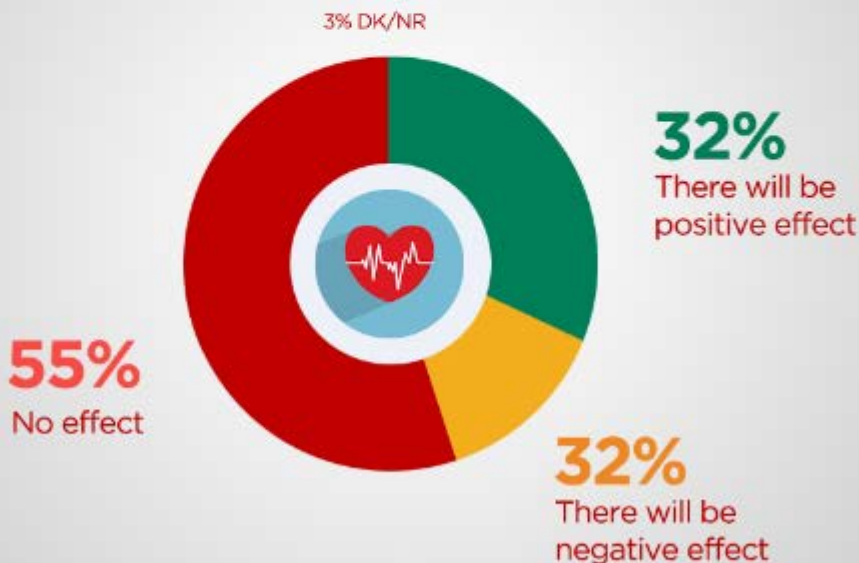

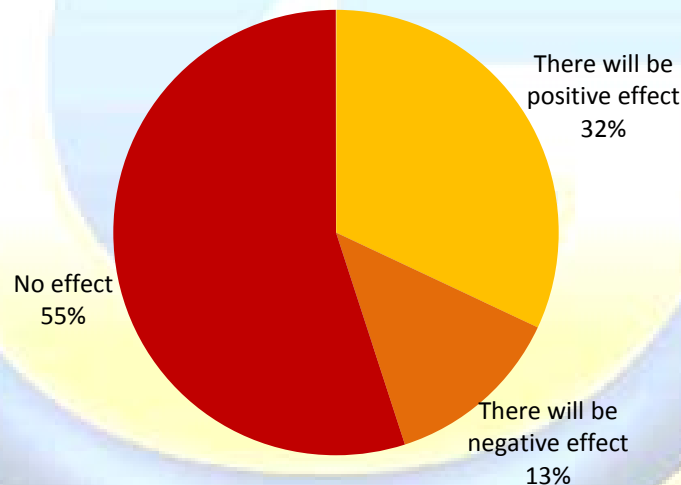
55 % Pakistanis think that the Prime Minister's health will have no effect on the politics and affairs of the country. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, August 15, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority Pakistanis (55%) think that the Prime Minister's health will have no effect on the politics and affairs of the country.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people believe that the Prime Minister's health will have a negative effect on the politics and affairs of the country, others think there will be no effect. Please indicate your opinion." In response to this question, 55% Pakistanis think that the Prime Minister's health will have no effect on the politics and affairs of the country, 32% think that the Prime Minister's health will have positive effect on the politics and affairs of the country, while 13% think that it will have a negative effect on it.

Question: "Some people believe that the Prime Minister's health will have a negative effect on the politics and affairs of the country, others think there will be no effect. Please indicate your opinion."

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1252 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 06 – June 13, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
