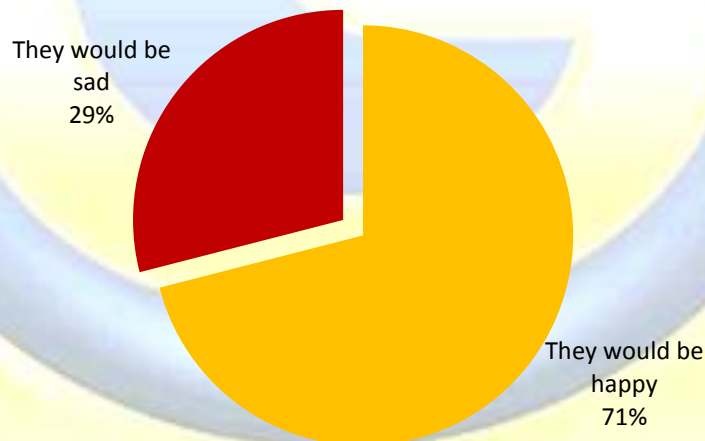

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, dominant majority of Pakistanis (71%) believe that if the leaders of Pakistan Movement were alive, they would be happy with the current situation of the country.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people say that if the leaders of the Pakistan Movement for Independence (Pakistan Movement is the movement which Muslims started against the British in order to form a separate homeland) were alive, they would be happy with the current situation of the country, while others say they would be sad about it. What is your opinion on this?” In response to this question, 71% said they would be happy with the current situation of Pakistan, 29% said they would be sad.

Question: “Some people say that if the leaders of the Pakistan Movement for Independence (Pakistan Movement is the movement which Muslims started against the British in order to form a separate homeland) were alive, they would be happy with the current situation of the country, while others say they would be sad about it. What is your opinion on this?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1817 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 8 – August 15, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
