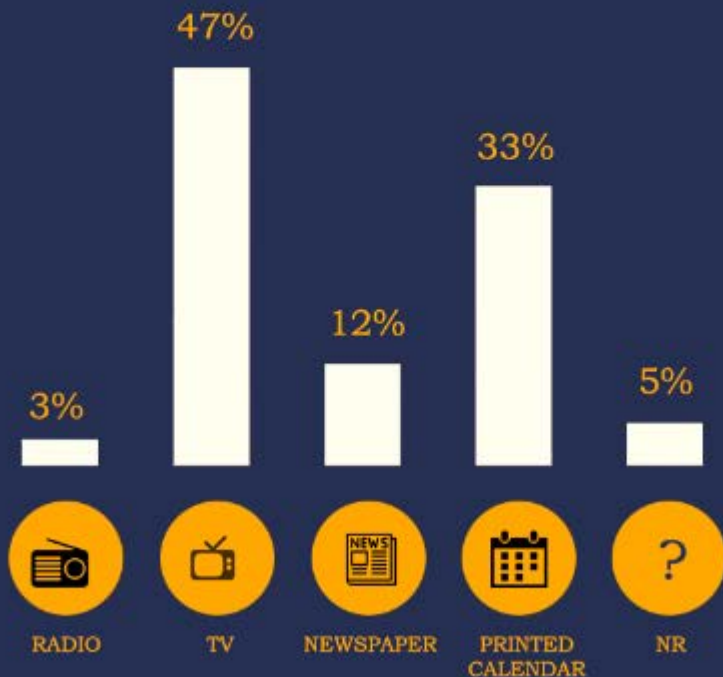

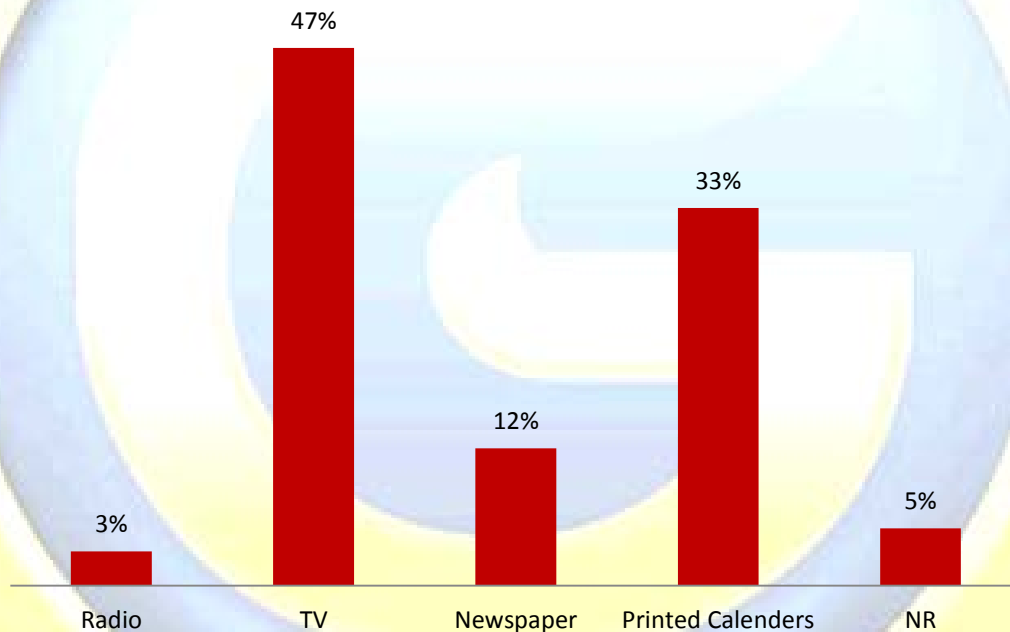
47 % Pakistanis claim that they find out about *Iftar* and *Sehri* timings from the television. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, September 1, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 47% Pakistanis claim that they find out about Iftar and Sehri timings from the television.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Where do you find out about Iftar or Sehri timings usually? (Give one answer)” In response to this question, 47% said they found out about them from the television, 33% said they found out from printed calendars, 12% said they found out from the newspaper, and 3% said they found out from the radio. 5% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1788 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 27 – July 04, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
