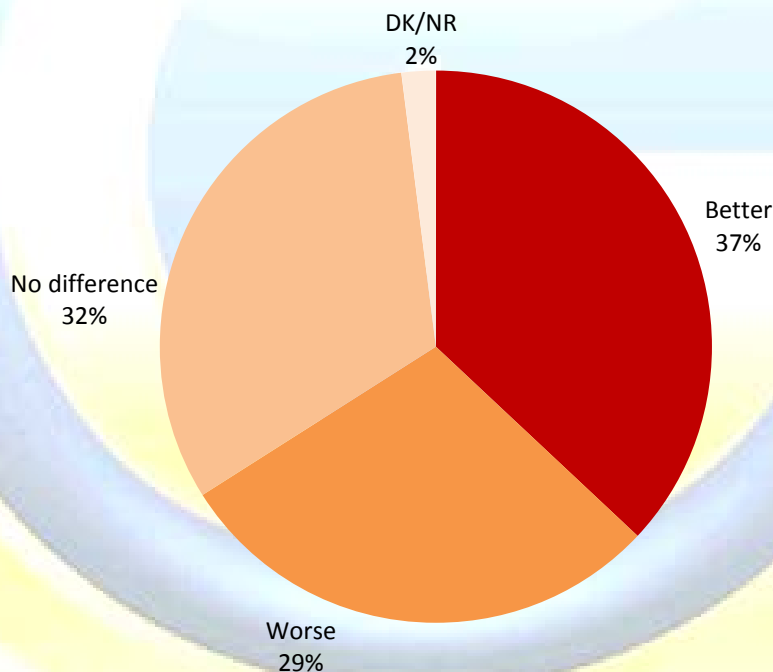
Significant majority (61 %) of Pakistanis believe that the current PML-N government's performance is no different (32 %) or worse (29 %) from previous government of PPP. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, Significant majority (61%) of Pakistanis believe that the current PML-N government's performance is no different (32%) or worse (29%) from previous government of PPP.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Some people think PML-N's performance until now has been better than the past government, whereas some people think that it is worse. What do you think about this?" In response to this question, 37% said that it is better than the last government, 29% said that it is worse, while 32% said that there is no difference between the two governments. 2% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1878 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 20 – June 27, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
