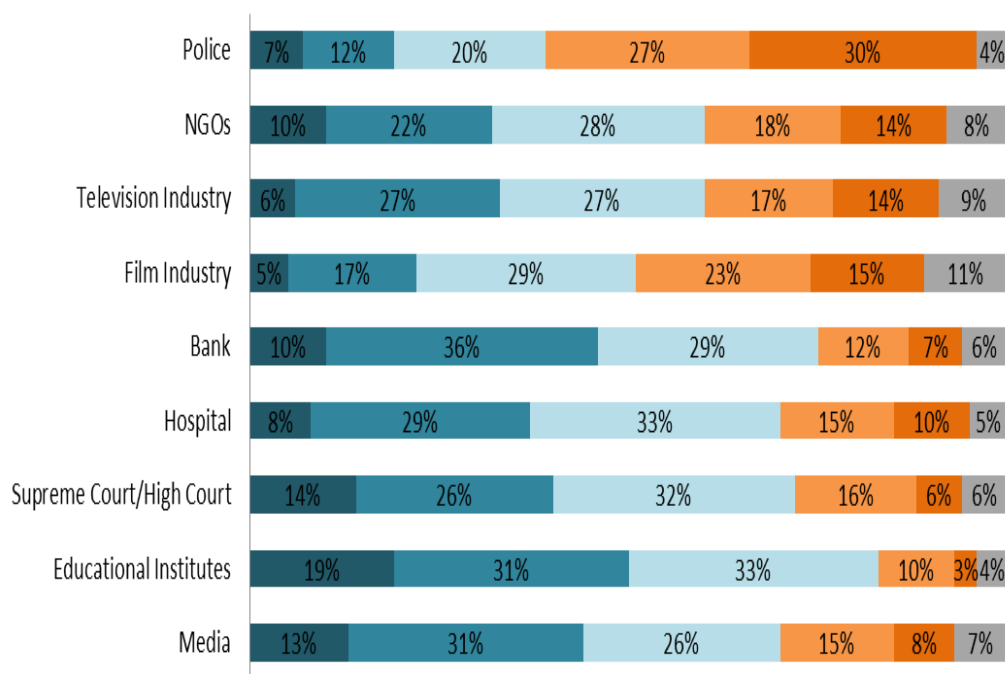

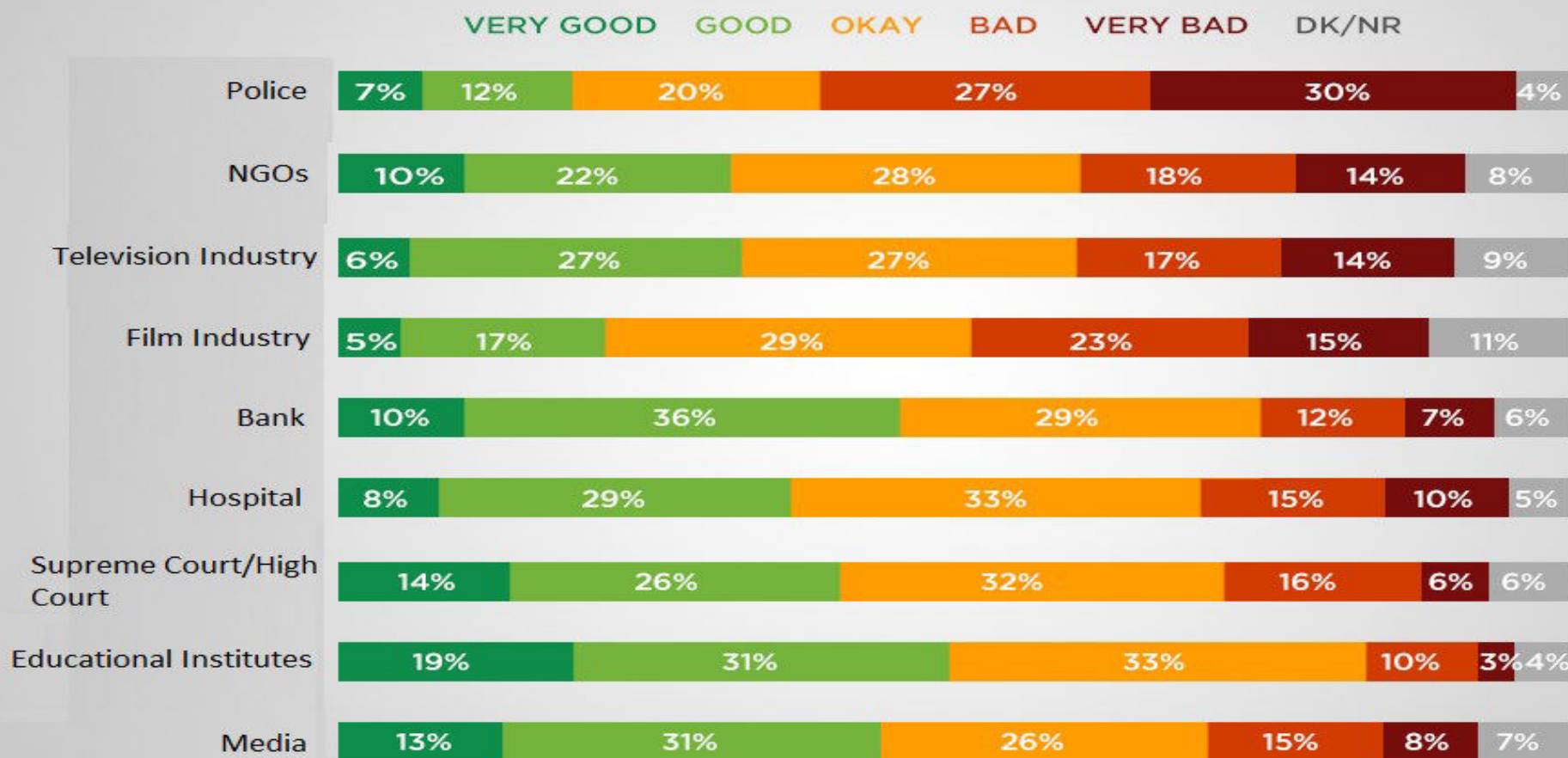
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis say Police's performance was bad this year, while 50% Pakistanis think the performance of educational institutes was good.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "Kindly tell what do you think about the performance of these organizations in the last year? Tell separately for each organization's performance whether it is very good, good, satisfactory, bad or very bad?" In response to this question, when asked about the Police, 7% said its performance was very good, 12% said it was good, 20% said it was satisfactory. 27% said it was bad, and 30% said it was very bad. 4% did not know, or did not wish to respond. When asked about educational institutes, 19% said they were very good, 31% said they were good, 33% said they were okay, 10% said their performance was bad, and 3% said that it was very bad. 4% did not know or did not wish to respond. People were also asked to rate the media. 13% said that they media performed very good in the last year, 31% said it was good, 26% said it was satisfactory, 15% said it was bad, and 8% said it was very bad. 7% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1878 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 20 – June 27, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

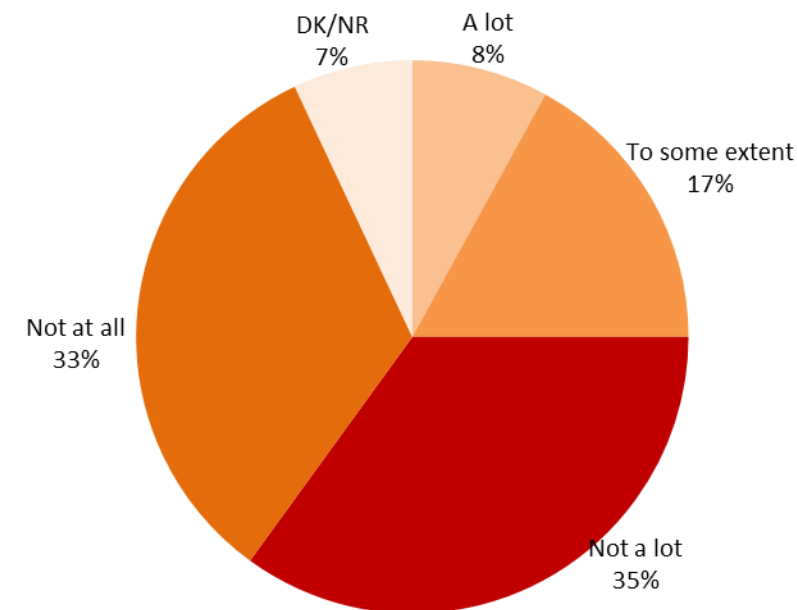

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 52% Pakistanis say that they are not satisfied with the performance of the government in foreign policy.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How much satisfied are you with the performance of government in ‘Foreign Policy?’” In response to this question, 8% said that they are satisfied a lot with the performance, 17% said they are satisfied to an extent, 35% said that they are not satisfied a lot, and 33% are not satisfied at all. 7% did not know or did not wish to respond.

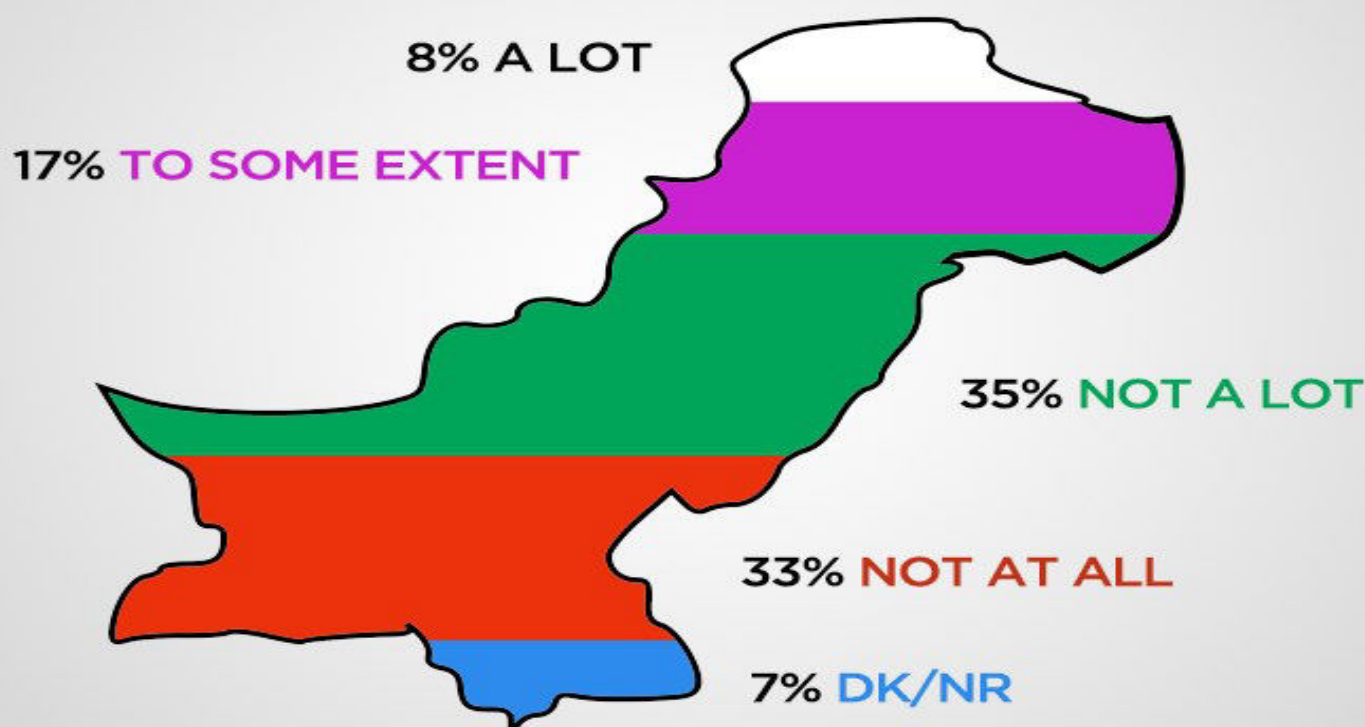

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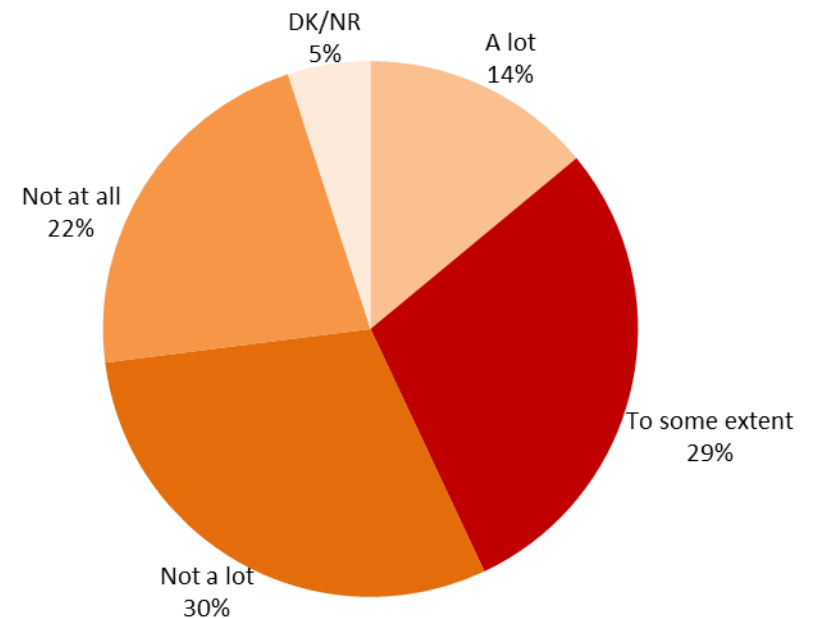

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According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 52% Pakistanis say that they are not satisfied with the performance of the government in controlling the economic crisis.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How much satisfied are you with the performance of government in ‘Controlling Economic Crisis?’” In response to this question, 14% said that they are satisfied a lot with the performance, 29% said they are satisfied to an extent, 30% said that they are not satisfied a lot, and 22% are not satisfied at all. 5% did not know or did not wish to respond.

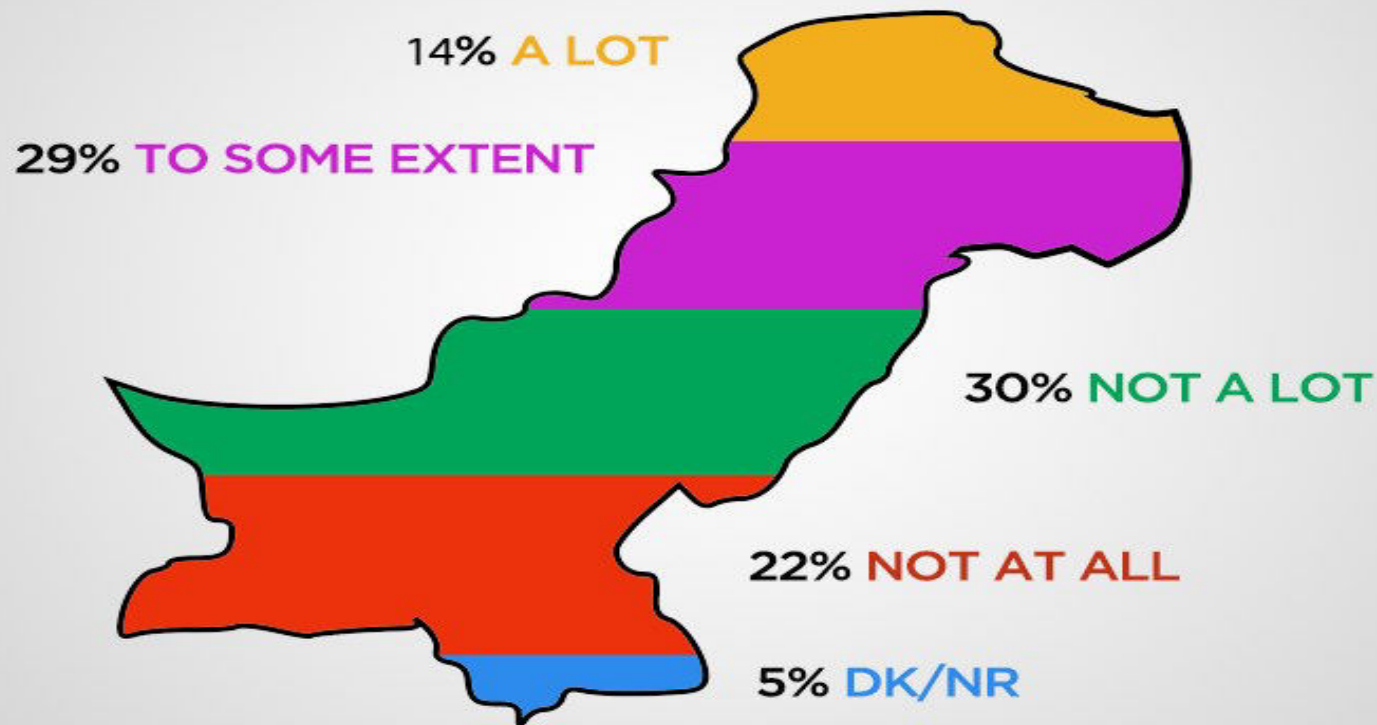

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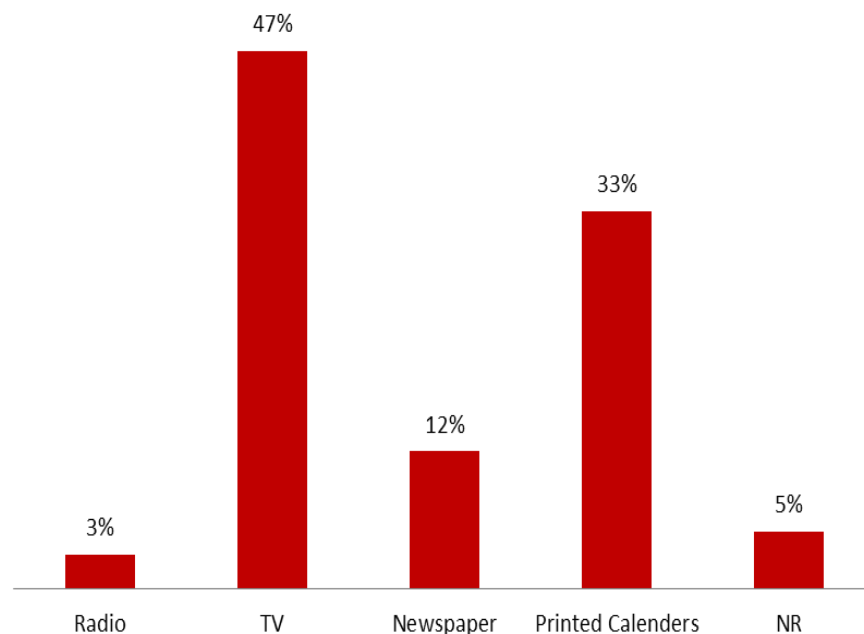

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Where do you find out about Iftar or Sehri timings usually? (Give one answer)” In response to this question, 47% said they found out about them from the television, 33% said they found out from printed calendars, 12% said they found out from the newspaper, and 3% said they found out from the radio. 5% did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1788 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 27 – July 04, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.



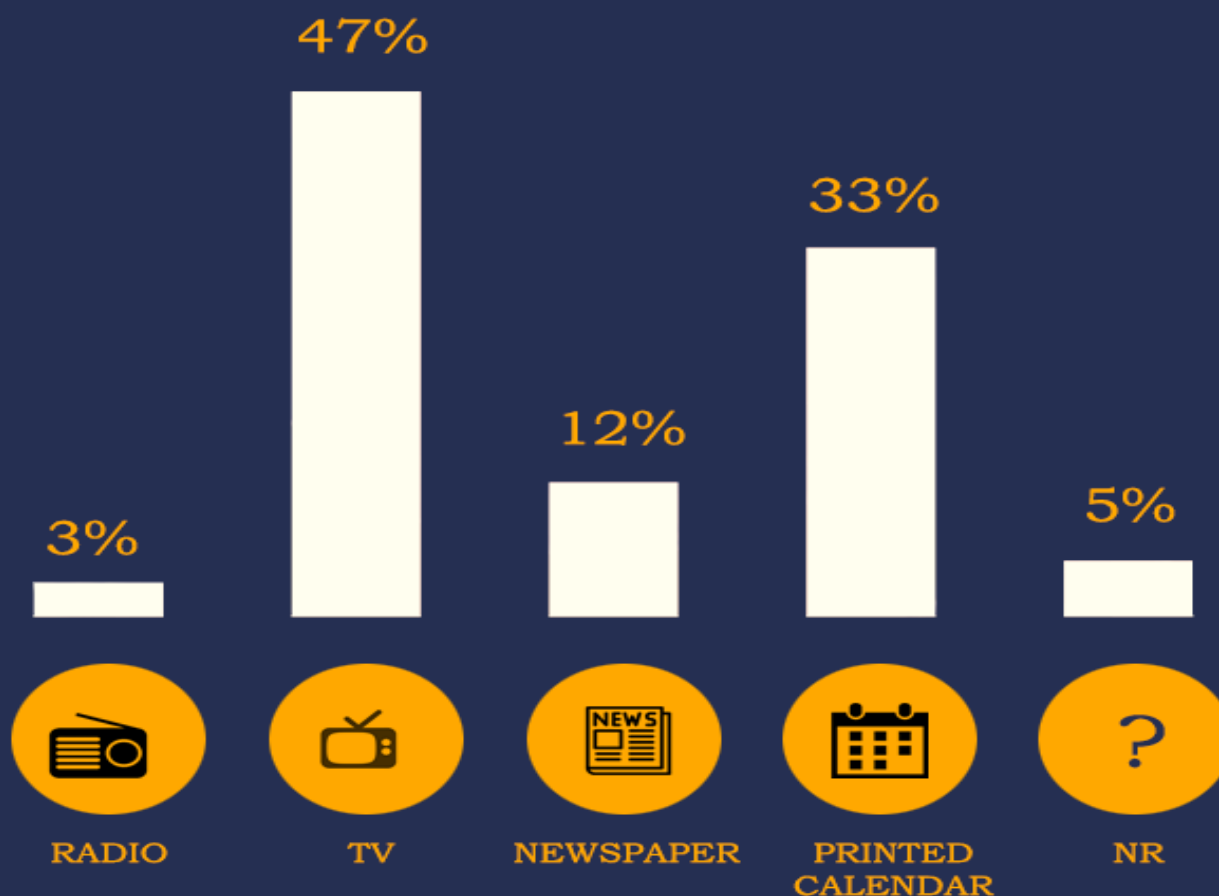

Where do you find out about Iftar or Sehri timings usually? (Give one answer)



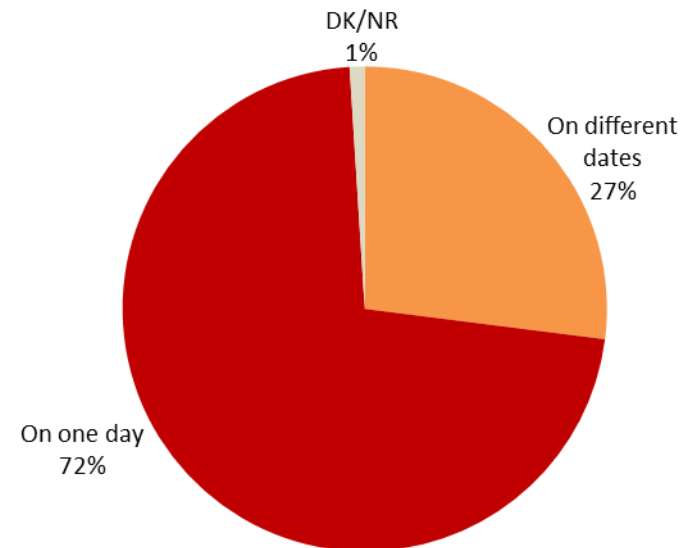

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 27% Pakistanis believe that Eid may be celebrated on different dates across the country.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “For the past few years, Eid has been celebrated on different dates in Pakistan. In your opinion, should Eid be celebrated all over the country on the same day or not?” In response to this question, 72% said that Eid should be celebrated across Pakistan on one day, while 27% said that Eid can be celebrated on different dates in the country. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1816 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during July 11 – July 18, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
