



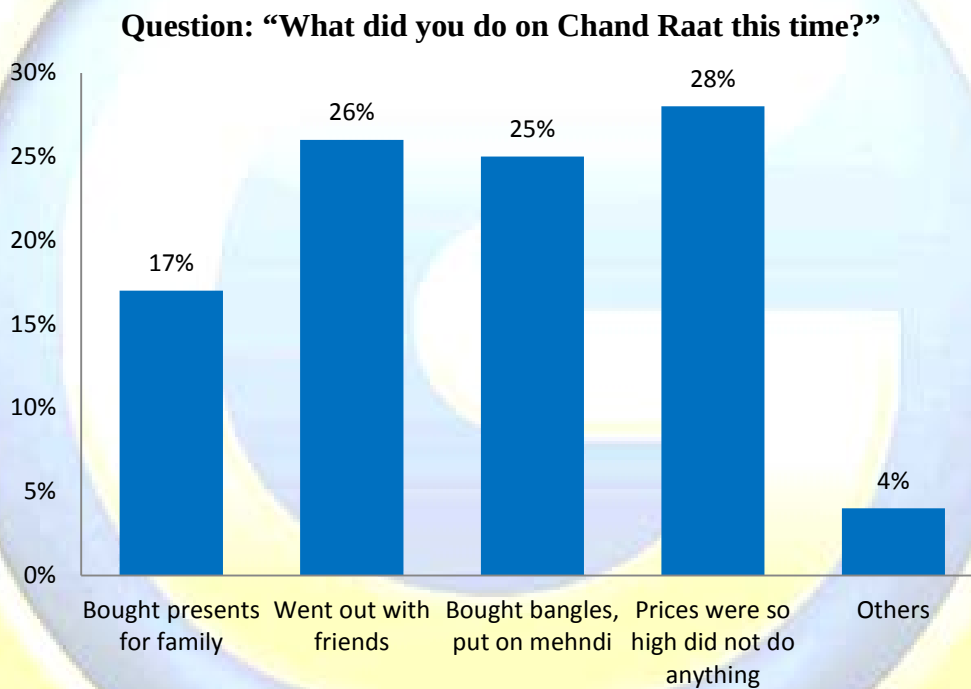

28% Pakistanis say that they did not do anything on Chand Raat because prices were too high. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 28% Pakistanis say that they did not do anything on Chand Raat because prices were too high.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "What did you do on Chand Raat this time?" In response to this question, 17% said that they bought presents for their family, 26% said they went out with friends, 25% said they bought bangles, put on mehndi, and 28% said that they did not do anything because prices were so high. 4% said they did something other than this.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1816 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 11 – July 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
