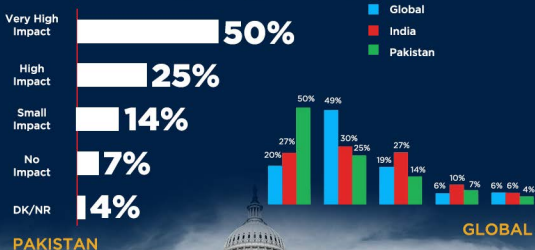

Majority (50%) Pakistanis believe that the election of new American President will have a very high impact on Pakistan. (Gallup Pakistan National Survey)

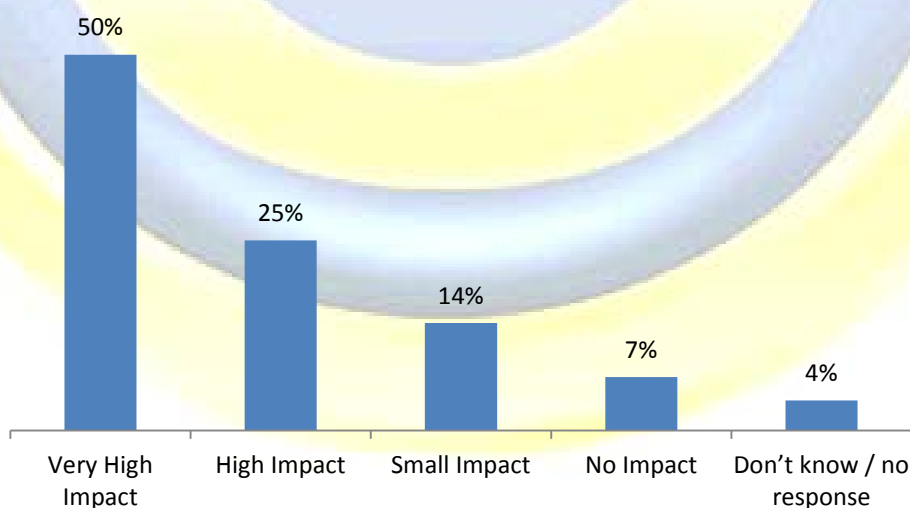

Gallup Pakistan is releasing this press release in relation to the upcoming US Presidential elections. This press release is associated with the global poll conducted by WIN / Gallup International Association in 44 countries (42,860 respondents) of the world. According to the survey in Pakistan carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority (50%) Pakistanis believe that the election of new American President will have a very high impact on Pakistan.

Pakistan: Impact of American President? 50% Pakistanis said the American President will have a very high impact

A nationally representative sample of 1000 men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How much, in your view, is the impact of American election on your country, on issues such as economic progress, trade, peace etc. In other words how much is the impact of American President on what happens in your country?” In response to this question, 50% said the American President will have a very high impact on Pakistan, 25% said high impact, 14% said small impact, 7% said no impact. 4% did not know or did not wish to respond. These results show that majority Pakistanis believe the outcome of the American election will tend to have a very high impact on the country in terms of economic progress, trade, peace etc.

Comparative Picture:

The same question was asked in 43 other countries (41,860 respondents) to see how countries globally perceive the impact of the new American President in their respective countries.

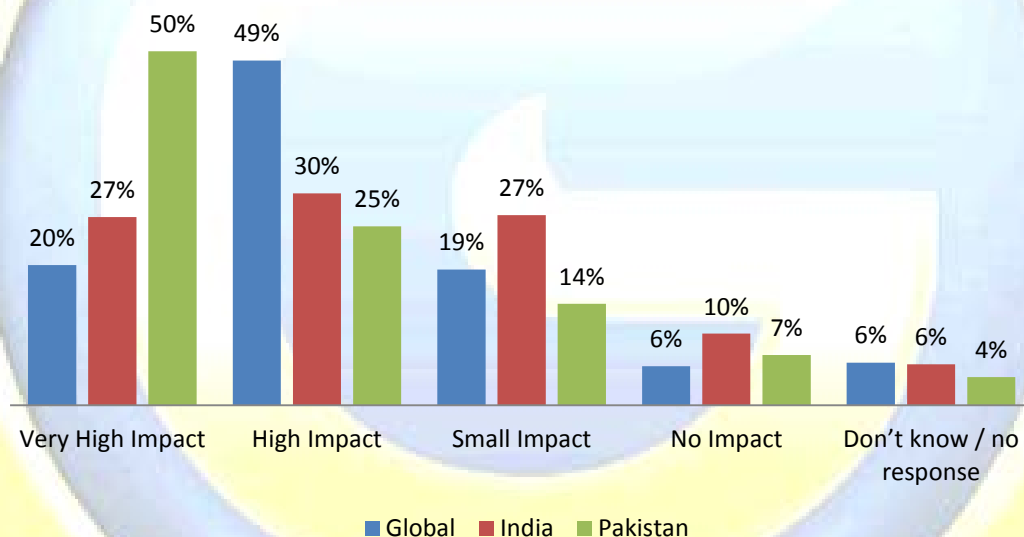
Global: Impact of American President? 49% of Global citizens said the American President will have a high impact

Globally, 20% said the American President will have a very high impact, 49% said high impact, 19% said small impact, 6% said no impact. 6 % did not know or did not wish to respond.

India: Impact of American President? 30% said the American President will have a high impact

In India, 27% said the American President will have a very high impact on Indian affairs, 30% said high impact, 27% said small impact, 10% said no impact. 6 % did not know or did not wish to respond.

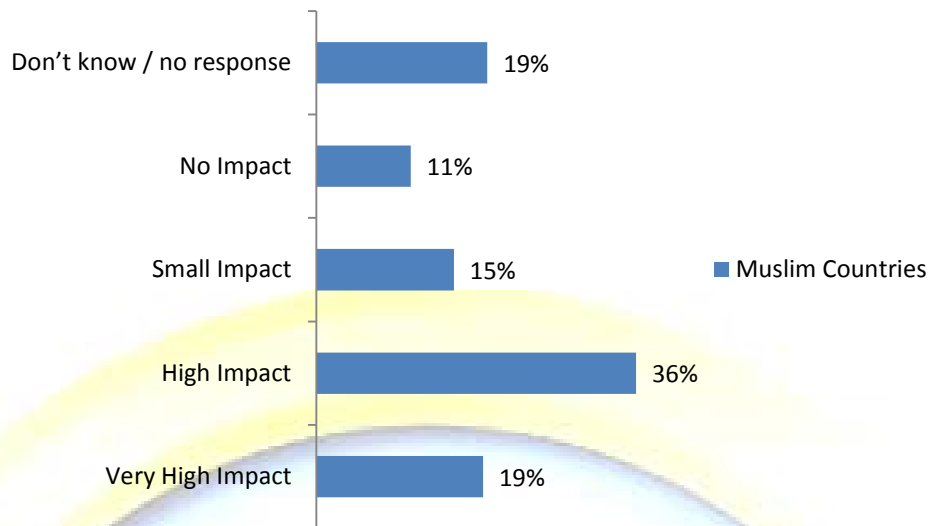
Comparing Pakistan with India, 23% more Pakistanis believe that the new American President will have a very high impact on the affairs in Pakistan. The large difference in impact the American President will have on the two neighboring countries can be attributed towards a greater engagement between Pakistan and America on different fronts.

Muslim Countries: Impact of American President? 36% of respondents living in other Muslim countries said the American President will have a high impact

In the 8 other Muslim countries: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and Palestine comprising 7995 respondents, 19% said the American President will have a very high impact, 36% said high impact, 15% said small impact, 11% said no impact. 19% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1000 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 28, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
