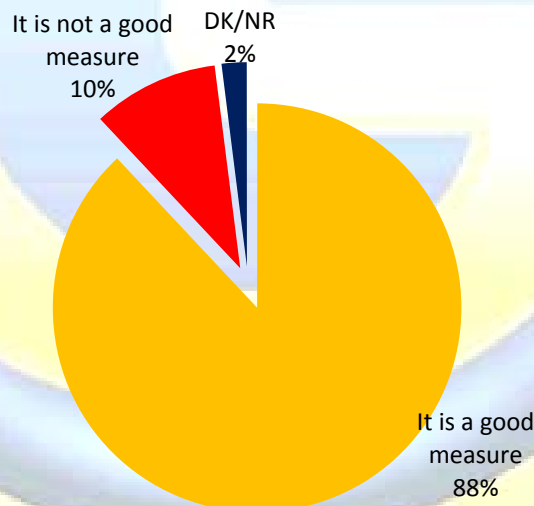

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who had heard/read about the verification drive of ID cards were asked, "Some people say that the verification of ID cards by the federal government is a good measure, while others have a negative opinion of this. They think this is not a good measure at all. What is your opinion?" In response to this question, 88% said it is a good measure, 10% said it is not a good measure. 2% did not know or did not wish to respond.
