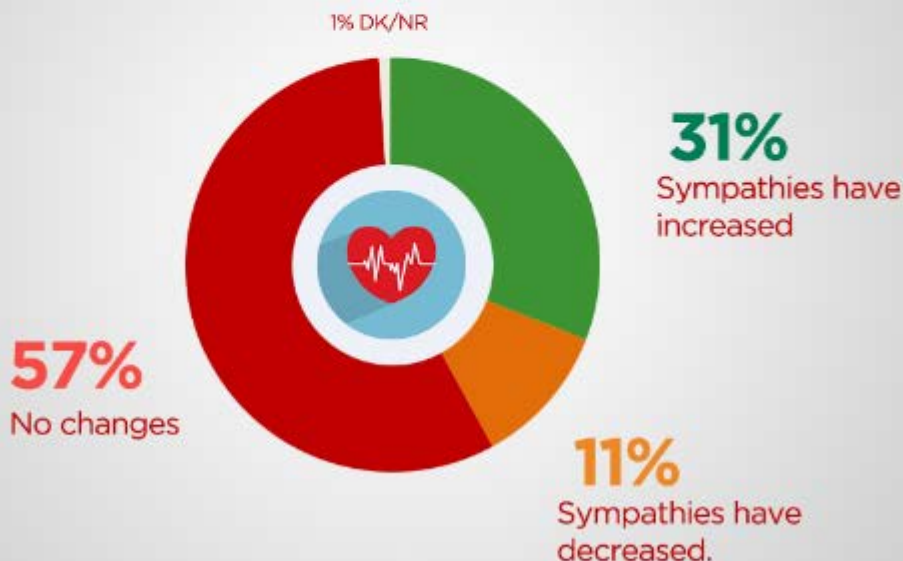

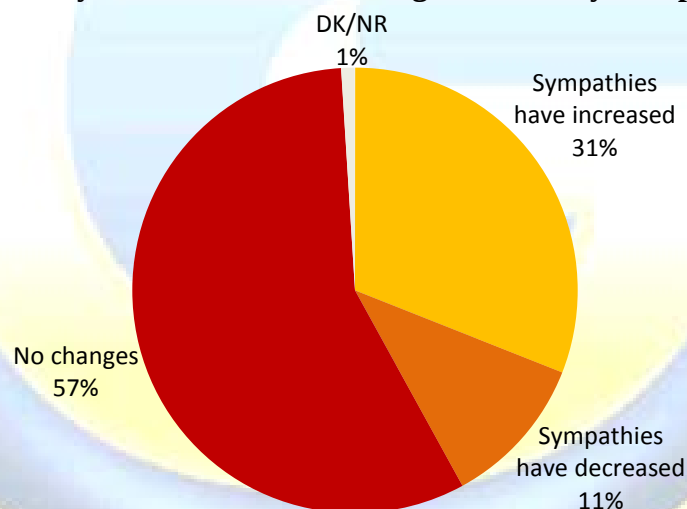
57 % Pakistanis think that there has been no change in sympathies for PML-N after the Prime Minister's operation. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, August 16, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority Pakistanis (57%) think that there has been no change in sympathies for PMLN after the Prime Minister's operation.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people are of the opinion that sympathies for PMLN have increased after the Prime Minister's operation, others are of the opinion that they have decreased, and some are of the opinion that they have remained unchanged. What is your opinion on this?" In response to this question, 57% respondents think that there has been no change in sympathies for PMLN after the Prime Minister's operation, 31% said that sympathies have increased, and 11% said that sympathies have decreased. 1% did not know, or did not wish to respond.

Question: "Some people are of the opinion that sympathies for PMLN have increased after the Prime Minister's operation, others are of the opinion that they have decreased, and some are of the opinion that they have remained unchanged. What is your opinion on this?"

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1252 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 06 – June 13, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
