According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, on the eve of this year’s UN International Youth Day, a majority of Pakistanis (62%) say that the Pakistani youth ranks amongst the most talented in the world.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “The UN’s International Youth Day is being celebrated this August 12th 2013. On this occasion, we’d like to ask if you are amongst those who believe that the Pakistani youth ranks amongst the most talented in the world, capable of successfully competing at the international level in a variety of fields or among those disagree with this statement.” Responding to this, 62% said they believed the Pakistani youth ranked amongst the most capable world over, whereas 28% said they disagreed with this viewpoint. 10% chose not to respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2533 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 30, 2013 – August 05, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be proximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

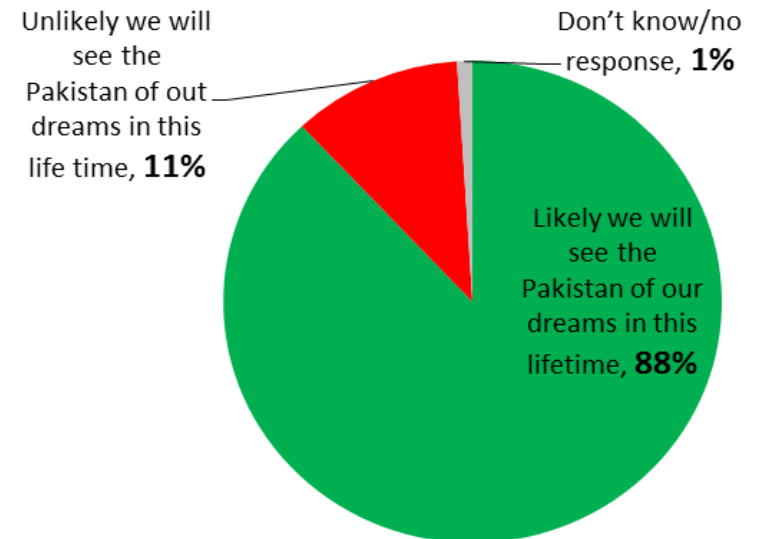

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked **“Pakistan will be celebrating her 67th Independence Day on 14th August 2013. On this occasion, we would like to ask if you think it is likely that you will see the Pakistan of your dreams**

within your lifetime.” Responding to this, 88% said it was likely whereas 11% said it was unlikely. 1% chose not to respond.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2533 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 30, 2013 – Aug 05, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

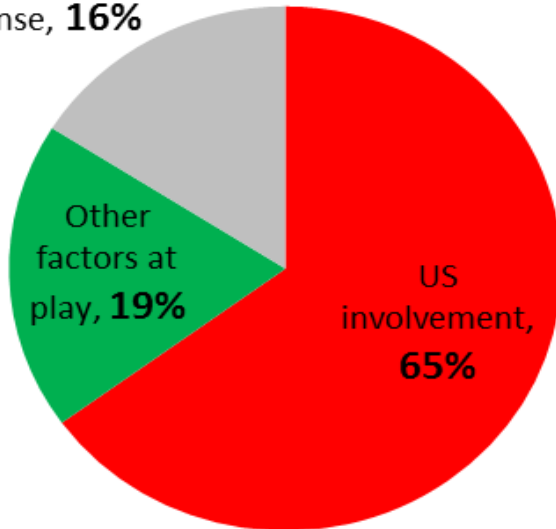

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis (65%) believe that Egypt’s deteriorating political situation and unrest owes to US involvement.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “**Some people think that Egypt’s deteriorating political situation owes to US involvement whereas others don’t think this is the case. What do you think about this?**” Responding to this, 65% said there was US involvement whereas 19% said the worsening situation owed to other factors. 16% chose not to respond.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2640 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 08, 2013 – July 15, 2013. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

The Gallup Pakistan Poll asked the **question** “**How would you rate the personality of General Pervez Musharraf on a scale ranging from Very Good to Very Bad?**” 11% opined very good, 20% good, 28% satisfactory, 18% bad and 16% opined very bad. 7% responders did not give a view.

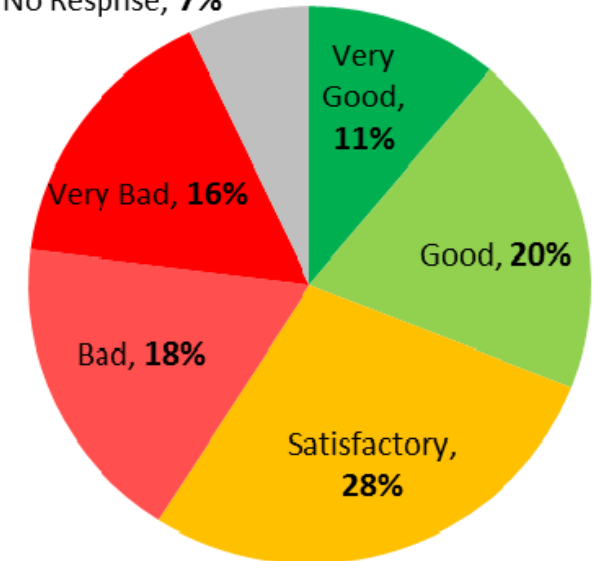
