60 % of Pakistanis Oppose Sindh Governments' Decision of Removing Uniform Dress Code from Educational Institutes: GILANI POLL /GALLUP PAKISTAN

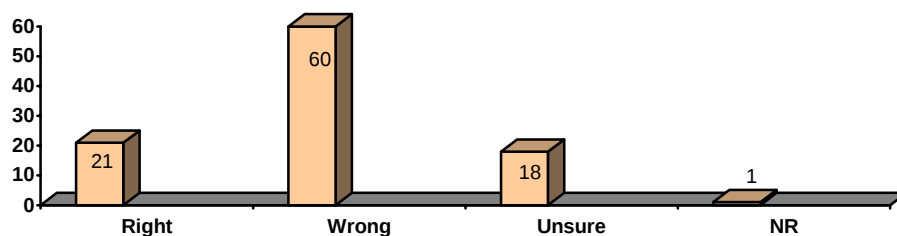

According to a Gilani Research Foundation survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority of all Pakistanis (60%) are in the favor of having a compulsion of wearing uniform in educational institutes and hence they think that Sindh governments' recent decision of removing this rule is incorrect; 21% believe the decision is right whereas 18% are unsure and 1% gave no response. The results in both rural and urban Sindh are almost identical and fairly close to the national average.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the country were asked “*Recently Sindh government has removed the compulsion of wearing uniform in schools and colleges. Do you think it is right or wrong?*” Twenty one percent (21%) support the recent decision of the Sindh government whereas 60% believe it is a wrong decision. The remaining 18% of the respondents were not sure whether uniform should be made compulsory in educational institutes or not and 1% gave no response.

The findings of the survey reveal, that the support for removal of uniform in Sindh is 24%, opposition stands at 58% and 18% said they did not know. There was no statistical difference in the rural and urban Sindh opinion on this issue.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The latest survey was carried out among a sample of 2780 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during December 2009. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
