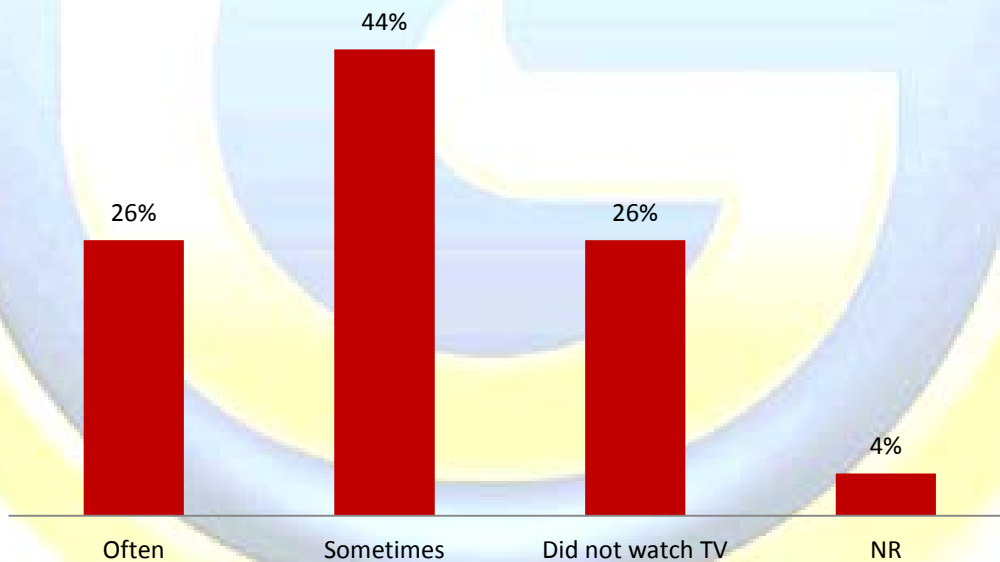
26% Pakistanis claim to watch television at the time of *Iftar* in order to listen to Maghrib prayers; 44% watch it sometimes for the same purpose. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 26% Pakistanis claim to watch television at the time of Iftar in order to listen to Maghrib prayers; 44% watch it sometimes for the same purpose.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Please tell, in the month of Ramzan, how often did you watch television at the time of the Iftar in order to listen to Maghrib Azaan? Often, sometimes, never?” In response to this question, 44% said that they watch television at iftar timing sometimes to listen to Maghrib prayer, 26% said they watch it often, and 26% said that they did not watch television at the time of Iftar to listen to Maghrib prayer. 4% did not respond.

Question: “Please tell, in the month of Ramzan, how often did you watch television at the time of the Iftar in order to listen to Maghrib Azaan? Often, sometimes, never?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1788 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 27 – July 04, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
