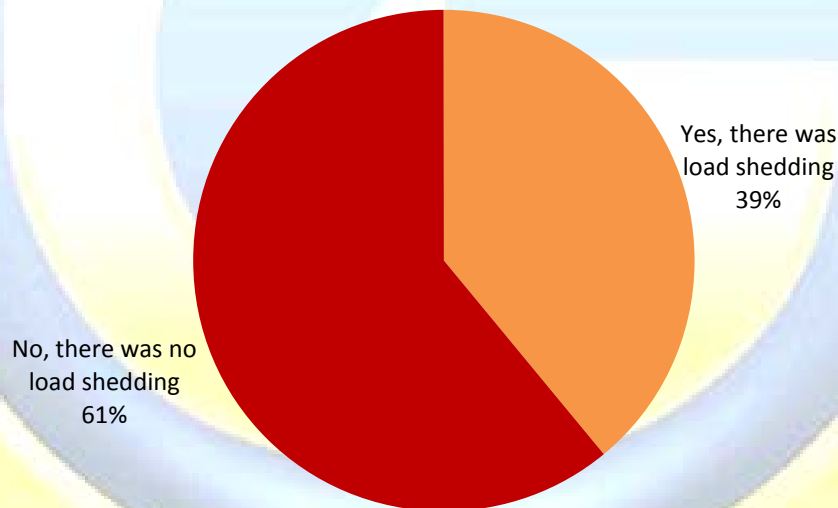
As many as 39 % Pakistanis say that there was load shedding in their area on the first day of Eid. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, September 08, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, as many as 39% Pakistanis say that there was load shedding in their area on the first day of Eid.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people say that on the first day of Eid there was load shedding in their locality, while some people say that on the first day of Eid there was no load shedding in their locality. Please tell if there was load shedding in your area on the first day of Eid?” In response to this question, 61% said that there was no load shedding in their locality on the first day of Eid, while 39% said that there was load shedding on the first day of Eid. It should be noted that the government had notified that there would be no load shedding across the country during Eid-ul-Fitr of 2016.

Question: “Some people say that on the first day of Eid there was load shedding in their locality, while some people say that on the first day of Eid there was no load shedding in their locality. Please tell if there was load shedding in your area on the first day of Eid?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1867 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 18 – July 25, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
