (77%) chose English, compared to rural respondents (59%).

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2639 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 18, 2013 – March 25, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

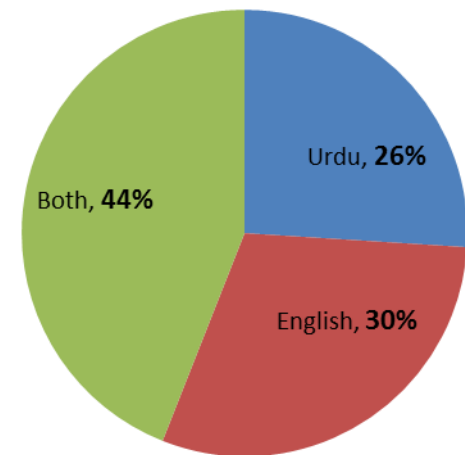
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked **“What, in your opinion, should be the medium of instruction in schools country wide?”** Responding to this, 30% said English, 26% said Urdu and 44% said both.

A comparison between localities shows that there is not much difference between urban and rural respondents; as 29% of urban respondents and 30% of rural respondents

chose English. However, a comparison between provinces shows that 59% of respondents from KPK want English to be the medium of instruction in schools country-wide, followed by 27% in Punjab, 22% in Balochistan and 21% in Sindh.

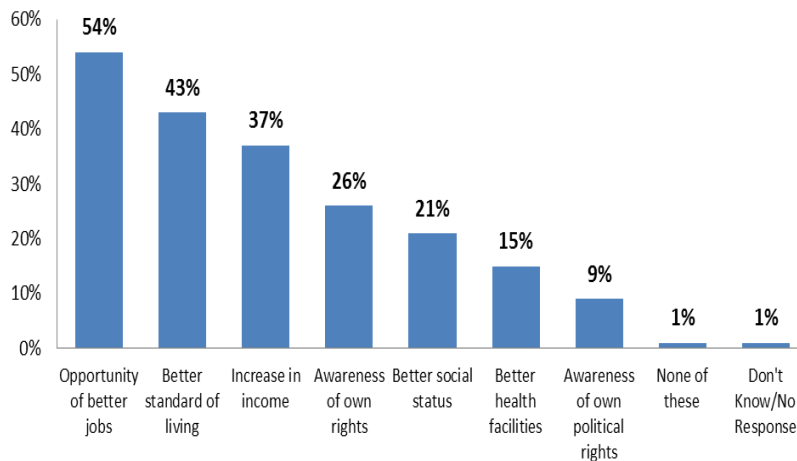

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 54% of Pakistanis think higher education helps in providing opportunities for better jobs.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your view, what does higher education help you in?” Responding to this, 54% said in providing opportunities for better jobs, 43% said better standard of living, 37% said an increase in income, 26% said awareness of own rights, 21% said better social status, 15% said better health facilities, 9% said awareness of own political rights and 1% said none of these. However, 1% did not give a response.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2639 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 18, 2013 – March 25, 2013. 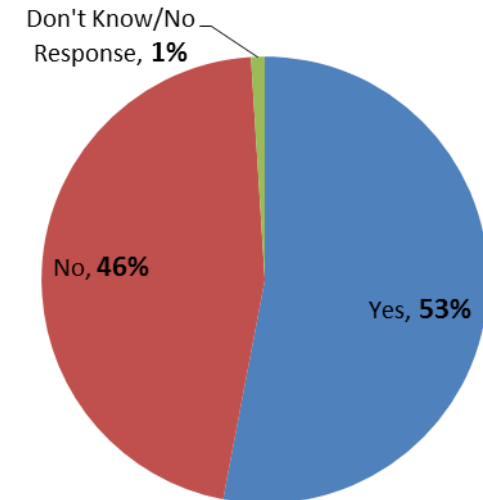

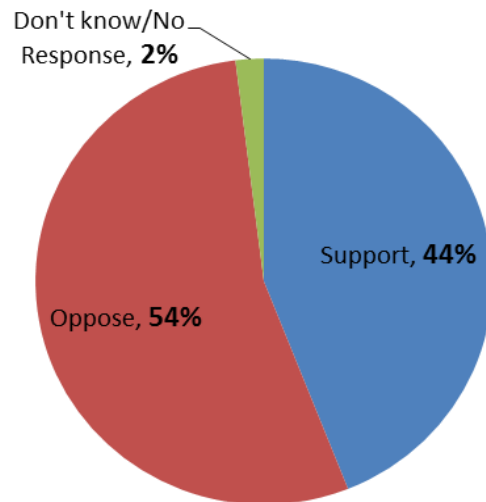

Do you support or oppose this decision?**” Responding to this, 54% said they oppose this decision and 44% said they support it. However, 2% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2617 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during March 30, 2013 – April 06, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
