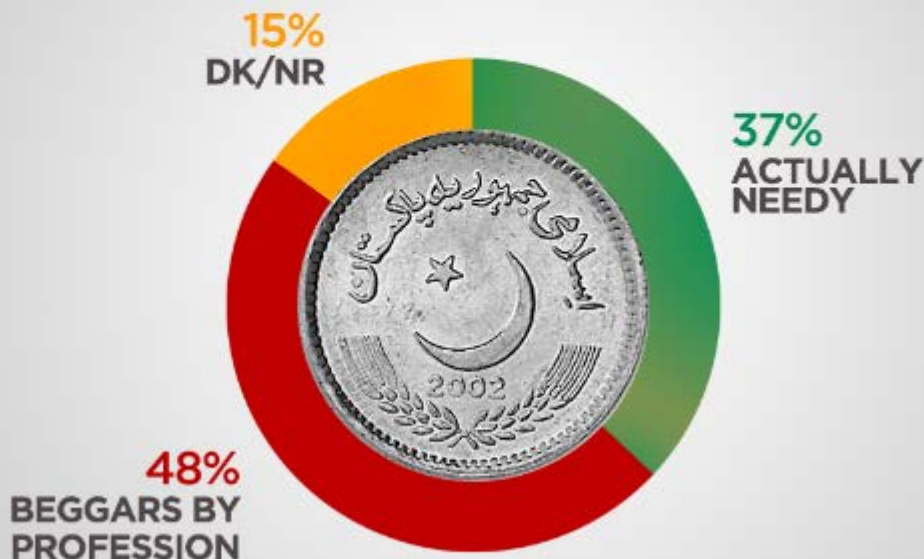


48% THINK THAT STREET BEGGARS ARE BEGGARS BY PROFESSION AND NOT ACTUALLY NEEDY PEOPLE.

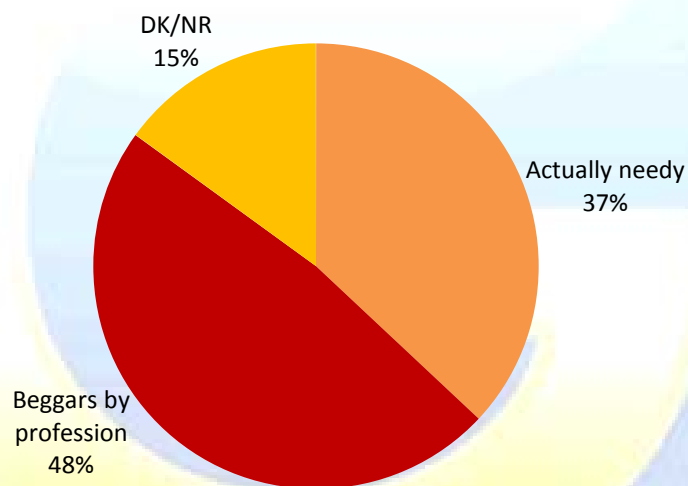
48% think that street beggars are beggars by profession and not actually needy people. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 48% think that street beggars are beggars by profession and not actually needy people.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “It has often been seen that the number of beggars during Ramzan increases. Do you think these people are actually needy or beggars by profession?” In response to this question, 48% said that they are beggars by profession and 37% thought that they were actually needy. 15% said they did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1813 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 13 – June 20, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
