Eid: Azha, Fitr, Eid Milad un Nabi

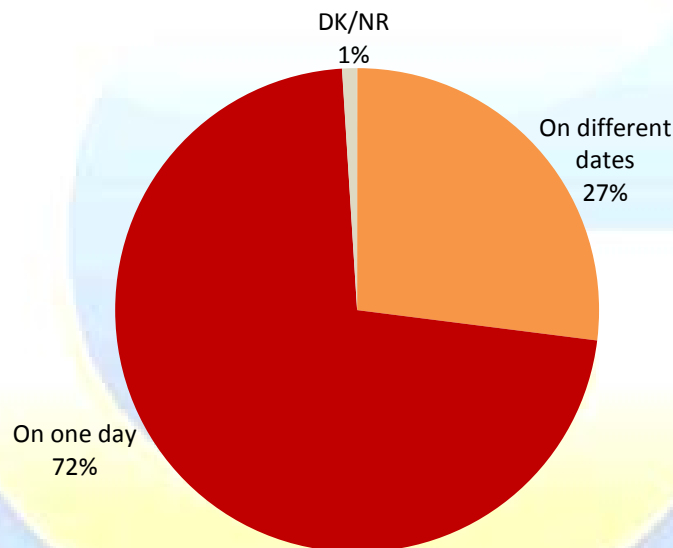
27 % Pakistanis believe that Eid may be celebrated on different dates across the country. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, September 2, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 27% Pakistanis believe that Eid may be celebrated on different dates across the country.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “For the past few years, Eid has been celebrated on different dates in Pakistan. In your opinion, should Eid be celebrated all over the country on the same day or not?” In response to this question, 72% said that Eid should be celebrated across Pakistan on one day, while 27% said that Eid can be celebrated on different dates in the country. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

Question: “For the past few years, Eid has been celebrated on different dates in Pakistan. In your opinion, should Eid be celebrated all over the country on the same day or not?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1816 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 11 – July 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
