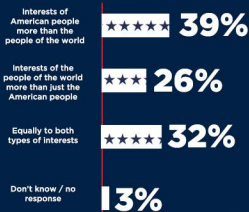

39 % Pakistanis believe that the new elected American President should prioritize the economic interests of American people more than the people of the world. (Gallup Pakistan National Survey)

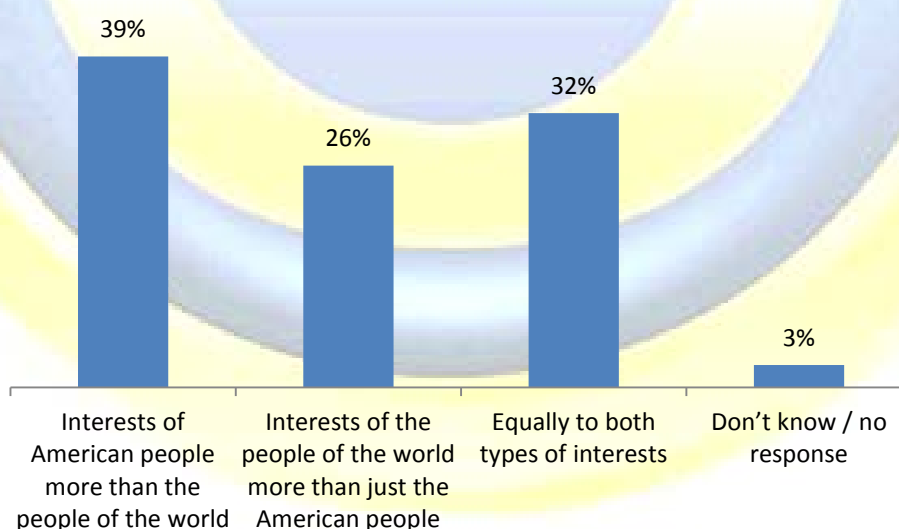

Gallup Pakistan is releasing this press release in relation to the upcoming US Presidential elections. This press release is associated with the global poll conducted by WIN / Gallup International Association in 44 countries (42,860 respondents) of the world. According to the survey in Pakistan carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 39% Pakistanis believe that the new elected American President should prioritize the economic interests of American people more than the people of the world.

Pakistan: Priority of American President? 39% Pakistanis said the American President should give more priority to the economic interests of the American people

A nationally representative sample of 1000 men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Considering that America leads the global economy, should the new American President give priority to the economic interests of the American people, the interests of the people of the world as a whole, or equally to both?” In response to this question, 39% said the new American President should give priority to the economic interests of the American people more than that of the world, 26% said interests of the people of the world more than just the American people, 32% said equally to both types of interests. 3% did not know or did not respond.

Comparative Picture:

The same question was asked in 42 other countries (41,366 respondents) to enable a concrete comparison.

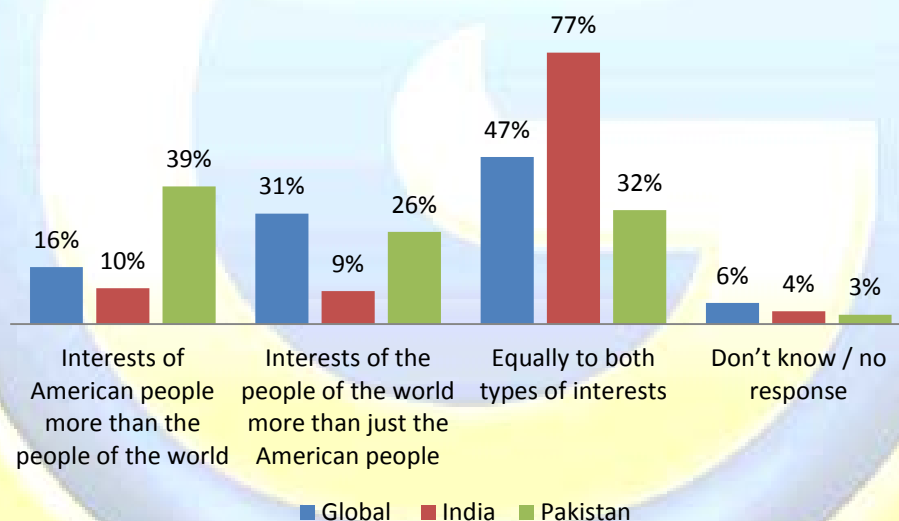
Global: Priority of American President? 47% of Global citizens said the American President should equally prioritize both local and global economic interests

Globally, 16% said the new American President should give priority to the economic interests of the American people more than that of the world, 31% said interests of the people of the world more than just the American people, 47% said equally to both types of interests. 6% did not know or did not respond.

India: Priority of American President? 77% Indian respondents said the American President should equally prioritize both local and global economic interests

In India, 10% said the new American President should give priority to the economic interests of the American people more than that of the world, 9% said interests of the people of the world more than just the American people, 77% said equally to both types of interests. 4% did not know or did not respond.

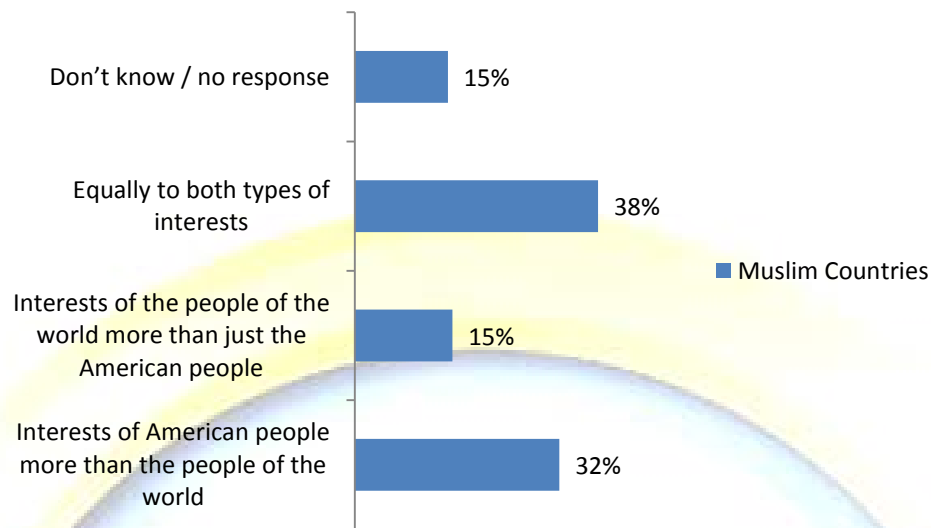
Comparing Pakistan with India, 45% more Indians believe the new American President should equally prioritize both local and global economic interests, while 29% more Pakistanis believe the new American President should prioritize the local economic interests more than the global economic interests and 17% more Pakistanis believe the new American President should prioritize the global economic interests more than the local economic interests.

Muslim Countries: Priority of American President? 38% of respondents to the survey living in Muslim countries said the American President should equally prioritize both local and global economic interests

In the 8 other Muslim countries: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and Palestine comprising 7995 respondents, 32% said the new American President should give priority to the economic interests of the American people more than that of the world, 15% said interests of the people of the world more than just the American people, 38% said equally to both types of interests. 15% did not know or did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1000 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 28, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
