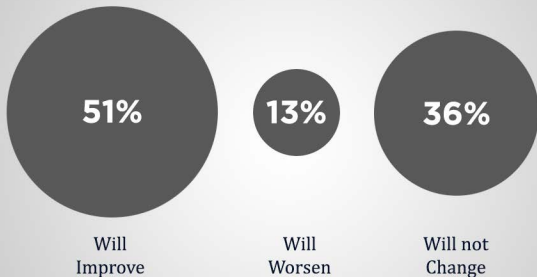

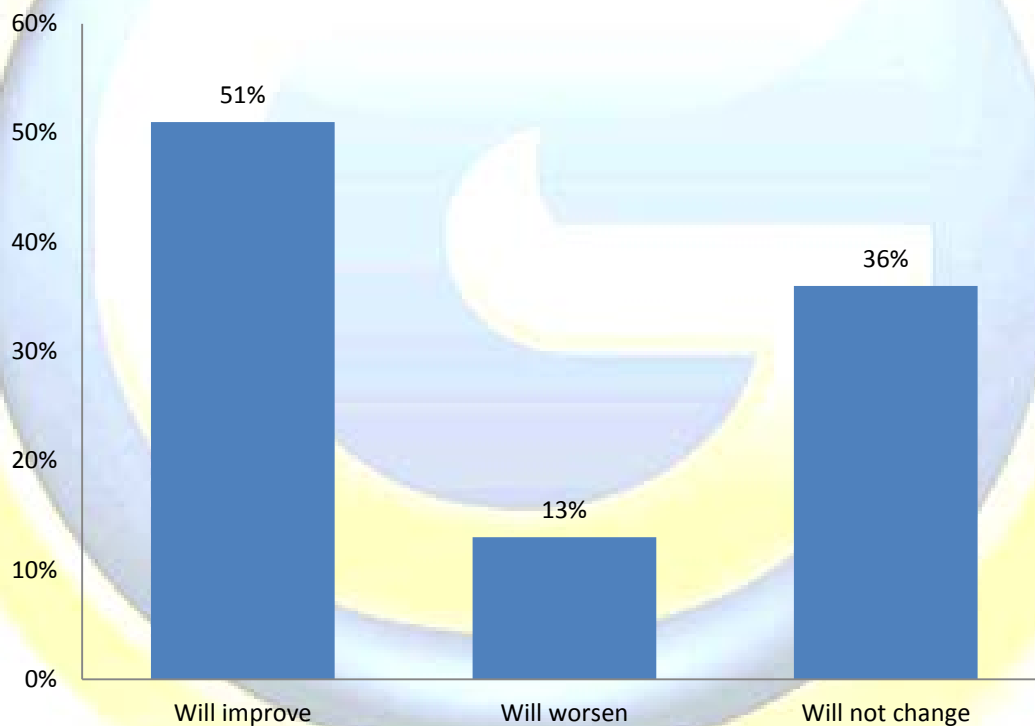
Majority (51%) Pakistanis believe that conditions will improve in Sindh now that a new Chief Minister has been appointed. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (51%) Pakistanis believe that conditions will improve in Sindh now that a new Chief Minister has been appointed.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you think conditions will improve, worsen or stay the same in Sindh after the new CM has been appointed?” In response to this question, 51% said that conditions will improve, 13% said that conditions will worsen, while 36% said that conditions will not change.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1835 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 1 – August 8, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
