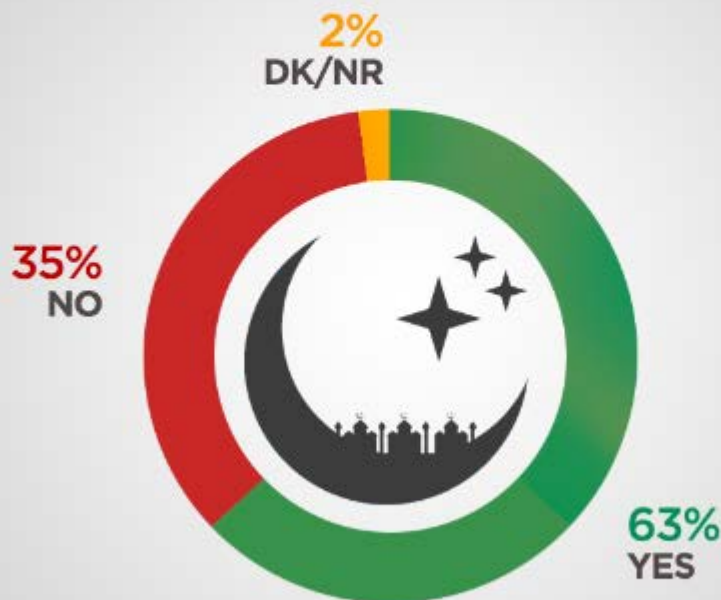


63% PAKISTANIS SAY THAT THEY OFFER TARAWIH DURING RAMADAN.

63% Pakistanis say that they offer Tarawih during Ramadan. (GRF POLL)

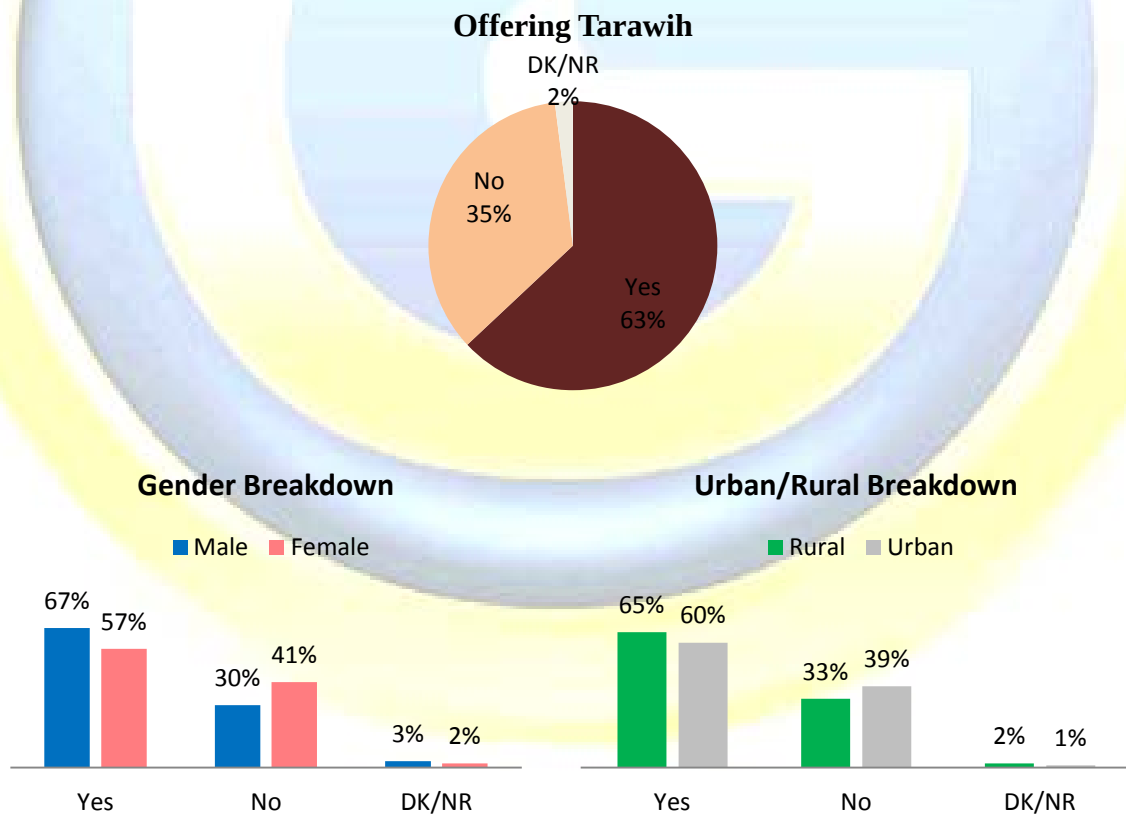

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 63% Pakistanis say that they offer Tarawih during Ramadan.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Kindly tell which of the following activities do you do during Ramzan and which of these do you avoid: Offering Tarawih?” In response to this question, 63% said that yes, they did offer Tarawih in Ramadan, while 35% said no, they did not. 2% did not know or did not wish to respond.

According to a gender breakdown, men seem to offer Tarawih more frequently than women, 67% men and 57% women said that they did offer Tarawih. According to an urban/rural breakdown, 5% more rural dwellers claim to Tarawih in Ramzan. 65% rural and 60% urban dwellers say their Tarawih.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1813 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 13 – June 20, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
