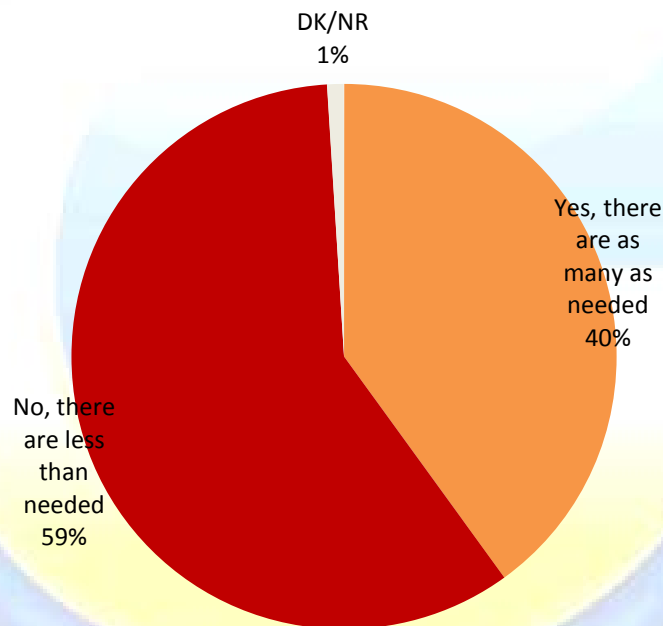
40 % Pakistanis believe that there are as many parks as needed in their city. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, August 22, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 59% Pakistanis believe that there are fewer parks than needed in their city.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “In your opinion, are there enough parks in your city as needed?” In response to this question, 59% said that no, there are less parks than needed, while 40% said that there were as many parks as needed. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1813 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 13 – June 20, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
