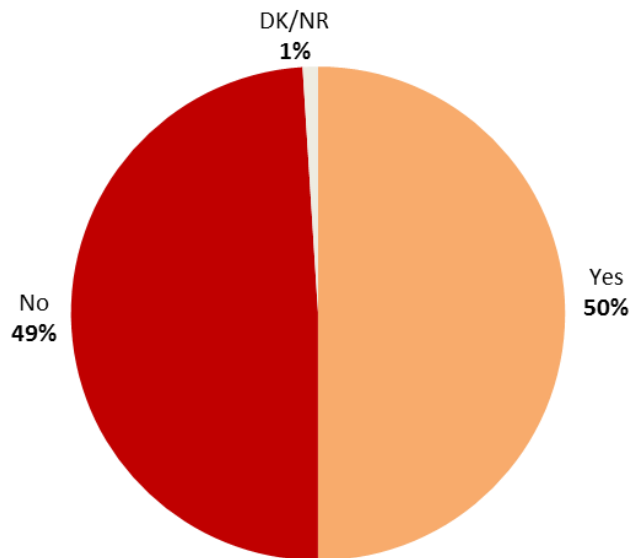

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (78%) Pakistanis believe exercise and walking are important for a person’s health.

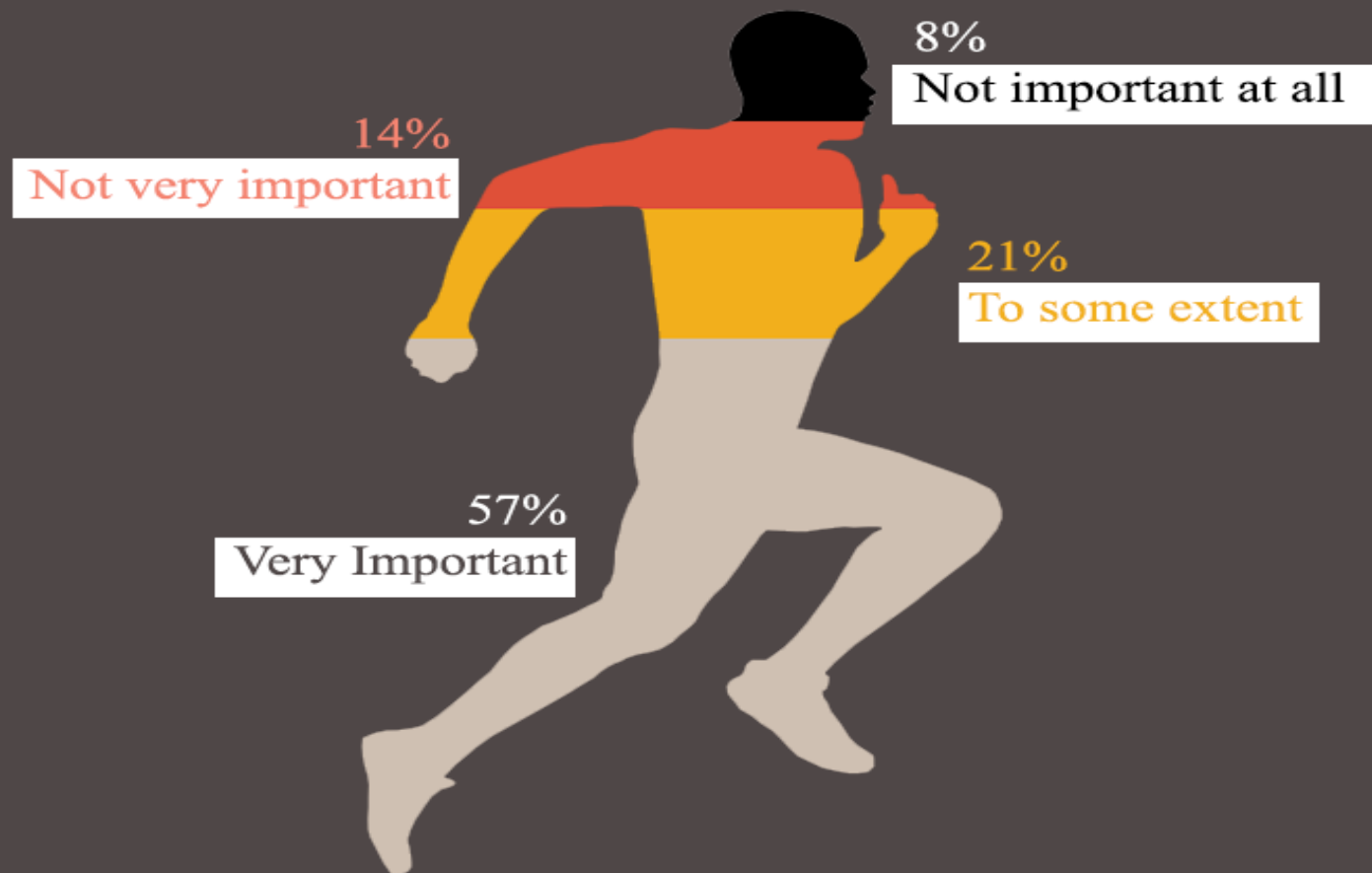
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell how important exercise and walking are for the health of a person?” In response to this question, 57% respondents said that walking and exercise are very important for the health of a person, 21% said that they were important to some extent, 14% said that they were not very important, while another 8 % said that they were not important at all.

The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1802 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 09 - May 16, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

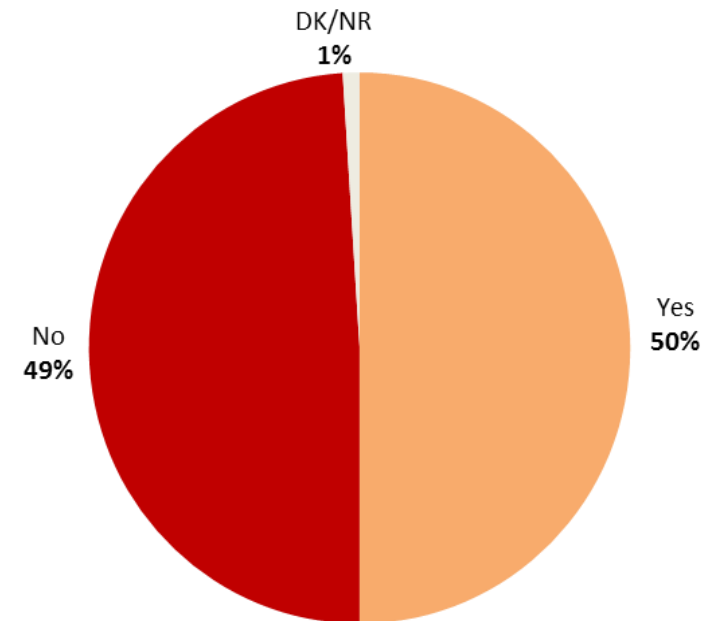

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 50% Pakistanis say that they take out time from their daily routine for exercise and walking.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell if you take out time from your daily routine for exercise and walking?” In response to this question, 50% said that they do take out time from their daily routine for exercise and walking, while 49% said that they do not do so. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1802 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 09 - May 16, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

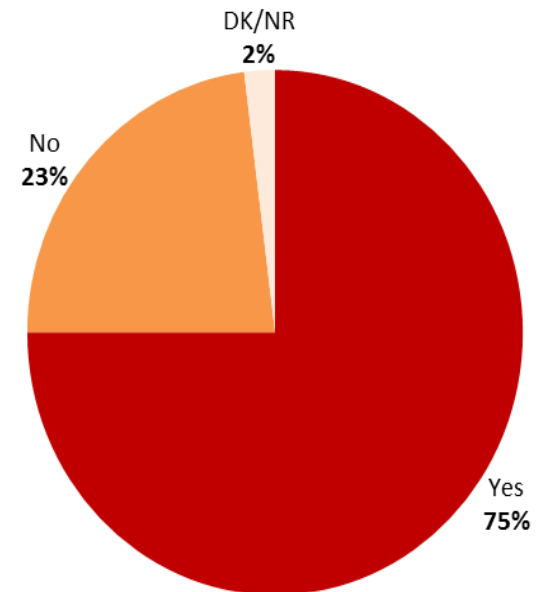

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people are of the opinion that celebrating Mother's Day is a ritual of the West and should not be celebrated by Muslims, while some say that this is not the case and it can be celebrated by everyone. What is your opinion regarding this: should Muslims celebrate Mother's Day?" In response to this question, 75% said that Muslims should celebrate Mother's Day, while 23% said that they should not celebrate it. 2% said that they did not know, or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1802 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 09 - May 16, 2016. 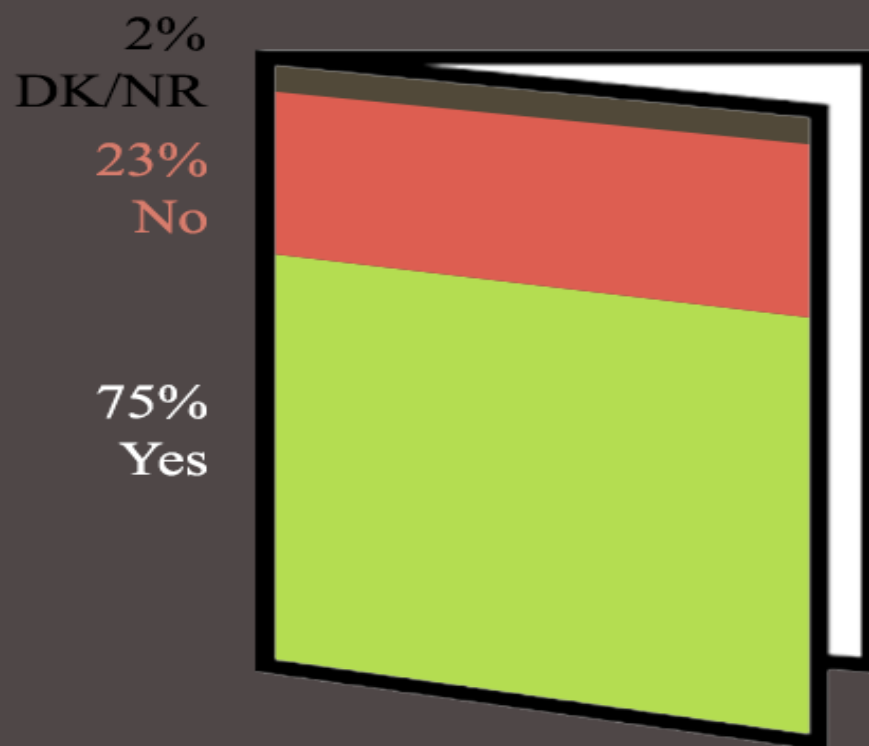

Over the past two years, there has been a decrease in the number of people who have heard or read about labor day.

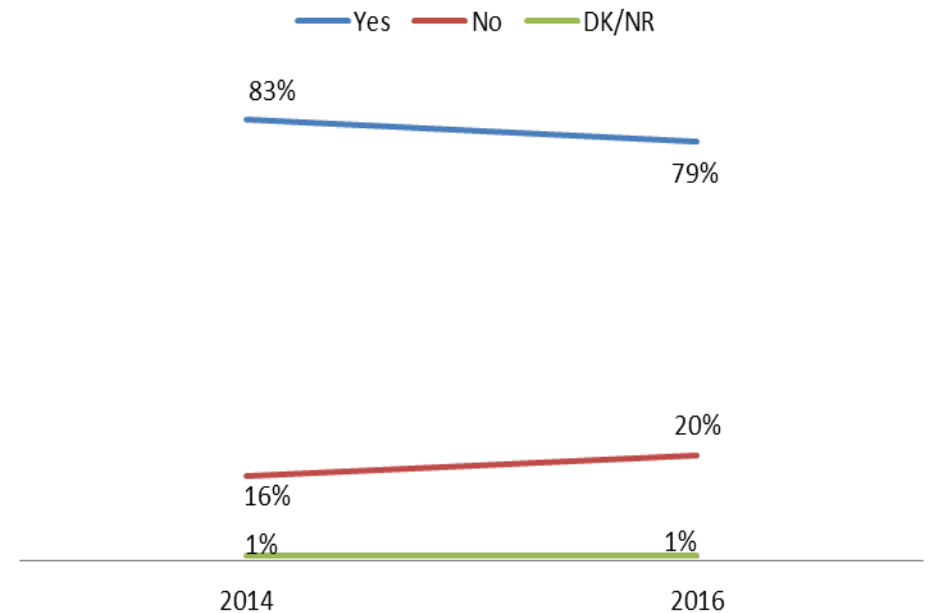
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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 79% Pakistanis know of labor day.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women, from across the four provinces was asked, “Labor Day is celebrated each year on the 1st of May. Have you heard or read about it?” In response to this question, 79% said that they had heard of labor day, or had read about it, while 20% said that they had not. 1% said that they did not know or did not wish to respond.

This question has also been asked during previous years. Over the past two years, there has been a decrease in the number of respondents who know about Labor Day. In 2014, 83% respondents said that they had heard or read about labor day, while 16% said that they did not know about it.

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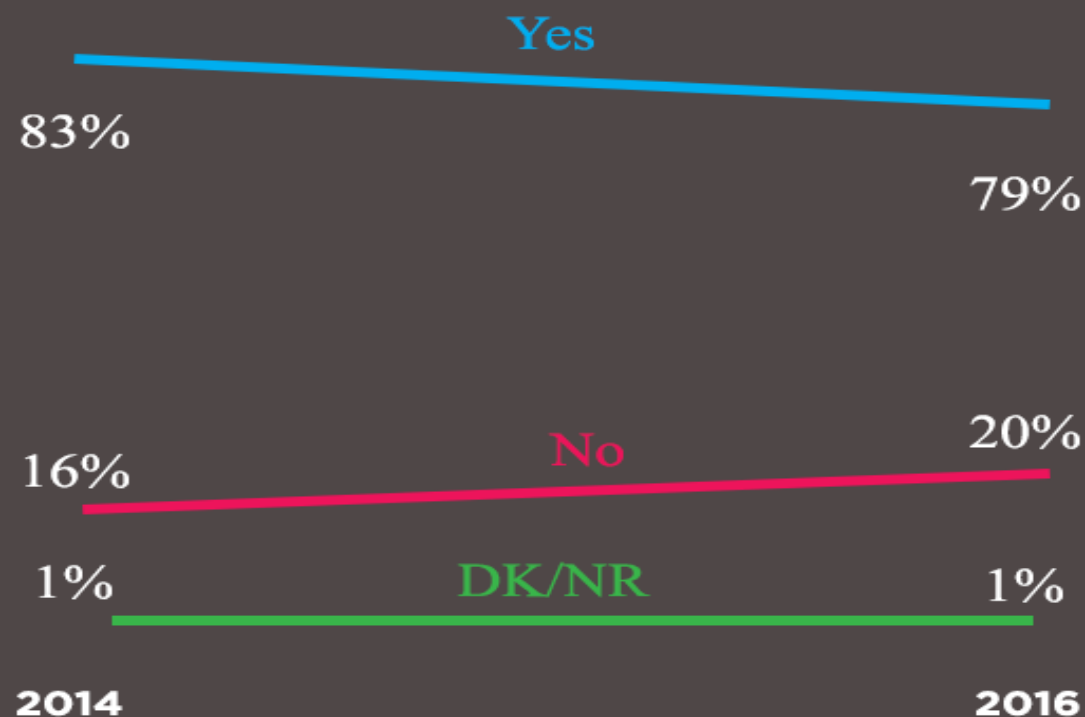

Labor Day is celebrated each year on the 1st of May. Have you heard or read about it?



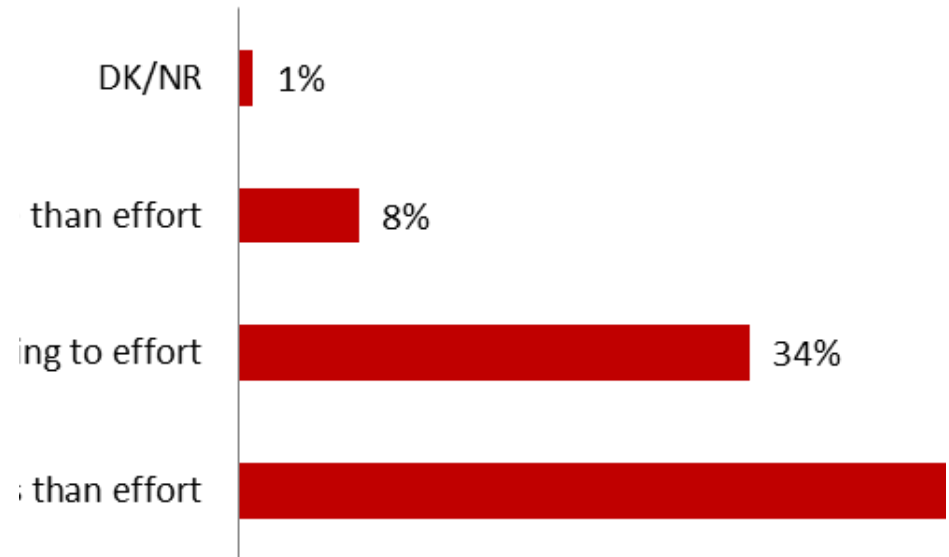

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis believe that laborers are receiving lesser wages for the amount of effort they put in.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people say unskilled laborers are receiving less for the effort they put in, but some say that they receive a wage in accordance with the effort they put in. Others say that they are given more than the effort they put in. What is your opinion?” In response to this question, 57% said that labor is paid less wage for the amount of effort they put in, while, 34% said that they believed labor was paid a wage in accordance with the effort they put in. Another 8% said that they believed labor was given a wage more than the effort they put in. 1% said that they did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1802 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 09 - May 16, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
