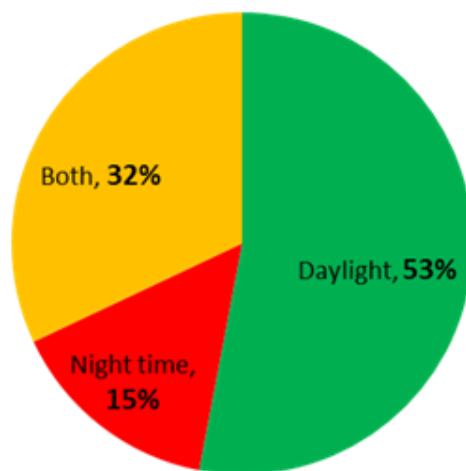

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 53% of Pakistanis prefer daylight over nighttime.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Some people prefer daylight, some people prefer the nighttime and some people prefer both. Which do you prefer more?” Responding to this, 53% said they prefer ‘daylight’, 32% said they prefer ‘both’ and 15% said they prefer ‘nighttime’.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2589 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during November 05, 2012 – November 11, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

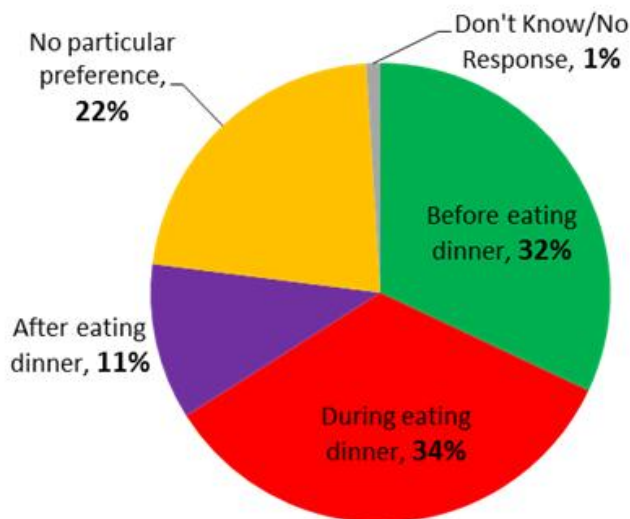

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority of people drink water during eating dinner (34%) or before eating dinner (32%).

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “While eating dinner, when do you usually have water?” Responding to this, 34% said they have water during dinner, 32% said they have water before dinner, 22% said they have no particular preference and 11% said they have water after dinner. However, 1% did not give a response.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2679 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during November 11, 2012 – November 17, 2012. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

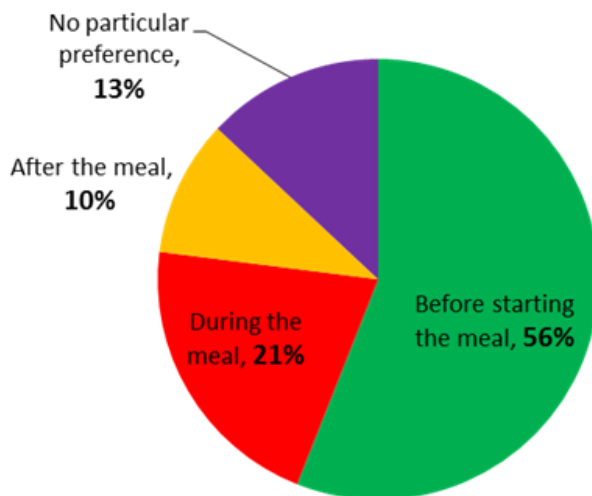

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority of Pakistanis (56%) think water should be drunk before starting a meal.



A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “In your opinion, should water be drunk before starting a meal, after the meal or in between the meal?” Responding to this, 56% said before starting the meal, 21% said during the meal, 13% gave no particular preference, and 10% said after the meal.

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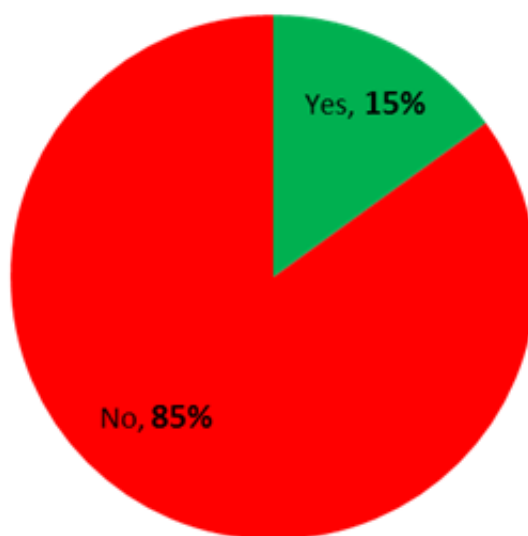
85% of Pakistanis have never been to a library. GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 85% of Pakistanis have never been to a library.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “Have you ever been to a library?” Responding to this, 85% said no and 15% said yes. Those who said ‘yes’, were then asked “Why did you go to the library?” Responding to this, 40% said they went to study, 25% said they went for personal interest, 22% said they went to find information on something, 11% said they went to read the newspaper and 1% did not give a response.

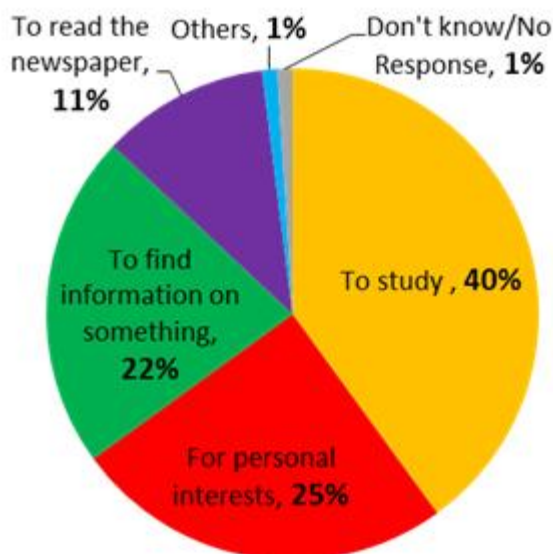
Question: “Have you ever been to a library?”

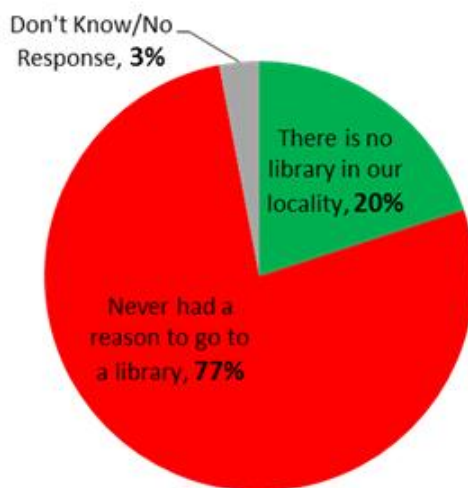

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (77%) said they have never been to a library because they **never had a reason to**.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked “What is the reason for you not going to a library?” (This question was preceded by another question asking respondents whether they have ever been to a library) Responding to this, from those who said they have never been to a library, 77% said they never had a reason to go to a library and 20% said they do not have a library in their locality. However, 3% did not give a response.
