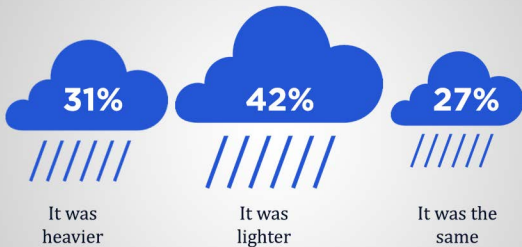

42% PAKISTANIS SAY THAT MONSOON WAS LIGHTER THIS YEAR COMPARED TO LAST YEAR.

42 % Pakistanis say that monsoon was lighter this year compared to last year. (GRF POLL)

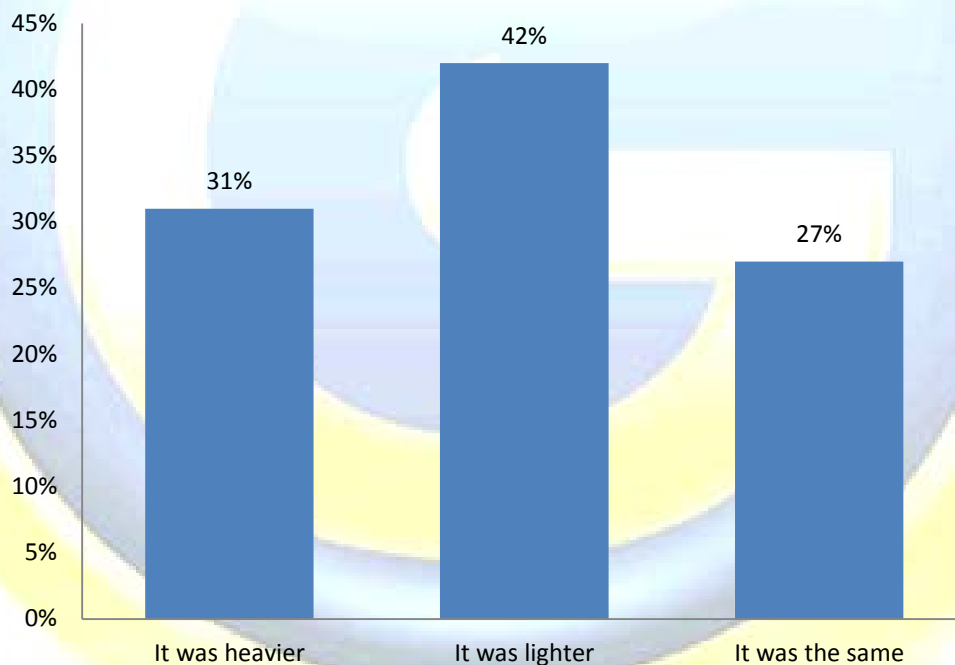

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 42% Pakistanis say that monsoon was lighter this year compared to last year.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “According to you, monsoon rainfall in 2016 was heavier, lighter or the same as last year?” In response to this question, 31% said that monsoon this year was heavier, 42% said that it was lighter, and 27% said that it was the same.

Interestingly, according to the Metrological Department, the rainfall data from this monsoon seasons suggests that Pakistan received 5% more than average rain during the current season.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1835 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 1 – August 8, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
