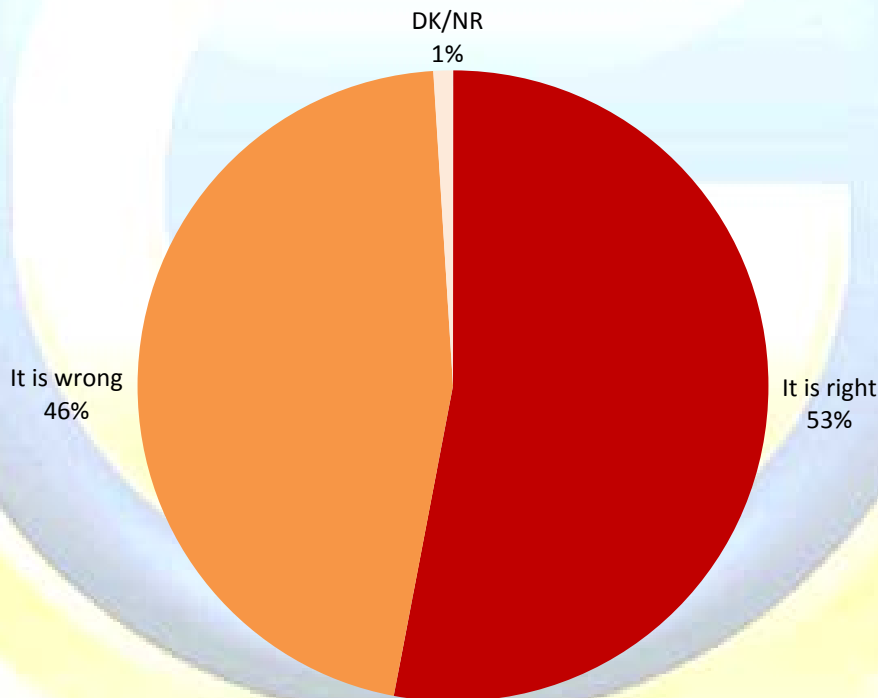
Pakistanis divided (almost) evenly over whether or not the media should give 24/7 coverage to protests: 53% think it is right, 46% think it is wrong. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, Pakistanis divided (almost) evenly over whether or not the media should give 24/7 coverage to protests: 53% think it is right, 46% think it is wrong.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people say that 24/7 coverage of protests by the media is alright, while others disagree. What do you think about this?” In response to this question, 53% said it is right to give protests 24/7 coverage, while 46% said that it was wrong. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1839 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 04 – July 11, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
