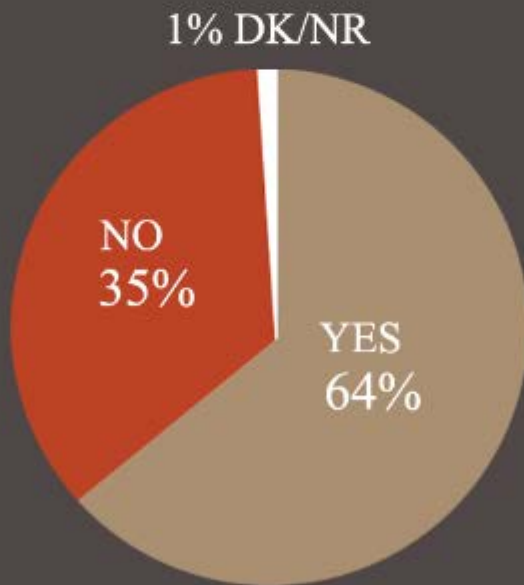

21% PAKISTANIS REGRET NOT GETTING ENOUGH EDUCATION AMONGST OTHER THINGS.

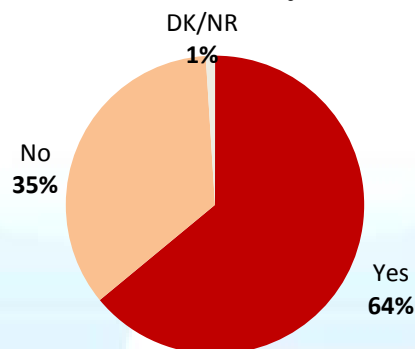
21% Pakistanis regret not getting enough education among other things. GILANI RESEARCH FOUNDATION (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, July 4, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 64% Pakistanis admit to regretting something in their life, and as many 21% regret not getting enough education.

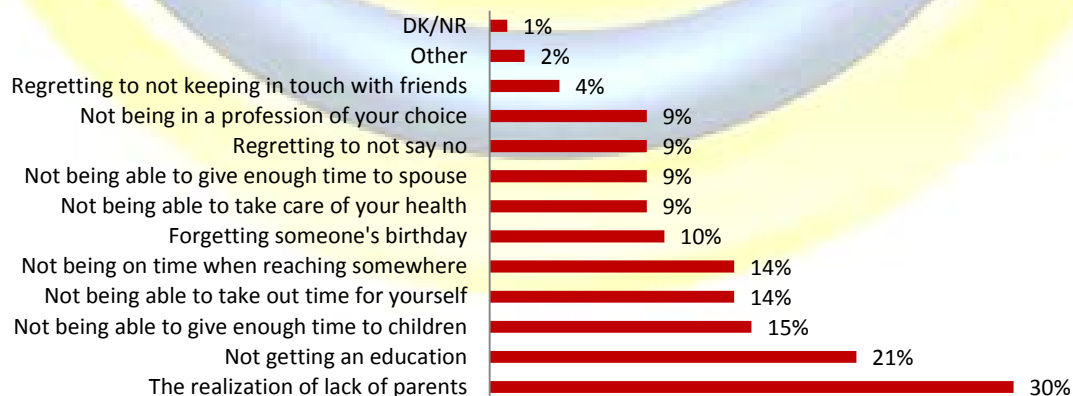
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Every person has had a regret in his/her life. Please tell if you have had any regrets, even for a minute in your life?” In response to this question, 64% said that yes, they do have a regret in life, while 35% said that they do not have any regrets in life. 1% did not respond.

Question: “Every person has had a regret in his/her life. Please tell if you have had any regrets, even for a minute in your life?”



Respondents who replied yes were further asked, “Please tell us what you regretted in your life? (Multiple response allowed)” In response to this question, 30% said that they suffered regret at the realization that their parents were no more, 15% said that regretted not giving enough time to their children, 9% regretted not being able to take care of their health, another 9% said they regretted not being able to give enough time to their spouse, 14% regretted not being able to take time out for themselves, 10% regretted forgetting someone’s birthday, 14% regretted not being able to reach somewhere on time, 9% regretted not saying no at some point in their lives, 21% regretted not getting an education, 9% regretted not being in a profession of their choice. 4% regretted not keeping in touch with their friends, 2% replied other, and 1% said that they did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1802 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 09 - May 16, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
