According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, an overwhelming majority of Pakistanis (94%) believe that Pakistan's future will remain safe in the next 25 years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, "Some people think that Pakistan's future is safe. Other people think that it will fall apart. In your opinion, will Pakistan remain safe or break into pieces in the next 25 years?" In response to this question, 94% said it will remain safe, 6% said it will break into pieces.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1828 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 29, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
