

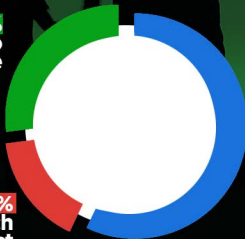

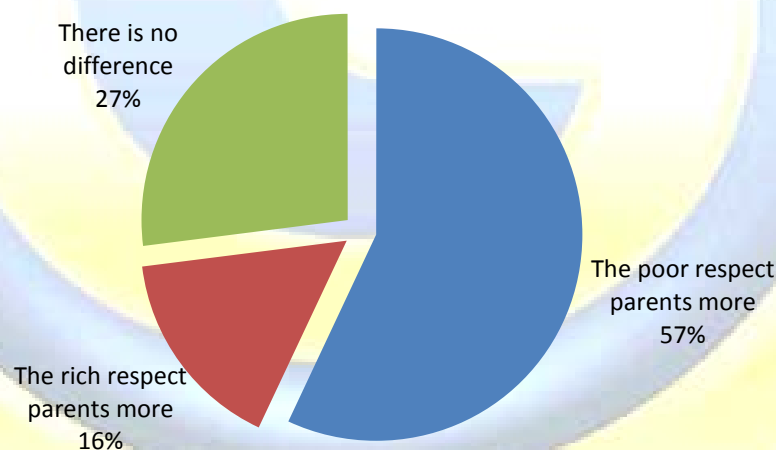
57 % Pakistanis think the poor respect their parents more, 16 % think the rich respect their parents more. GRF POLL)

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 57% Pakistanis think the poor respect their parents more, 16% think the rich respect their parents more.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “Some people think poor people in our society respect their parents more, while some people think that rich people in our society respect their parents more. Yet others think that in respecting parents in our society, there is no difference between the rich or poor. What is your opinion?” In response to this question, 57% said the poor respect their parents more, 16% said that the rich respect their parents more while 27% said there is no difference.

Question: “Some people think poor people in our society respect their parents more, while some people think that rich people in our society respect their parents more. Yet others think that in respecting parents in our society, there is no difference between the rich or poor. What is your opinion?”

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1817 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during August 8 – August 15, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
