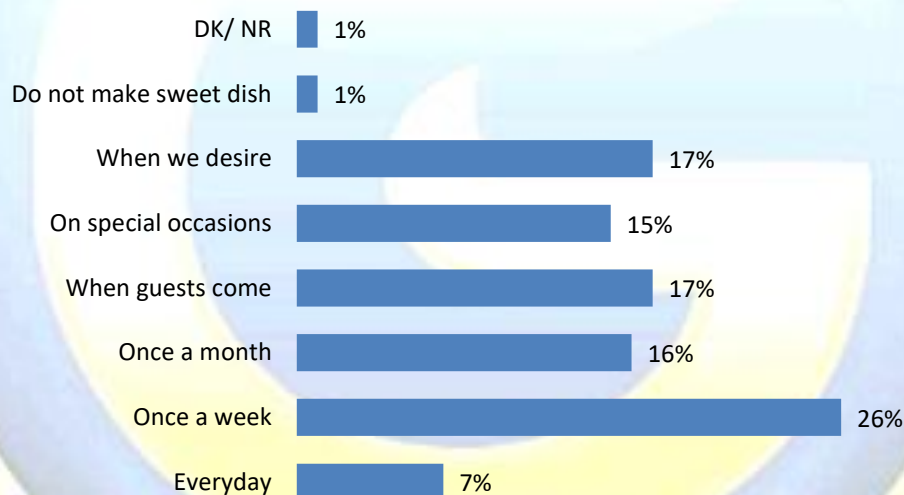
26% Pakistanis say that they make sweet dish once a week. (GRF POLL)

Islamabad, December 14, 2016

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, 26% Pakistanis say that they make sweet dish once a week.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the four provinces was asked, “How frequently is sweet dish made in your house?” In response to this question, 7% said everyday, 26% said once a week, 16% said once a month, 17% said when guests come, 15% said on special occasions, 17 said when we desire, 1% said they do not make sweet dish. 1% did not know or did not wish to respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1851 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 12 – September 19, 2016. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
