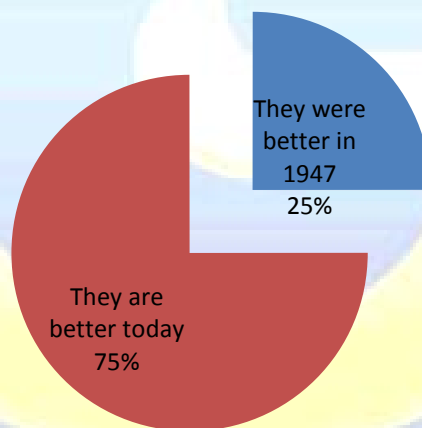
75 % Pakistanis believe that conditions in their province are better today than in 1947. (GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 75% Pakistanis believe that conditions in their province are better today than in 1947.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “Please tell us about your province; are the conditions in your province better now, or were they better in 1947?” In response to this question, 75% said that they are better today, 25% said they were better in 1947.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1828 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 22 – August 29, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
