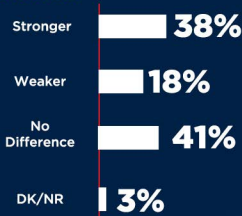


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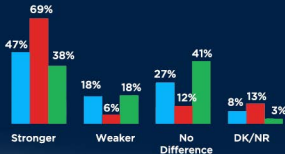

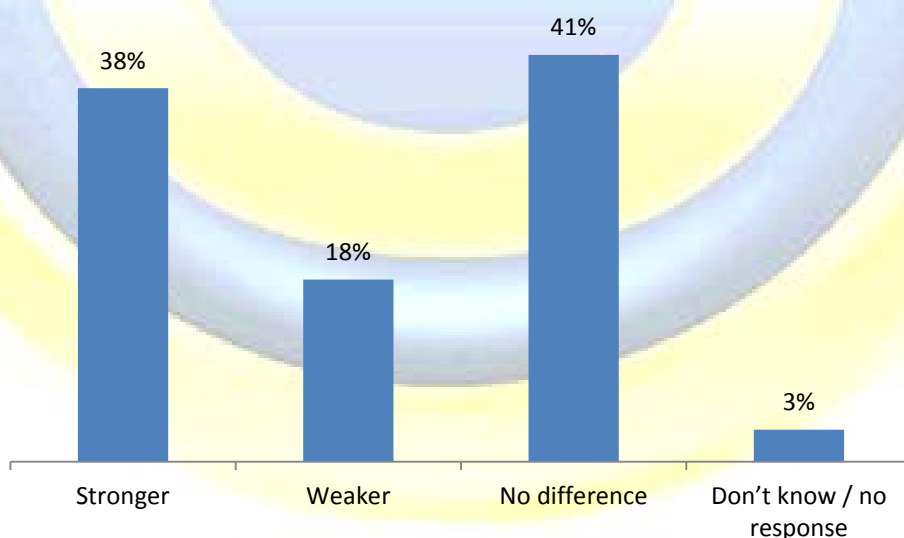

Gallup Pakistan is releasing this press release in relation to the upcoming US Presidential elections. This press release is associated with the global poll conducted by WIN / Gallup International Association in 44 countries (42,860 respondents) of the world. According to the survey in Pakistan carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 41% Pakistanis believe that Obama's Presidency of 8 years has made no impact on American Global Power, 18% believe American power has reduced during his Presidency.

Pakistan: Overall impact of President Obama? 41% Pakistanis believe that Obama's Presidency has made no impact on American Global power

A nationally representative sample of 1000 men and women from across the four provinces was asked, "What in your view has been the overall impact of President Obama on the power of America in the world? Has he made it stronger, weaker or made no difference during his 8 years in office?" In response to this question, 38% said stronger, 18% said weaker while 41% said no difference. 3% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The same question was asked in 43 other countries (41,860 respondents) to enable a concrete comparison.

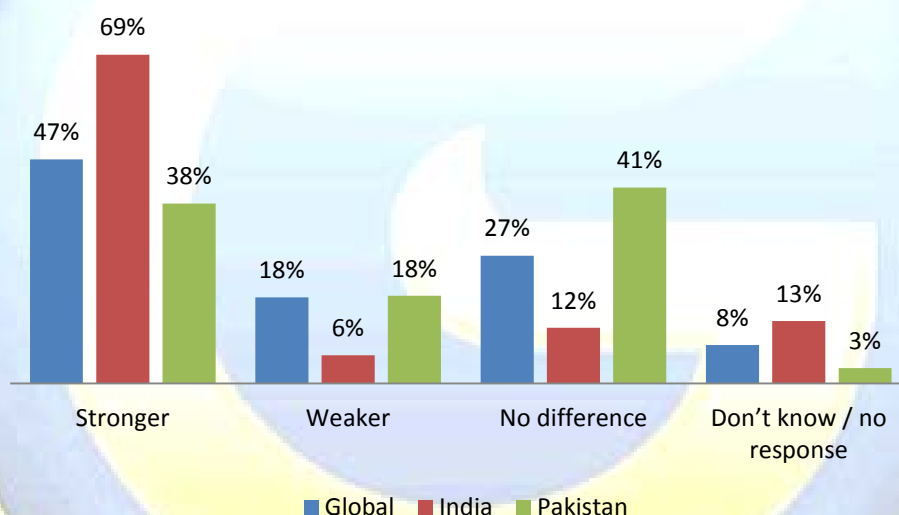
Global: Overall impact of President Obama? 47% of Global citizens believe that Obama's Presidency has made a stronger impact on American Global power

Globally, 47% said stronger, 18% said weaker while 27% said no difference. 8% did not know or did not wish to respond.

India: Overall impact of President Obama? 69% of Indian respondents believe that Obama's Presidency has made a stronger impact on American Global power

In India, 69% said stronger, 6% said weaker while 12% said no difference. 13% did not know or did not wish to respond.

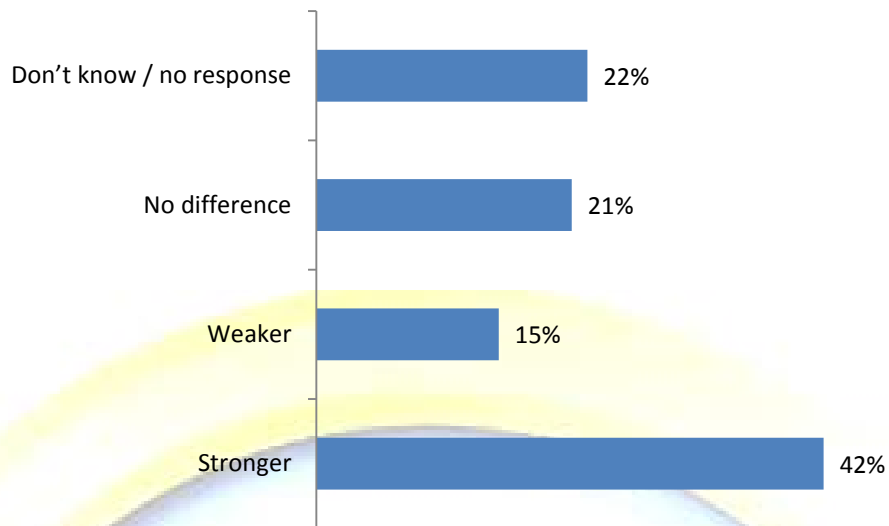
Comparing Pakistan with India, 31% more Indians believe there has been a stronger overall impact of President Obama on the power of America in the world, 12% more Pakistanis believe there has been a weaker overall impact of President Obama on the power of America in the world and 29% more Pakistanis believe there has been no difference in the overall impact of President Obama on the power of America in the world.

Muslim Countries: Overall impact of President Obama? 42% of respondents living in other Muslim countries believe that Obama's Presidency has made a stronger impact on American Global power

In the 8 other Muslim countries: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon and Palestine comprising 7995 respondents, 42% said stronger, 15% said weaker while 21% said no difference. 22% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1000 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 28, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
