Majority (51%) Pakistanis would vote for Hillary Clinton if they were to vote in the American election for President. (Gallup Pakistan)

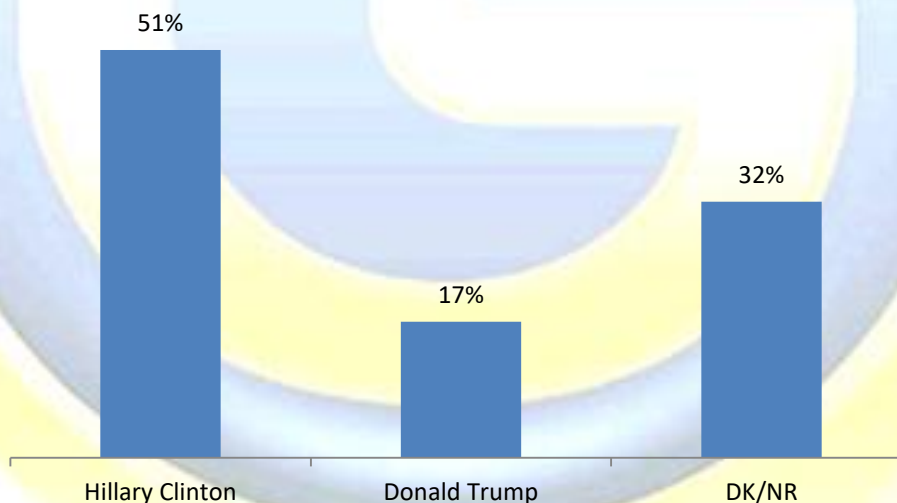
Islamabad, October 21, 2016

Gallup Pakistan is releasing this press release in relation to the upcoming US Presidential elections. This press release is associated with the global poll conducted by WIN / Gallup International Association in 44 countries (42,860 respondents) of the world. According to the survey in Pakistan carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (51%) Pakistanis would vote for Hillary Clinton if they were to vote in the American election for President.

Pakistan: Who would you vote for? 51% said Hillary Clinton

A nationally representative sample of 1000 men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "If you were to vote in the American election for President, who would you vote for?" In response to this question, 51% said they would vote Hillary Clinton while 17% said they will vote Donald Trump. 32% did not know or did not wish to respond. These results indicate that if Pakistanis were to vote in the American election for President, Hillary Clinton would win the election by a margin of 34%.

Comparative Picture:

The same question was asked in 43 other countries (41,860 respondents) to gauge the voting preference for the US Presidential candidate across different countries of the world.

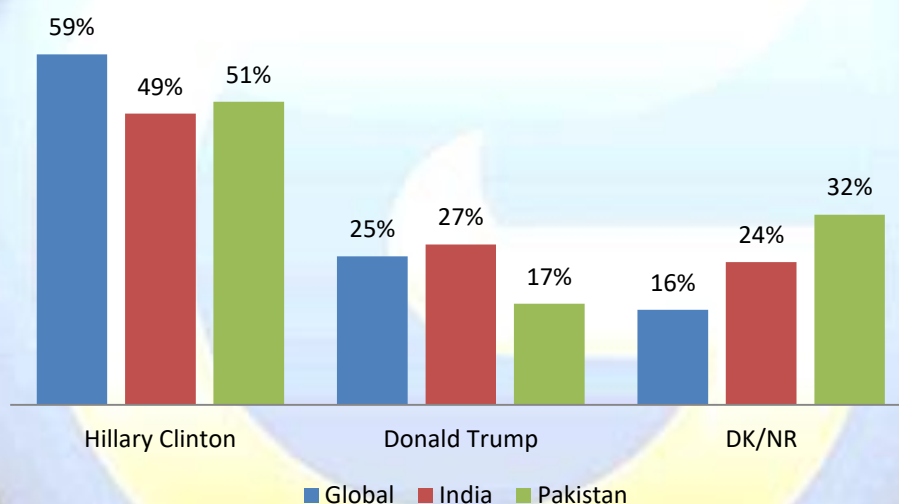
Global: Who would you vote for? 59% said Hillary Clinton

Globally, 59% said they will vote for Hillary Clinton, 25% said they will vote for Donald Trump and 16% did not respond. These results indicate that Hillary Clinton has an edge over Donald Trump by 34% globally.

India: Who would you vote for? 49% said Hillary Clinton

In India, 49% said they will vote for Hillary Clinton, 27% said they will vote for Donald Trump and 24% did not respond. These results show that Hillary is leading by 22% in India as compared to Donald Trump.

Comparing Pakistan with India, we see that Hillary Clinton is ahead in both the countries, however she leads by 2% in Pakistan compared to India. On the contrary, Trump is a less favorable candidate in both the countries; however he leads by 2% in India in comparison to Pakistan.



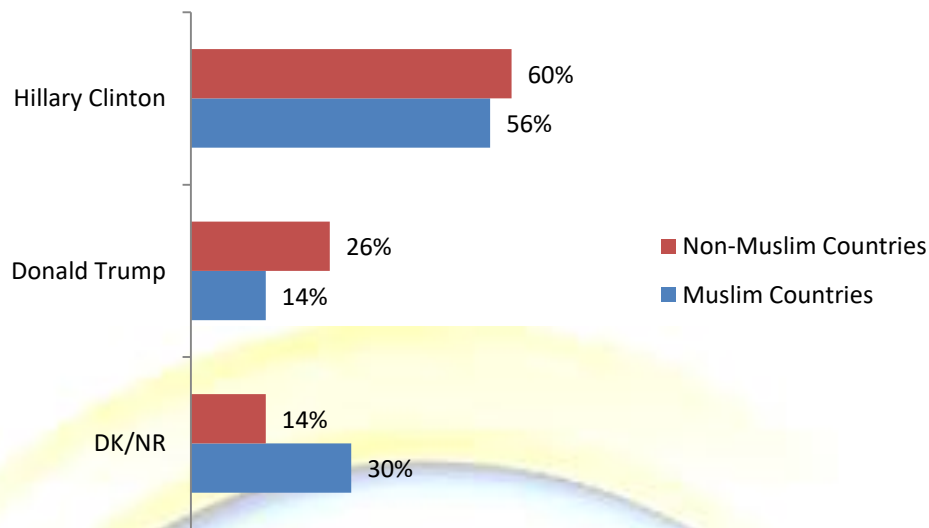

Muslim Countries: Who would you vote for? 56% said Hillary Clinton

In the 9 Muslim countries: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Pakistan and Palestine comprising 8995 respondents, 56% said they will vote for Hillary Clinton, 14% said they will vote for Donald Trump and 30% did not respond. These results indicate that Hillary Clinton has an edge over Donald Trump by 42% in the Muslim countries.

Non-Muslim Countries: Who would you vote for? 60% said Hillary Clinton

In the 36 Non-Muslim countries polled comprising 33865 respondents, 60% said they will vote for Hillary Clinton, 26% said they will vote for Donald Trump and 14% did not respond. These results show that Hillary Clinton is leading by 34% in Non-Muslim countries as compared to Donald Trump.

Bilal I Gilani, Executive Director Gallup Pakistan adds: “As the world becomes increasingly globalized, elections in all the countries especially in major world powers become crucially important for other countries. American elections have important repercussions for Pakistan due to current heavy engagement between the two countries on diplomatic, economic and military fronts. This poll therefore sheds important light on how Pakistani public opinion feels about upcoming US President. The comparison with other countries provides important benchmark.”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1000 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 28, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
