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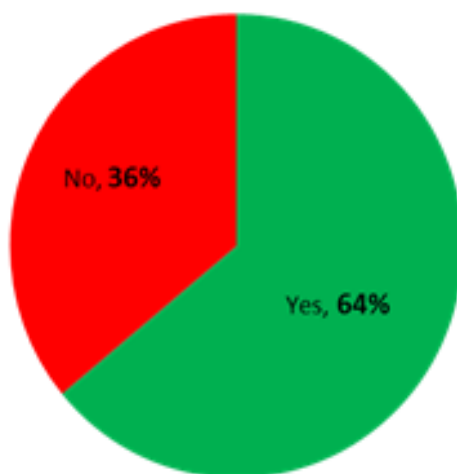
Islamabad November 26, 2012

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 64% of Pakistanis believe women should be involved in Land and Property related affairs; however 49% say women are routinely involved in such affairs in their households or relatives households.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, should women be involved in Land and Property related affairs?” Responding to this, 64% said yes and 36% said no. Respondents were then asked “Are women in your household or relatives households involved in Land and Property affairs (transactions, transfers, hereditary land distribution etc.)?” Responding to this, 51% said no and 49% said yes.

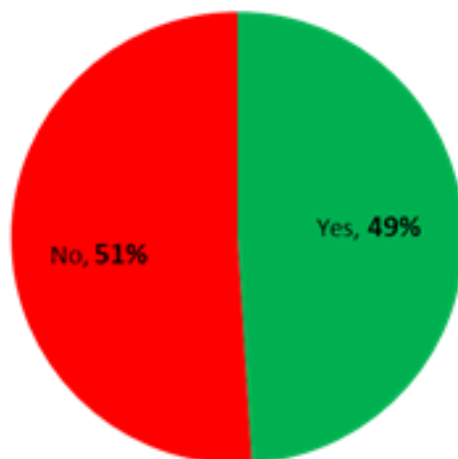
Question: “In your opinion, should women be involved in Land and Property related affairs?”

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2673 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during October 28, 2012 – November 02, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

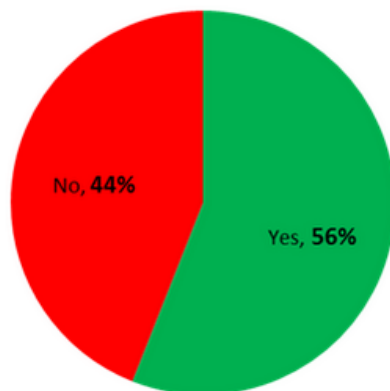

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, do women in your household or relatives households get their claims on inheritance as prescribed in Islam?” Responding to this, 56% said yes and 44% said no.

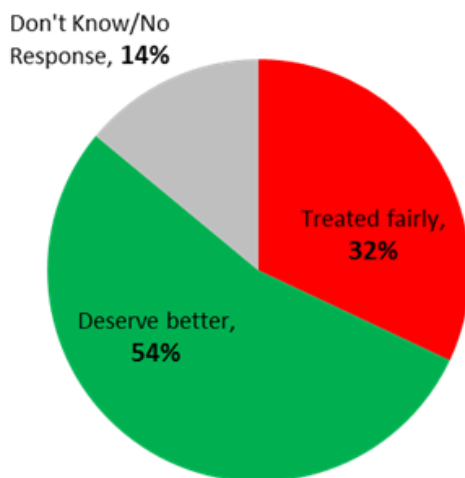
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 54% of Pakistanis think they deserve better treatment in life.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Do you think you are treated fairly in life or do you deserve better?” Responding to this, 54% believe they deserve to be treated better and 32% believe they are treated fairly. However, 14% did not give a response.

The same question was also asked in 2009 when the results were largely similar; 59% said they deserve to be treated better and 27% said they are treated fairly and 14% did not give a response.

Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

48% of Pakistanis have nightmares sometimes. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

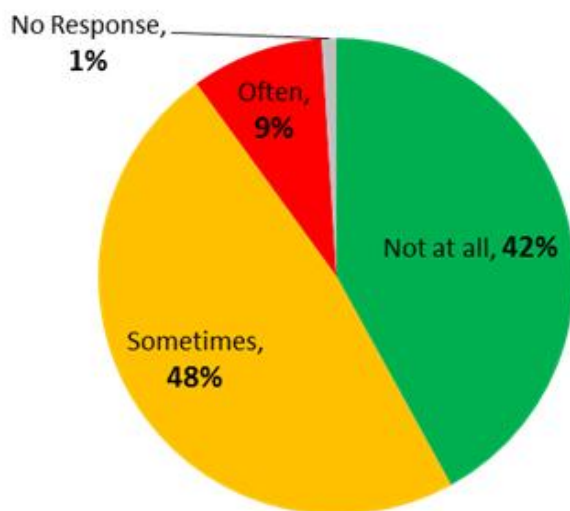

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 48% of Pakistanis have nightmares sometimes.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “How often do you have nightmares?” Responding to this, 48% said ‘sometimes’, 42% said ‘not at all’ and 9% said often. However, 1% did not give a response.

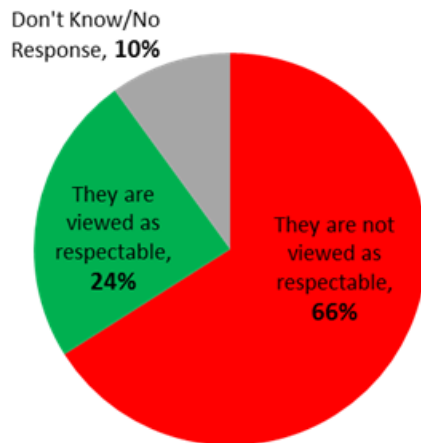

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 66% of Pakistanis believe eunuchs are not viewed as respectable in Pakistani society.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Some people are of the opinion that eunuchs are not viewed as respectable in our society, while some think that is not the case. What is your opinion on this?” Responding to this, 66% said they are not viewed as respectable and 24% said they are viewed as respectable. However, 10% did not give a view.
