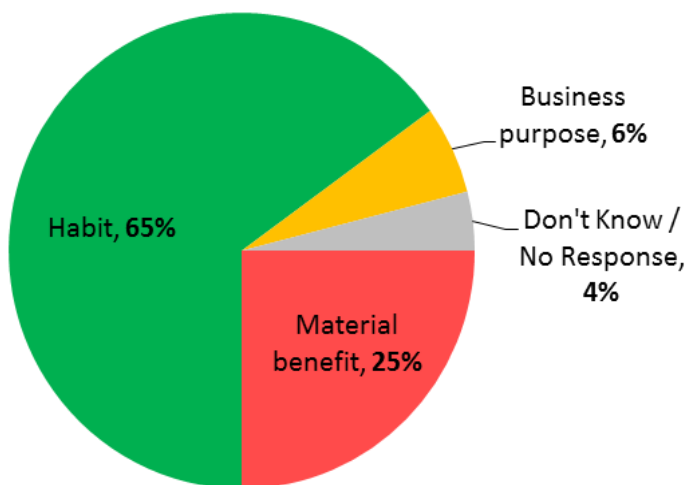

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 25% of those who keep a Pet say their motivation is material benefit. But 65% claim it is for fun and love of them.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces, who own a pet, was asked “Why do you have a pet in your house?” Responding to this, 25% claim they have a pet because of material benefits, 65% claim to own a pet because of their habit whereas 6% claim to own pets for business purposes. However, 4% did not give a view.

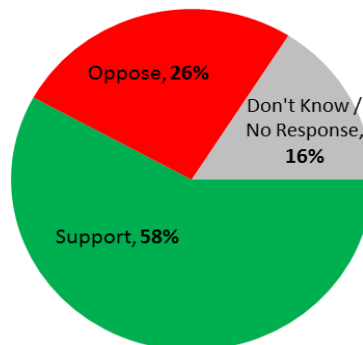

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 58% want fresh elections; 26% are opposed; 16% undecided.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked "Some people think that after the removal of Prime Minister (Gilani), new elections should be conducted whereas some people think that it should not. Do you support or oppose early elections?" Responding to this, 58% support early elections whereas 26% oppose it. However, 16% did not give a view.

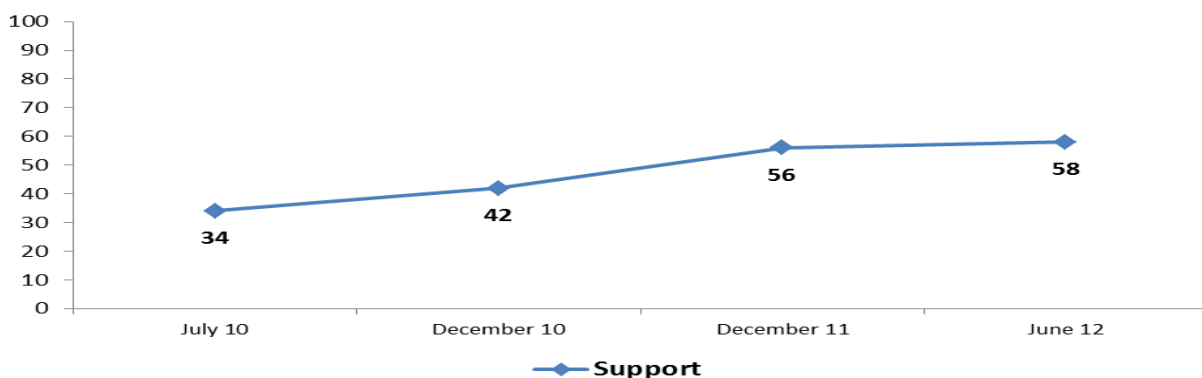
Question: "Some people think that after the removal of Prime Minister (Gilani), new elections should be conducted whereas some people think that it should not. Do you support or oppose early elections?"

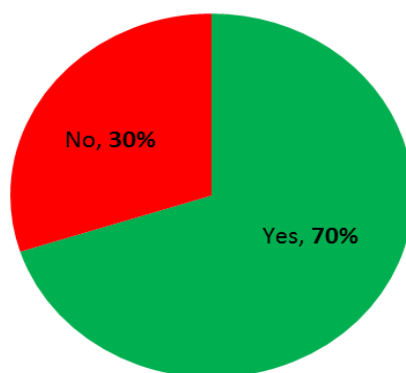

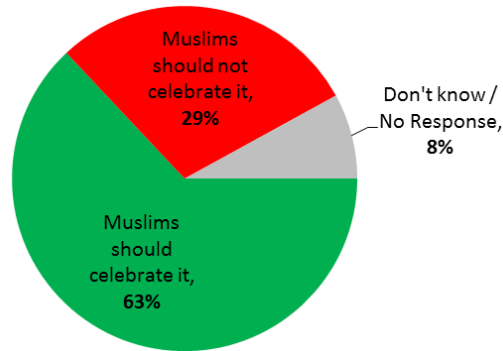

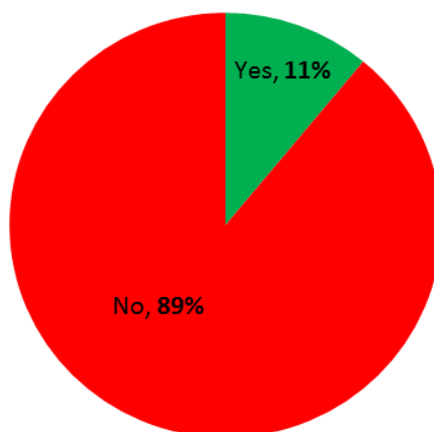

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Do you go to cinema to watch movies?” Responding to this, 11% claim that they go to cinema to watch movies whereas 89% claim that they do not go to cinema at all.

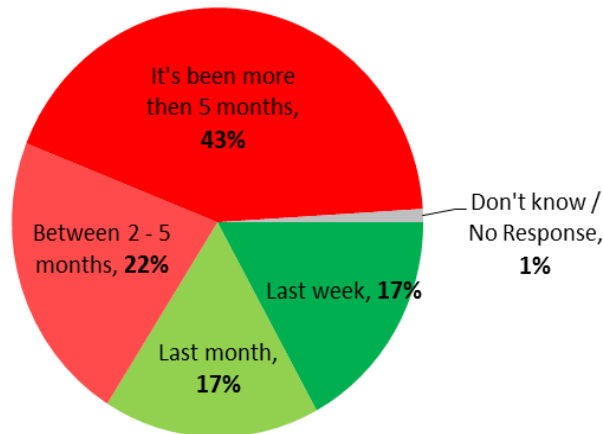

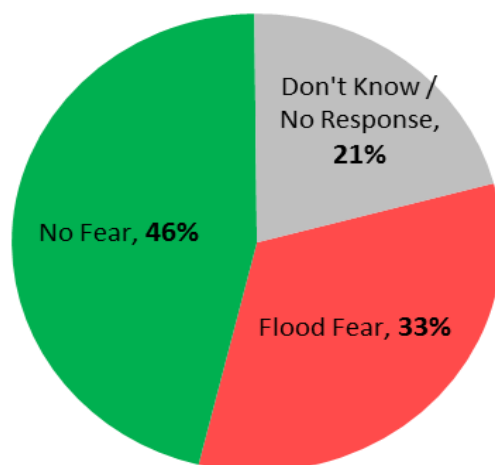

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 33% fear floods due to monsoon rains; 46% disagree. Fears are much lower than a year ago.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Some people think that there’s a threat of flood in this year’s monsoon like the monsoon of 2011 whereas some people think that there is no threat. What do you think?” Responding to this, 33% believe that there is a threat of flood whereas 46% believe there is no fear. However, 21% did not give a view.

Question: “Some people think that there’s a threat of flood in this year’s monsoon like the monsoon of 2011 whereas some people think that there is no threat. What do you think?”

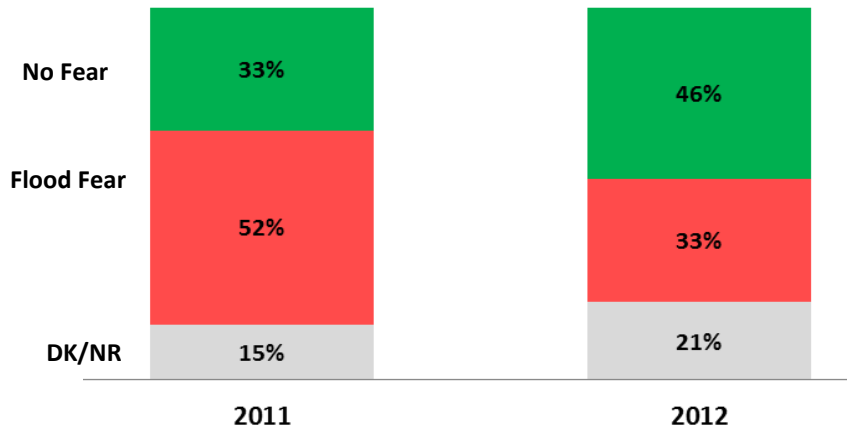
