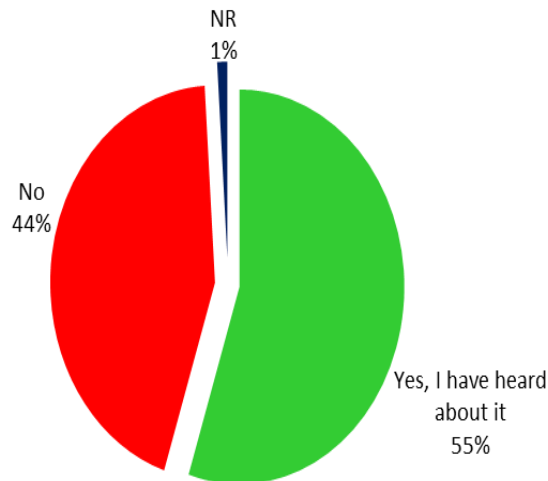

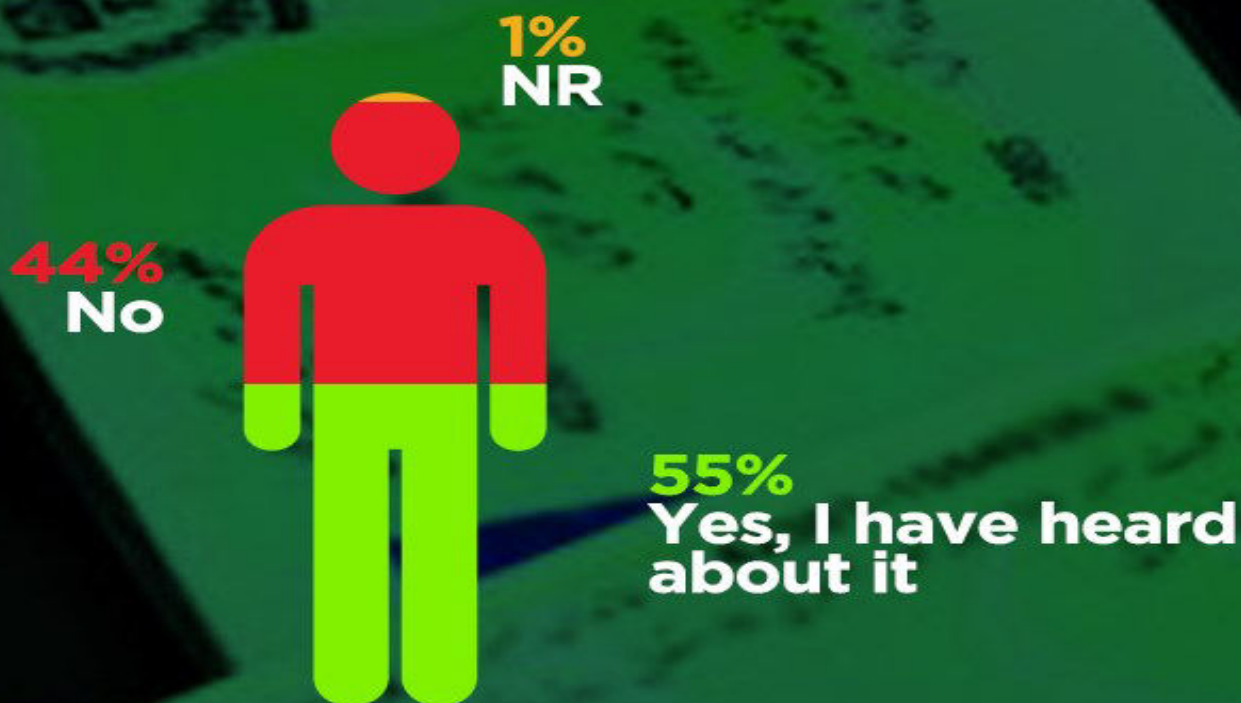
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “A few months ago the federal government started the verification of ID cards. Through this, family members can use their mobile phone to send the ID card number of the head of the family to Nadra to get details of everyone listed as a family member on their mobile phone. Have you heard/read anything about this?” In response to this question, 55% said yes, 44% said no. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1817 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 8 – August 15, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

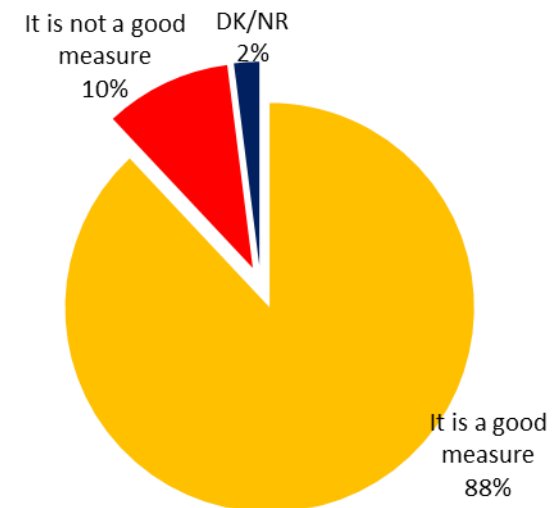

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis (88%) who are aware of Nadra’s verification drive agree that the verification of ID cards by the federal government is a good measure.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces who had heard/read about the verification drive of ID cards were asked, “Some people say that the verification of ID cards by the federal government is a good measure, while others have a negative opinion of this. They think this is not a good measure at all. What is your opinion?” In response to this question, 88% said it is a good measure, 10% said it is not a good measure. 2% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 981 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 8 – August 15, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 58% Pakistanis believe women should have right to divorce in Pakistan.

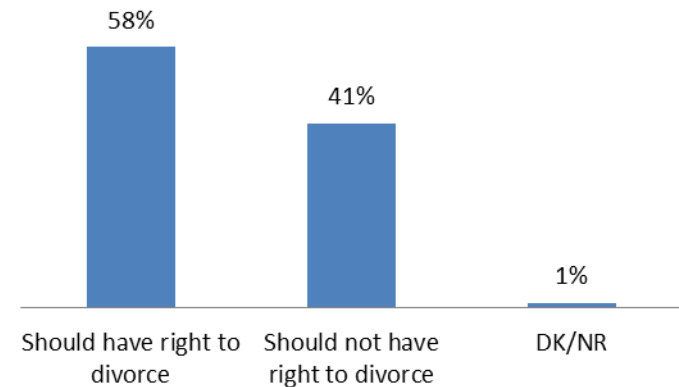
A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “Some people say women should have right to divorce, while some say that women should not have right to divorce. What is your opinion on this matter?” In response to this question, 58% said women should have right to divorce, 41% said women should not have right to divorce. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

GENDER BREAKDOWN

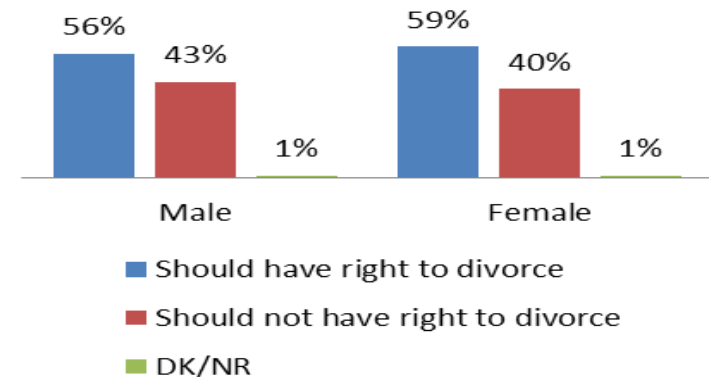
56% of the male respondents said that women should have right to divorce, 43% said they should not have right to divorce, 1% did not know or did not wish to respond. On the other hand, 59% of the female respondents said that women should have right to divorce, 40% said they should not have right to divorce, 1% did not know or did not wish to respond. Comparing the two genders, we see that 3% more females than males believe that women should have right to divorce.

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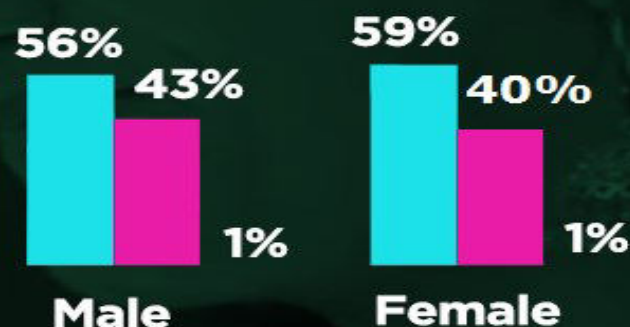

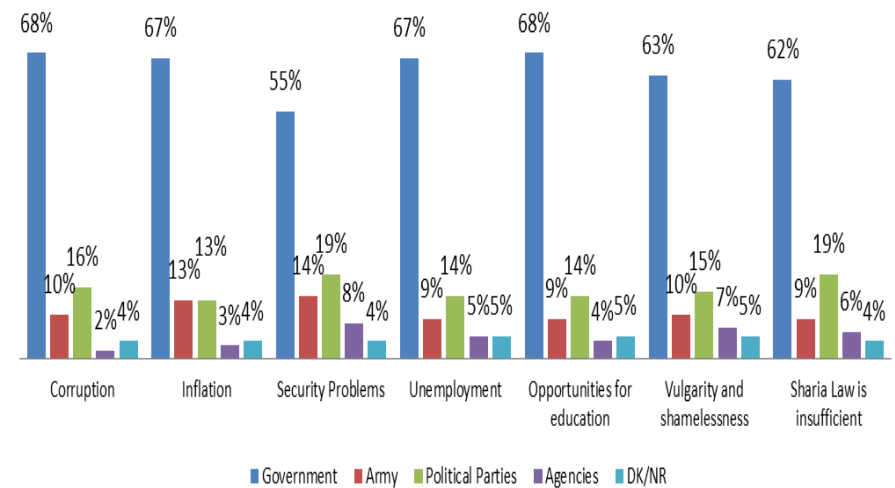

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, a significant majority of Pakistanis holds the government responsible for different problems that Pakistan faces.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “Pakistan faces different problems. Who do you think is responsible for these problems? I will read some problems in front of you. Please point out who you think is responsible for these problems?” In response to this question for corruption, 68% said government is responsible, 10% said army, 16% said political parties, 2% said agencies and 4% did not respond. For inflation, 67% said government is responsible, 13% said army, 13% said political parties, 3% said agencies and 4% did not respond. For security problems, 55% said government is responsible, 14% said army, 19% said political parties, 8% said agencies and 4% did not respond. For unemployment, 67% said government is responsible, 9% said army, 14% said political parties, 5% said agencies and 5% did not respond. For opportunities for education, 68% said government is responsible, 9% said army, 14% said political parties, 4% said agencies and 5% did not respond. For vulgarity and shamelessness, 63% said government is responsible, 10% said army, 15% said political parties, 7% said agencies and 5% did not respond. For Sharia Law is insufficient, 62% said government is responsible, 9% said army, 19% said political parties, 6% said agencies and 4% did not respond.

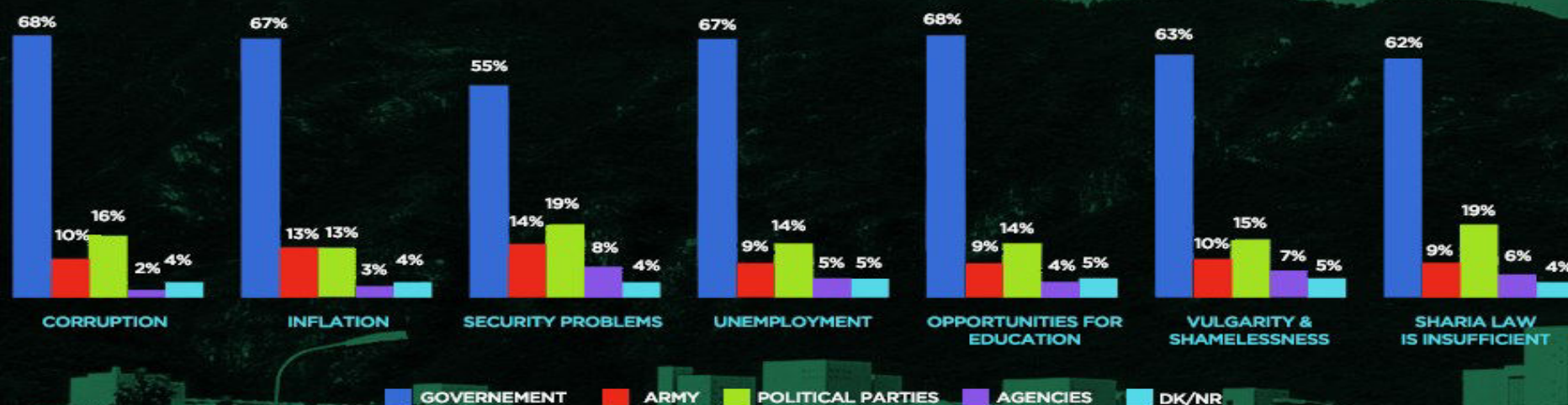

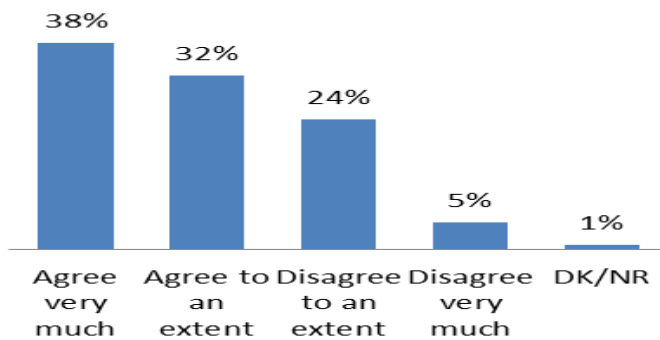

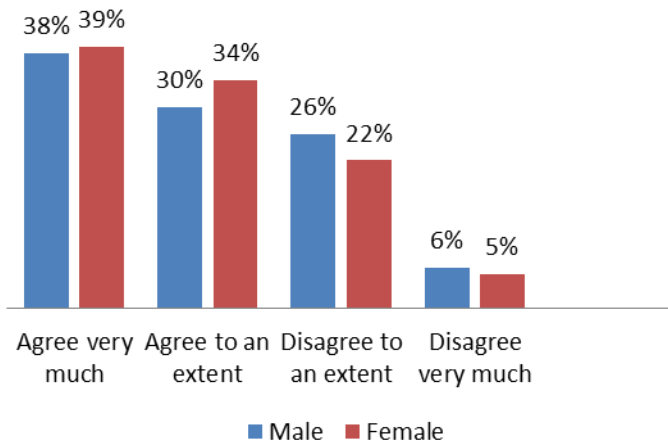

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, dominant majority of Pakistanis (70%) believe that women are getting more rights these days as compared to previous years.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces were asked, “Some people think that women are getting more rights these days. For example, women make important decisions in the household like in what to buy, or how to educate or raise their children. Some people agree to this, while others disagree. What is your opinion?” In response to this question, 38% said they agree very much, 32% said agree to an extent, 24% said disagree to an extent, 5% said disagree very much. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

68% males and 73% females agree that women are getting more rights these days. Comparing the two genders, 5% more females are of the view that women are getting more rights these days.

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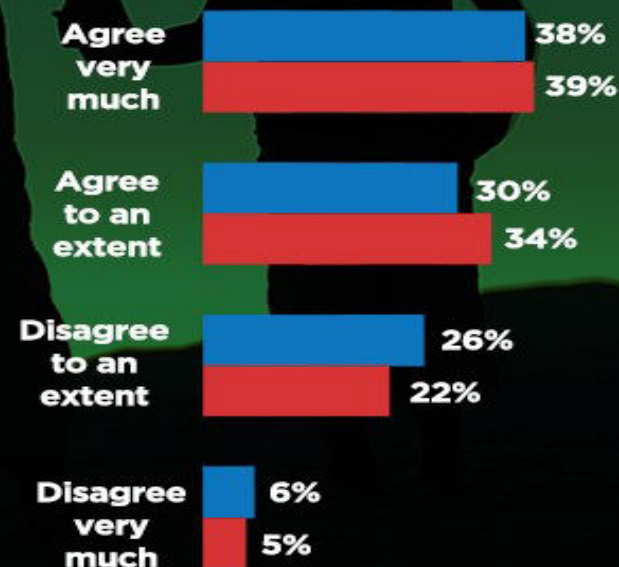
