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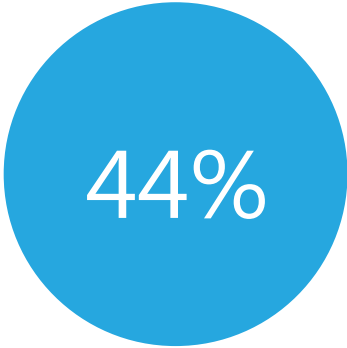

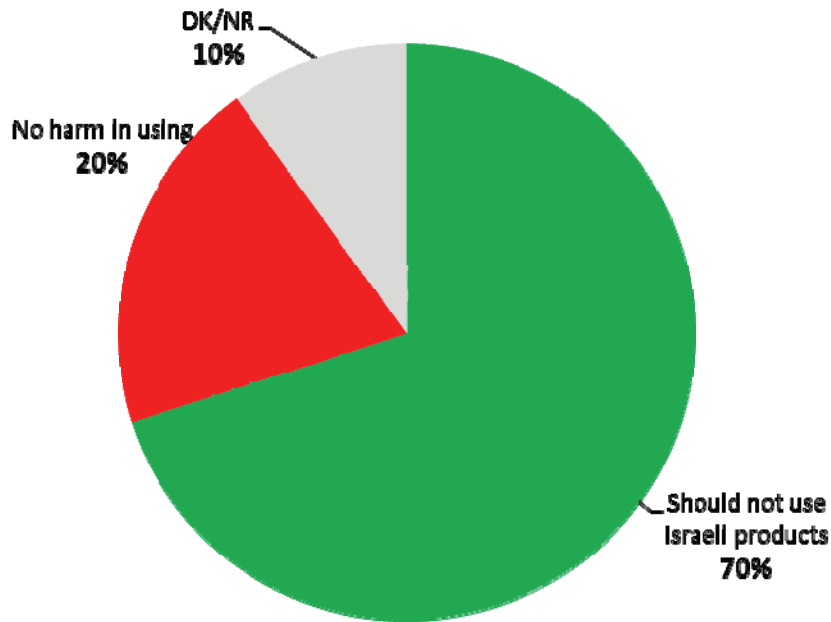

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people think that after Israel's attacks all the Muslims in the world should stop using products from Jewish companies, while others think there is nothing wrong with using products from Jewish companies. What is your opinion about this?" Responding to this question, 70% Pakistanis said that Muslims from the whole world should stop using products from Jewish companies, 20% said that there was no harm in using products from Jewish companies, while 10% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2655 men in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 21 – July 28, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

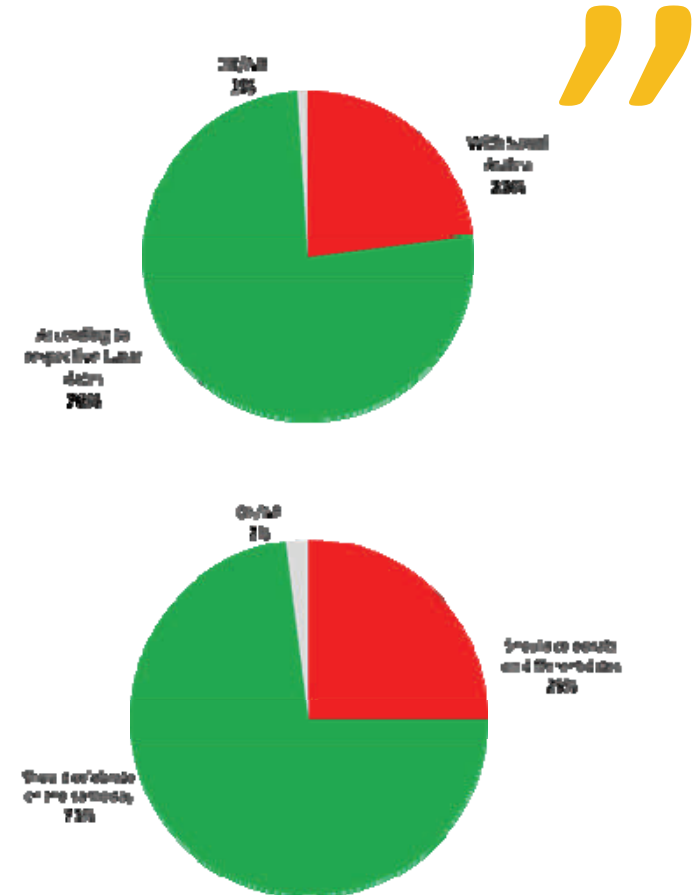

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 76% Pakistanis believe that Eid in individual countries should be celebrated according to their respective lunar dates.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people say that Eid should be celebrated along with Saudi Arabia, whereas others think each individual country should celebrate according to the moon sightings in their area. What is your opinion?” Responding to this question, 76% said Eid in individual countries should be celebrated according to their respective lunar dates, while 23% said Eid should be celebrated with Saudi Arabia and 1% did not respond.

Respondents were further asked, “For the past few years, Eid has been celebrated on different dates in Pakistan. In your opinion, should Eid be celebrated all over the country on the same day or not?” 73% respondents said Eid should be celebrated on the same day, while 25% said it should be celebrated on different days and 2% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2618 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 04 – August 11, 2014. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

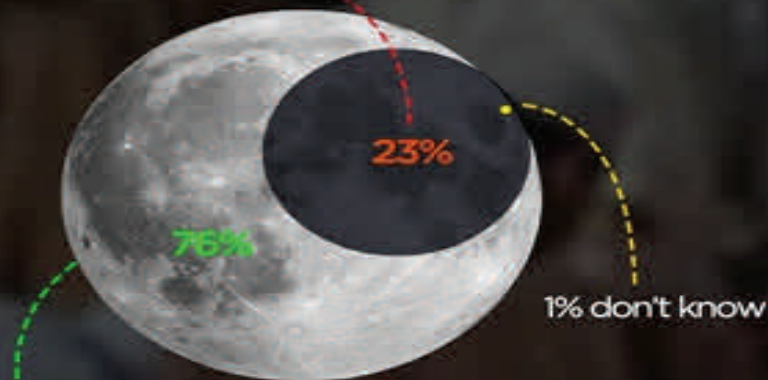

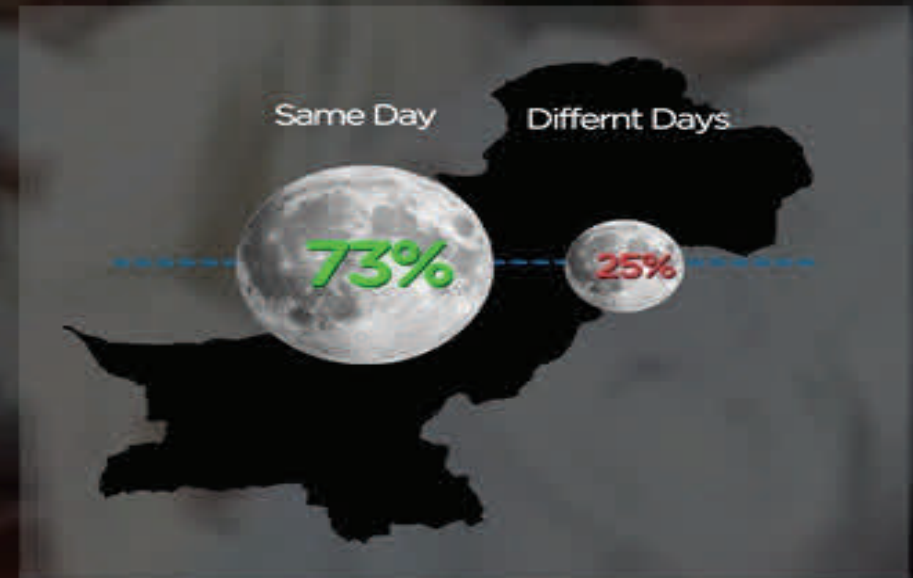

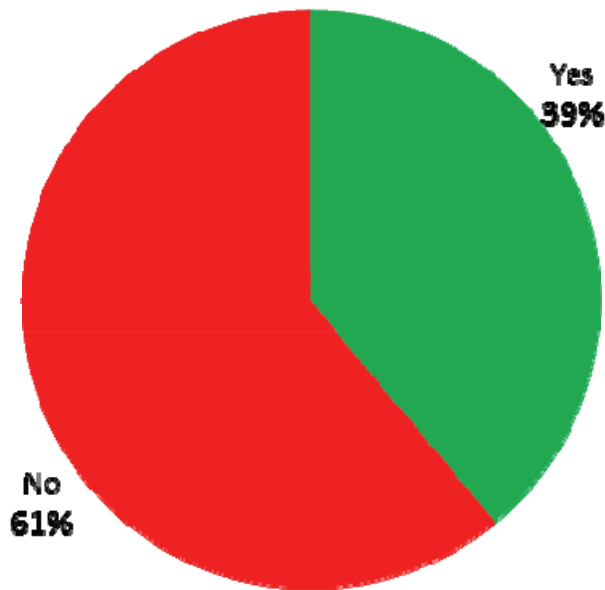

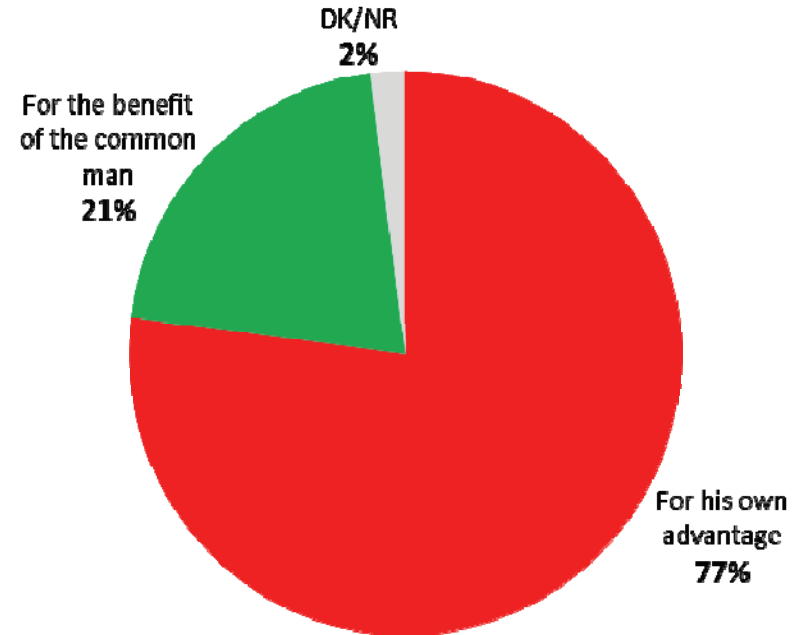

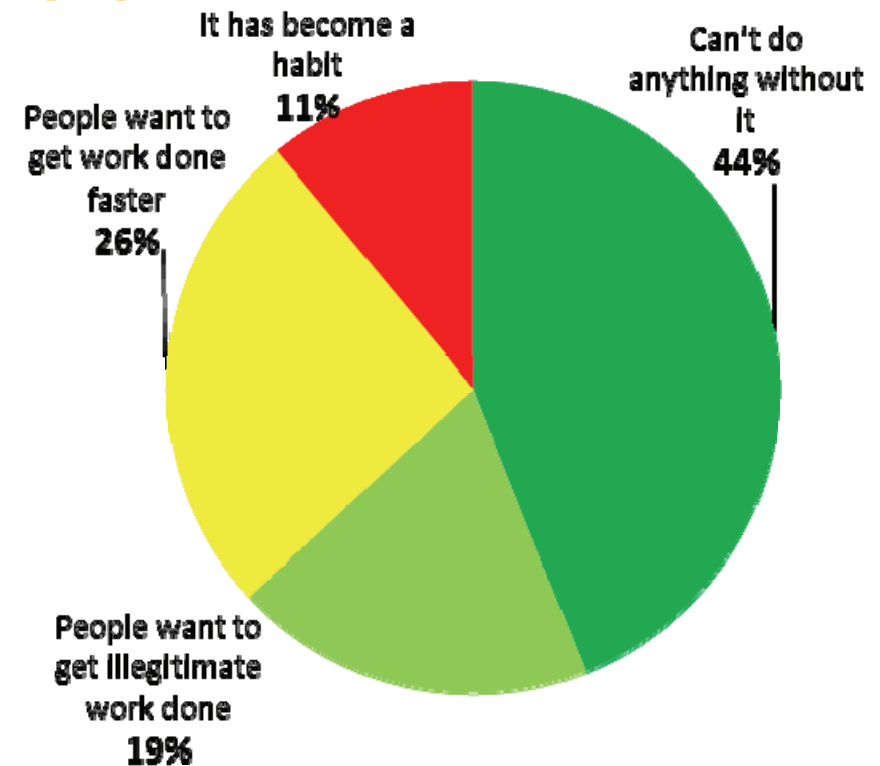

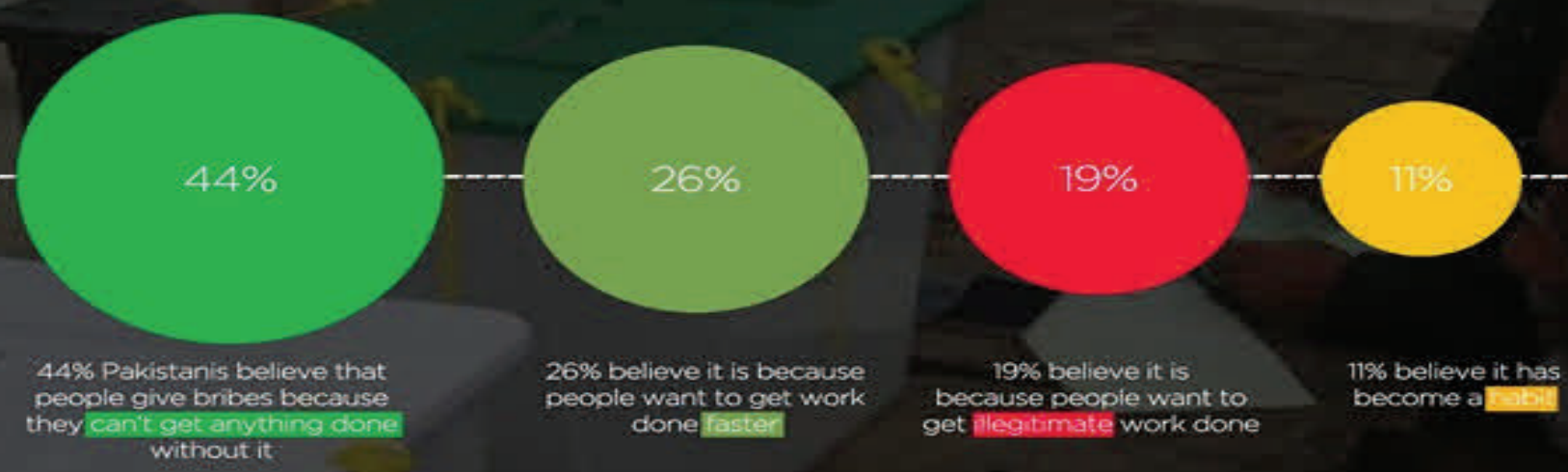
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “Why do you think people give bribes? I’ll read out a few reasons, please tell me which of these you consider most important.” Responding to this question, 44% Pakistanis believe that people give bribes because they can’t get anything done without it, 26% believe it is because people want to get work done faster, 19% believe it is because people want to get illegitimate work done and 11% believe it has become a habit.
