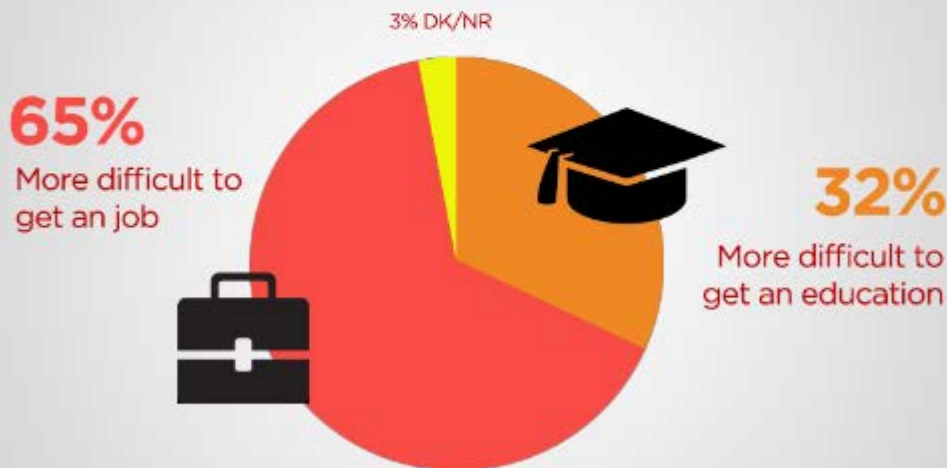

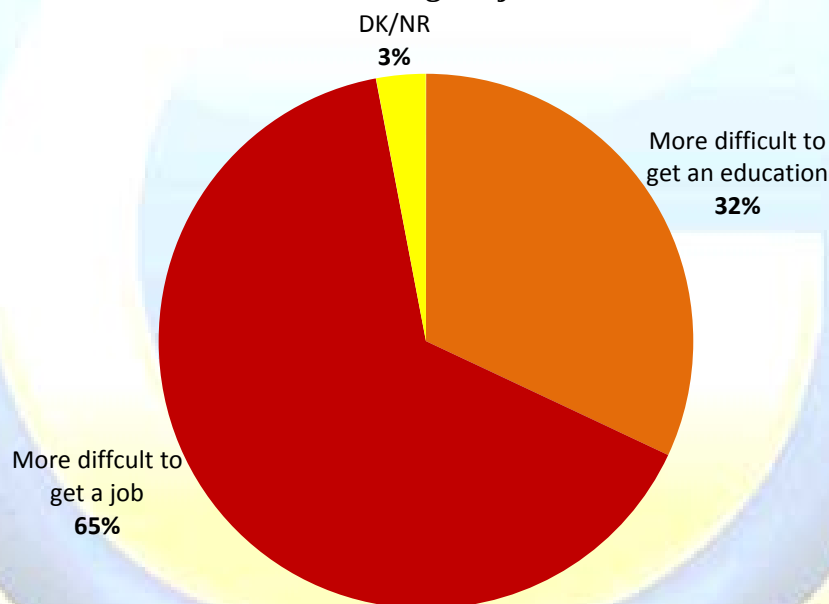
Majority Pakistanis (65%) believe that it is more difficult to get a job than to get an education. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 65% Pakistanis think that it is more difficult for them to get a job than get an education.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "According to you, in today's world is it more difficult to get an education or more difficult to get a job?" In response to this question, 65% respondents said that they thought it was more difficult for them to get a job, while 32% said that it was more difficult to get an education. 3% said that they did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1842 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 23 – May 30, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
